Concrete Mushroom Garden Art

Sandy is offering a new fun concrete garden art project, mushrooms! We find mushrooms growing naturally so they will be a great way to add long lasting, nature-like decoration to your garden. In this class, you will learn a couple different ways to mold the concrete into mushroom shapes, creating the mushroom cap and stem. Each student will make 6 mushrooms out of one bag of premixed concrete. Be prepared to transport your concrete molds home in a sturdy cardboard box or plastic tub. Students should bring: 5 bowls, for mushroom tops, in sizes that appeal to you. Look for those with rounded bottoms(not flat). Check Goodwill or dollar store. Pam vegetable spray, 6-7 1-liter pop bottles for stems, duct tape, plastic gloves and dust mask, a 3 or 4 gallon bucket or tub with about 4 or 5 inches of damp sand in it for the mold method, 1 bag of premixed concrete (pea gravel size gravel), trowel or large spoon to scoop concrete into the molds, and a scissors to cut plastic pop bottles.

It's quite good for any and all plants but is really perfect for succulents, or it is a perfect setting in which to create your little fairy garden. Once hypertufa has completely dried to a light gray in color, it can

be filed with a file or a rasp and then hand sanded with a heavy grade of sandpaper to achieve a fine finish. Over time, hypertufa will develop the characteristics of weathered stone. Additional material fee of \$13

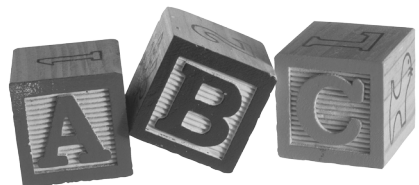

Students will learn how to make a sand mold to hold the leaf, while the concrete becomes impressed by the intricate leaf veins. Students will get to share a bag of premixed cement and learn to mix it to the right consistency. A demonstration on how to finish and paint your sculpture will be given. Additional \$4 payable to instructor at class. Each participant needs to bring a large rhubarb leaf, plastic gloves and dust mask, plywood large enough to hold their leaf with extra space to spare, large plastic bag to slide the plywood and mold into plus about 3 gallons of damp sand to make the mold. Make sure the plywood can lay flat in your trunk after the mold has been made on it.

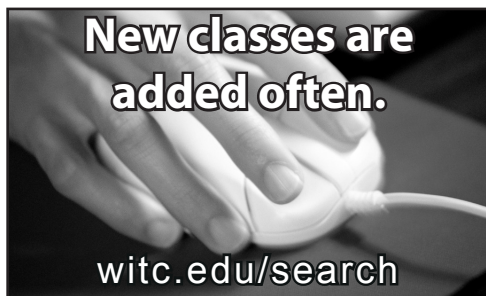
