

THE ORIGIN OF FOOD -Early Farming in Dakota County 1860s-1920s


A Family Event! No Admission Charge. Educational and Fun! Sunday, May 4 – 1pm to 4pm- Dakota City Heritage Village (at Dakota County Fairgrounds, 4008-220th Street West, Farmington, MN. 55024)

Watch teams of Belgian draft horses plowing fields in preparation for planting corn. Try your hand at milking a cow. Inspect farm implements used in the 1860s to early 1900s – before mechanical tractors and other motorized farm implements were used in the fields. Hear from John Day – a farmer who represents four generations of farming in Castle Rock in Dakota County. Learn how our staple foods – corn, wheat, soybeans – made the journey from field to your table as food.

Other planned activities include: Free trolley rides to and from the planting field, time to wander through Dakota City Heritage Village's 1900 era agricultural village (22 historic buildings) and museum. Finish the afternoon with a delicious grilled pork chop dinner (including scalloped potatoes, coleslaw, roll) and beverage for only \$6.

Dodge Middle School Pool Rules...

Be Cool, Follow the Rules

General Rules Include:

- Never enter the pool unless lifeguard(s) are on duty
- No running on the deck
- Only dive in approved areas
- No rough play
- No inflatable arm bands allowed
- Only shoot basketballs from in the water
- NO prolonged breath holding or underwater swimming contests

Lifeguard Signals

- 1 whistle = stop and look
- 3 whistles = everyone stop and get out

Patron safety is the highest responsibility of the staff at the pool.

The Head Lifeguard has both the right and the responsibility to remove anyone not able or willing to comply with these rules. If you have any questions or concerns about these rules, please contact the Aquatics Coordinator at (651) 460-1515.

GROUP LESSONS

Farmington Community Education Aquatics Programs provide parents and children with important and useful information about strokes, skills, and water safety. We help teach people to swim and to be safer in, on and around water and what to do in the event of an emergency. A grid indicating the dates and times that courses are offered can be found on page 27.

FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

Aqua Kids

(parent/child class)

Aqua Kids is for young children new to swim lessons. Skills range from water adjustment to movement in the water with flotation to some independent swimming. Guided sessions help students learn elementary skills including: water entry and exit; bubble blowing; front and back floats; kicking; rolling over with assistance; arm strokes with assistance; life jackets; and more. An adult must be in the water with each student.

Bobbers-1

Preschool 1

This course is for 3 to 5 year olds that are new to swim lessons. This class is very similar to Aqua Kids but is for children that are able to participate without assistance from an adult. Skills include: water entry and exit; bubble blowing; front and back glides; kicking on front and back; rolling over with assistance; arm strokes; life jackets; and more.

Prerequisites: Ages 3 to 5 and comfortable in the water without assistance from an adult.

Bobbers-2

Preschool 2

This preschool course helps 3 to 5 year olds feel comfortable in the water; enjoy the water safely; and begin to move in the water. This class is the same as Beginner-1 but for children ages 3 to 5. Skills include: enter and exit the water; blow bubbles; bob underwater; pick up a submerged object; front and back floats for 5 seconds each; front and back glides; roll over from front to back and back to front; paddle stroke on front 5 yards; finning stroke on back 5 yards; and more.

Prerequisites: Ages 3 to 5 and successfully demonstrate skills from Bobbers-1.

Beginner-1

This course helps students ages 6+ feel comfortable in the water, enjoy the water safely, and begin to move in the water. This class is the same as Bobbers-2 but is intended for children ages 6 and up. Skills include: enter and exit the water; blow bubbles; bob underwater; pick up a submerged object; front and back floats for 5 seconds each; front and back glides; roll over; paddle stroke on front 5 yards; finning stroke on back 5 yards; and more.

Prerequisites: Age 6 or older and comfortable in the water without assistance from an adult.

Beginner-2

This course helps increase comfort and movement in the water. Skills include: jump into chest-deep water; submerge entire head; front and back floats for 10 seconds each; front and back glides with return to wall; tread water for 10 seconds; and more.

Strokes include: paddle stroke on front and finning stroke on back for 15 yards each.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Bobber-2 or Beginner-1 skills.

Intermediate-1

Your child will build on skills learned in Beginner levels and venture into deeper water. Skills include: jump and dive into deep water from the side of the pool; tread water, survival float, and back float for 30 seconds each; and more. Strokes include: front crawl, back crawl, and elementary backstroke 15 yards each; and breaststroke kick for 15 yards.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Beginner-2 skills.





Intermediate-2

Your child will develop confidence in skills learned as well as continue to learn new skills. Skills include: standing dive from the side of the pool; swim under water 5 yards and retrieve an object; feet-first surface dive and retrieve an object; open turns on front and back; somersaults; tread water for 1 minute; reaching and throwing assists; and more. Strokes include: front crawl, back crawl, and elementary backstroke 25 yards each; breaststroke 15 yards; and butterfly kick for 15 yards.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate

Intermediate-1 skills.

Advanced Swimming

Your child will work on coordination and refinement of strokes, as well as build endurance. Skills include: shallowangle dive from the side of the pool; head-first surface dive and retrieve object; front and back crawl flip turns; tread water for 2 minutes; scull 15 yards; and more. Strokes include: front crawl, back crawl, and breaststroke 100 yards each; butterfly and sidestroke 25 yards each.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Intermediate-2 skills.

Adaptive Swim Lessons

This program provides a safe learning environment for students with mild disabilities. While students follow the outlines from one of our swimming levels, modifications are made to strokes and skills as necessary. A specially designed hydraulic lift allows us to accommodate participants who have difficulty entering the pool on their own. Please contact the Aquatics Coordinator to discuss any special needs. This helps us prepare to teach the safest and most appropriate lessons possible.

Semi-Private Lessons

Students learn skills and strokes in smaller groups. Classes will have a maximum of three students per instructor. Once a participant's "level" is determined, they will work towards earning a passing certificate. Classes for Bobbers through Advanced are available.

Adults 18 years & older should call the pool office at (651) 460-1515 to make arrangements for lessons.



Springboard Diving

Develop and improve basic skills required for springboard diving. Skills include stretching exercises; approach and hurdle techniques; press and lift; forward jump-tuck position; forward dive-tuck position; and backward jump-tuck position. Additional skills and dives will be added as necessary for returning participants.

Prerequisites: Ability to comfortably swim 25 yards and do a head first dive from the edge of the pool. \$54 See grid for times and dates.

Competitive Swimming

This course helps those who are new to competitive swimming or are preparing to join a swim team, such as the girls or boys school team, or a swim club. In addition to working on (learning, or improving) the four competitive strokes, participants will learn about starting blocks, relay starts, turns, dry-land drills, and workout sets.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Intermediate-2 skills. \$54
See grid for times and dates.

Water Games/Sports

This course is all about playing in the water. Fun & Funny activities will include: relay races; mat races; climbing wall; water polo; underwater polo (with torpedo); a diving contest; boating; magnetic fishing; underwater tic-tactoe; water basketball; a mini swim meet; a triathlon on the last day; and more.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Intermediate-2 skills. \$54
See grid for times and dates.

Levi Dodge Triathlon

This course is all about preparing for and completing a triathlon at Dodge Middle School. Participants will focus on distance swimming using front crawl and breaststroke and will also spend some time (weather permitting) running and biking at/near the school. There will be a timed triathlon on the last day.

Prerequisites: Successfully demonstrate Intermediate-2 skills. \$54 See grid for times and dates.

Lifeguard Training

This course teaches lifeguard candidates the skills and knowledge needed to recognize, prevent and respond quickly and effectively to aquatic emergencies and to prevent drownings and injuries. **Prerequisites:**

Age 15 by the last scheduled class day. Pass a swimming pretest on the first day.

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
