Principles of Professional Pet Grooming



This course is the first of three courses needed to complete Professional Pet Groomer Training. Students must also complete Professional Pet Groomer Practices Part I and Part II. This course covers the fundamental principles and terminology of pet grooming including grooming equipment, animal behavior and handling, dog anatomy, breed classes, CPR, cat review, hair and skin disorders, and familiarization with

grooming room set-up. This course is a prerequisite before clipping in Professional Pet Groomer Practices, Part I. (Textbook included in the material fee). Students must purchase approximately \$100 - \$200 worth of equipment on their own.

Child Care

Preschool Child Care I

This is the first of three courses needed to complete the requirements of the Maryland Office of Child Care to become senior staff in a Maryland pre-school for ages 2-6. This course covers early childhood education theories and child development. Students will also need Pre-School Child Care II and the nine-hour Child Care Communications courses to become senior staff. (Textbook included in materials fee)

This course prepares the student for the Maryland and Virginia Pesticide Use and Safety application certification exam through a thorough understanding of the principles of pest control, including pesticide labeling, regulations, and proper handling. This course is equivalent to six months as a registered technician in the state of Maryland.

Food Safety Managers Certification

This course provides food service facility owners, managers, and food handlers with comprehensive knowledge of food safety agency regulations. Students learn about proper methods of food handling and preparation, the Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) concept of food safety, personal hygiene, proper cleaning and sanitizing of equipment and facilities, and guidelines for working with regulatory agencies. Certified Professional Food Manager from the National Environmental Health Association is

awarded upon completion of the course and passing a final examination. This course meets the requirements in those jurisdictions where food manager certification is mandated. Fee includes materials, exam, and certification.

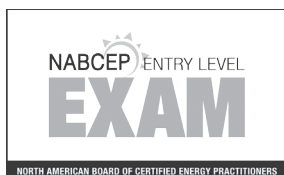

This course is a three-step series designed for Registered or Licensed Practical Nurses to reinstate an inactive Maryland nursing license and consists of a hybrid class with 40 classroom hours and online course work totaling 80 hours of content. - Have a current Basic Life Support Health Care Provider CPR Card issued by the American Heart Association (AHA). Provider courses and recertification courses are available at HCC.
- Provide medical documentation or waivers of the following vaccinations: MMR or titre, Varicella or titre, Tetanus, Hepatitis B series, and negative TB test (PPD or Chest X-Ray) – TB results should be within the past 12 months of the start date of Clinical Practice.
- Complete a Criminal Background Check (forms completed first night of class, cost covered in course fee).

The Nurse Refresher Course will take 16 weeks to complete.

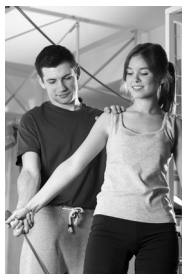

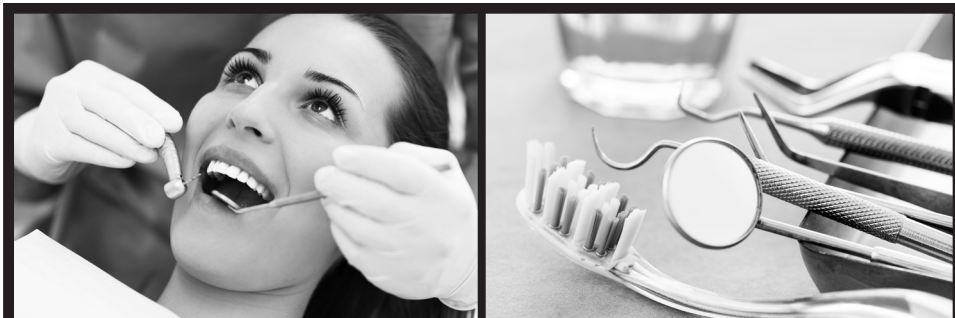

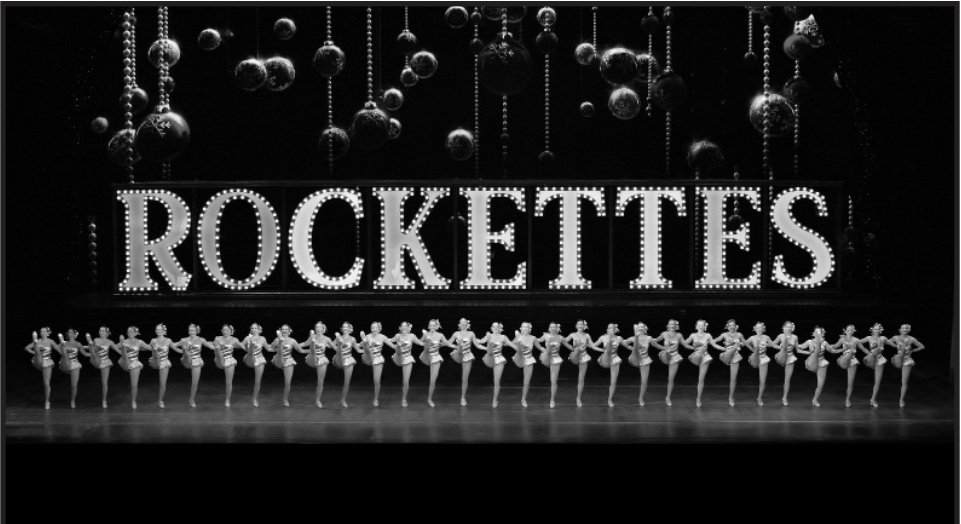

We'll cover the roles of religion, culture, war, and economics as possible background causes for the hysteria produced. We'll cover the immediate causes; the trials themselves, and the results, which included the executions of fourteen women and five men. We'll also learn how and why these trials came to an abrupt ending, and the role that witchcraft plays in a society."

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The 1778 Rhode Island Campaign in the American Revolution



The military campaign involved key figures of the American Revolution, such as Nathaniel Greene and George Washington. It was unique in that its geography included the mainland, islands, and open sea—even a hurricane—spanning New York to Boston. It included the country's first fully integrated regiment of African-Americans and Native Americans. For the first time it involved the Franco-American Alliance of 1778. We'll review failed attempts to wrest control of Rhode Island from the British prior to 1778; we'll ascertain how our government, under the Articles of Confederation, contributed to failure. We'll cover the main events and why they also failed. We'll discover how the foreign alliance with France was quickly frayed by US General John Sullivan, commander of American forces for this campaign, and how said alliance was subsequently repaired.

Birthdate and Social Security Number

Tuition and Fees

Any Maryland resident 60 years of age or older and who enrolls in a Maryland funded course is exempt from payment of tuition but must pay the \$35 fee (or higher fee if indicated in the course description) and any other applicable fees. Tuition does not include any fees or cost associated with a self-supporting program.

All students who enroll in continuing education classes which are not eligible for state funding shall pay full tuition and fees.

All students registering for an open enrollment course shall pay an \$8 registration fee. Checks should be made payable to Hagerstown Community College. There will be a returned check fee of \$35 for checks returned for insufficient funds.

Admissions

Anyone 16 years of age or older is eligible for admission (unless specified otherwise).

Registration Confirmation

You will receive confirmation of your registration. Attend class on the date and time indicated.

Course Cancellations

Each non-credit class requires a minimum number of enrollees to run. The decision to hold or cancel a class is made, in most cases, three business days prior to the start of the class. The college, however, reserves the right to cancel a class at any time due to unexpected circumstances.

Refund Policy

A full refund will be granted when a class is filled or cancelled. A refund will be given when a student withdraws from a course, subject to the following limitations:
