EMT Emergency Medical Technician

This is a Maine State approved EMT Course. This course prepares students for the entrance level to work on an ambulance. This is a fast paced course, utilizing an online platform to enhance learning and classroom activities.

The majority of your course work will be required to be done on-line, on your own computer. There will be,



face to face, in class sessions with your instructor to learn the practical skills needed to be an EMT. Students can expect to spend a minimum of 25 hours each week on the course doing the required reading and assignments.

A minimum of 20 clinical hours are required. Additional clinical time may be required to complete the clinical objectives. All students will be required to provide immunization documentation prior to clinical.

Once you have successfully complete this course, you will be eligible to sit for the National Registry EMT (NREMT) exam.

Professional Medical Coding and Billing

As a medical coding and billing professional, you will review patient medical records and assign codes to diagnoses and procedures performed so the facility can bill insurance and other third-party payers (such as



Medicare or Medicaid) as well as the patient. Most of these professionals work on-site for hospitals, clinics, physicians, and a variety of other healthcare facilities.

Coders use 3 different code sets: CPT, HCPCS, and ICD-9. The medical billing and coding training program is designed to be completed in 4 months of full-time study. However, the online format allows you to study on your own schedule and your own pace, so your enrollment includes 12 months of program access in case you need extra time.

Pharmacy Technician

Pharmacy technicians are crucial to keeping a pharmacy running smoothly. As a pharmacy tech, you'll have duties and responsibilities such as:

- Accurately and efficiently preparing prescription orders
- Verifying prescription information and dosage

- Processing and submitting insurance claims

The medical transcription industry includes:

- Medical transcriptionists type up written reports of the audio files doctors record after they interact with patients. These written reports are then included in the patient's medical record.
- Medical transcription editors are specialized medical transcriptionists who correct and edit written reports created by speech recognition software, which automatically translates the doctor's dictation into text.







The HiSET (High School Equivalency Test) is an assessment of skills and knowledge comparable to those of a high school



graduate. It is not to be considered a substitute for completing high school and earning a diploma. It is an alternative for those who, for a variety of reasons, are unable to finish high school. HiSET has replaced GED in the state of Maine as the assessment tool used to award the High School Equivalency Diploma.

The HiSET test is a series of five tests covering writing, science, math, literature and the arts, and social studies. These tests require the test taker to apply reading, math, language, and critical thinking skills. Tests are taken one at a time, and can be taken in any order. Passing the HiSET test series allows student to



earn their High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED).

You must be at least 18 years of age. Intake/Orientation/Pre-Test sessions are available both morning and late afternoon **(3 days are required)**. Students may enroll at any time during the semester. There is no fee for this program. Students are required to take the CASAS reading and math assessments and the official HiSET practice tests prior to

HiSET testing.
