Robert Yonke, Watercolor: Beyond the Medium's Boundaries

Whatever medium is used, the objective of the artist should be to produce quality paintings. While it may seem daunting, novel and experimental use of the media tends to enhance artwork and adds another dimension of fun. The results of the techniques employed will be loose, spontaneous and exciting with lots of happy surprises. Using this as the primary direction, this workshop focuses on taking watercolor beyond the boundary of conventional techniques and substrates. We will explore the use of water-based materials on a primed surface and gessoed surface. We will use stretched canvas as our substrate knowing that the techniques can be employed on any surface with the proper preparation. Specific areas of discussion and activity may include: What makes a "quality" painting? Design principles to ensure success. The power of contrasts as demonstrated in values, color, shapes, edges, detail, etc. The power of surprise – encouraging happy accidents. Ways to push the watercolor boundary. The value of critique...by self and others. How to avoid overworking. What to paint. Painting on location. Sketching for painting. Non-painting activity for self-improvement. All of the discussion points will be addressed individually and incorporated into the working part of the workshop. A supply list will be provided upon registration.

Estate Planning: The Importance of Wills and Trusts

Estate planning is not just for the wealthy. An estate plan provides the legal mechanism for disposing of property upon death in a way that recognizes your wishes and the needs of your survivors, while minimizing taxes. For many, it can means planning for the handling of affairs in case of disability, and the personal medical choices to be made as life nears its end. This 2-part course will address the common questions regarding wills and trusts. Part one will center on wills and probate. The class will focus on such issues as: What is a Will and what does it do? What does it take to draft a Will? How do I choose an executor and what percentage of my assets do they take as a commission? The Probate process and is it necessary for my estate? Rita Watson, Register of Wills for Garrett County, will be instructing the course.



Part two will provide an overview on some of the more noticeable legal and financial issues associated with growing old. Some other topics will include preserving and managing assets for a safe and secure retirement, staying in and protecting your home, longterm care insurance, medical assistance and paying for your nursing home care. There will also be discussion of the legal documents all seniors should have such as a will, power of attorney and advanced medical directives. This portion of the course is being instructed by Grantsville native Brandon James Hoover. Brandon is an attorney in the Law Office of Donald S. Goldbloom and an assistant professor at Allegany College of Maryland.

American History: Divisive Issues, Civil War, and Reconstruction

This edition of The American History Series will cover the period of America's history from 1850 to 1876, when divisive issues rattled the nation. Through film, lecture and class discussion this class will examine the issues that divided the nation and led to disunion. Participants will study the Civil War that ensued and the extraordinary decade following the war, known as Reconstruction.

NRA Basic Pistol Course / West Virginia Conceal & Carry Training

This course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude for owning and operating a pistol safely.

The course includes classroom and range time learning to shoot revolvers and semiautomatic pistols. Students learn the National Rifle Association's rules for safe gun handling; pistol parts and operation; ammunition; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting from the bench rest position, and two handed standing positions; cleaning the pistol; and continued opportunities for skill development. Students will receive the NRA Guide to the Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Winchester/NRA Marksmanship Qualification booklet, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination, and course completion certificate.

The classroom portion of the course will occur at Garrett College and the operation and handling demonstration will occur at a secure firing range. The extra time built into the course will allow for a brief lunch break and travel to the range. This course is open to anyone, but it specifically satisfies the requirement to obtain the West Virginia Conceal & Carry Permit, with added section on West Virginia Law.

Maryland Hand Gun Qualification (HQL) Training

This Handgun Qualification License training is a four-hour block of instruction which includes classroom instruction on state firearm law, home firearm safety, handgun mechanisms and operation, and a component that requires the applicant demonstrate the ability to safely fire a handgun. Unless otherwise exempt, as of October 1, 2013, a Maryland Resident must possess a valid Handgun Qualification License before they may purchase, rent, or receive a handgun. The classroom portion of the course will occur at Garrett College and the operation and handling demonstration will occur at a secure firing range. The extra time built into the course will allow for travel to the range. Students must be a minimum of 21 years of age and are not permitted to bring a weapon or ammunition to class. Approved HQL training courses are offered by Maryland State Police approved Qualified Handgun Instructors. Training is valid for 3 years and must be completed prior to submitting an application for a Handgun Qualification License. The Handgun Qualification License is only needed for purchasing, transferring, or renting a regulated firearm after October 1, 2013. You do not need a Handgun Qualification License to own a gun you already have.

Regional Leadership Series at Garrett College

All too often leadership trainings and workshops focus on the leader but leave out the most important component of leadership, the group. A highly effective leader should have a firm understanding of how groups work. Understanding group dynamics and how to apply this knowledge will allow a leader to be more effective with a wide variety of groups. Having leadership skills without and understanding of group dynamics would be like knowing how to drive a car but not understanding traffic laws or road navigation. The level of physical difficulty will be adjusted by the facilitators to insure that all who choose may participate. All activities will be Challenge by Choice, you will decide your level of participation.

What is TA?

Military Tuition Assistance is a benefit paid to eligible members of the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard and National Guard. The Armed Forces offers Active Duty soldiers and Reservists Tuition Assistance (TA) up to \$4,500.00 to current military members, which can be used for college courses, vocational training, and certificate courses taken during off -duty hours.

Each service has its own criteria for eligibility, obligated service, application process and restrictions. This money is usually paid directly to the institution by the individual services. Additionally active duty members may elect to use the MGIB "top-up" in addition to their service provided TA to cover high cost courses. TA is not a loan; it should be viewed as money you have earned, just like your base pay.

FUTURE PROGRAMS

Allied Health-EKG Technician - January 2016

Garrett College plans to expand courses and training programs in the Allied Health Field. We anticipate offering an EKG Technician training program in January 2016.

Allied Health-Health Information Technology - January 2016

Garrett College plans to expand courses and training programs in the Allied Health Field. The requirement to store medical records electronically and provide cyber security will expand employment opportunities in this area.

Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) - January 2016

This training program prepares students to provide both direct patient care as well as manage the administrative tasks required in a medical facility. The following topics will be taught in a series of 6 classes: Office Administration, General Patient Care, Phlebotomy-Venipuncture, EKG Tech, Processing of Laboratory Tests, and an Externship.

Computer Aided Manufacturing/Machining (CAM) Certification - January 2016

This course is designed to prepare students to earn an industry recognized certificate from the National Institute of Metalworking Skills (NIMS) and Autodesk . Students will be taught the skills needed to decrease cycle time, reduce waste, and improve quality in an advanced manufacturing environment.

Dental Assistant - January 2016

To expand, the Class B license allows an individual to operate any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of 26,001 or more pounds; with any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 pounds GVWR. Specific rescue skills include planning for a vehicle or machinery incident, performing on-going incident size-up, establishing scene safety zones, establishing fire protection, stabilizing vehicles or machines, isolating potentially harmful energy sources, determining access and egress points, creating access and egress openings, disentangling victims, removing packaged victims, and terminating vehicle or machinery rescue incidents.


