Legal Nurse Consultant Training Course



This program provides medical professionals the opportunity to train for a career in the legal field as legal nurse consultants. Building on your medical education and possible clinical experience, this course prepares participants to advise law firms, health care providers, insurance companies, and governmental agencies regarding medically related issues and to testify in court as expert witnesses. The course teaches legal concepts related to the health care industry, as well as the role a legal nurse

consultant might play in litigation areas such as medical malpractice, toxic torts, products liability, personal injury, wrongful death, criminal law, and workers' compensation.

Any RN or other medical professional interested in entering the legal field can benefit from the education provided by this course. The course is also open to anyone interested in the field of forensic testimony and medical-legal issues, and participants with a RN background and 2000 hours of recent legal nurse consulting experience may be eligible to take the Legal Nurse Consultant Certified (LNCC) exam after graduation. LNCC is a discretionary exam separate from this training course that experienced registered nurses graduating from this class may decide to sit for. LNCC test eligibility requirements are discussed during this training course; however, graduates of this course need not take the LNCC in order to practice as legal nurse consultants.

The curriculum of this course is designed to comply with the educational guidelines specified by the American Association of Legal Nurse Consultants (AALNC). Students will receive 42 hours of instruction and will be required to prepare assignments and pass weekly quizzes. Successful graduates will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from Biddeford Adult Education and a certificate of contact hours from The Center for Legal Studies.

This seven week online course is designed to train and qualify students to develop or participate in conflict mediation processes. Participants will review the growth and application of settlement options in the

United States. The course focuses on both traditional and non-traditional dispute resolution options. Specific attention will be given to Mediation, Arbitration, Summary Jury Trials, Mini-Trials and Moderated Settlement Conferences. ADR (Alternative Dispute Resolution) is geared to all professionals who are focused on "interest-based bargaining." This course takes the mystery out of settlement processes and focuses on reaching reasonable solutions. Successful graduates of this noncredit course will be awarded a Certificate of Completion from Biddeford Adult Education. Participants will be expected to complete reading and homework assignments and will choose or be assigned project reports that deal with ADR topics. Independent project development is encouraged. 



Beginning January, 2014, the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test) replaced the GED as Maine's High School Equivalency Diploma. We began administering the paper version of the HiSET® in January and will transition to HiSET®'s computer-based version as it becomes available.

Because HiSET®'s subject tests are the same as the GED, Maine will be able to apply the passing scores of GED subject tests to the HiSET®. This means that unlike much of the country, Maine learners did not fall off the "GED testing cliff" at the end of 2013 as previously thought. Students may have started by taking the GED in 2013, but you will be able to finish by taking the remaining subject tests with the HiSET® until December 2014.

As has always been the case in Maine, there is NO COST for Maine residents to prepare for and take the HiSET®. Local adult education programs provide HiSET® testing, preparation materials, pre-tests, and instruction - all at no cost to the learner.
