IRS Enrolled Agent Preparation Program

An Enrolled Agent represents taxpayers before the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Enrolled Agent status is the highest credential awarded by the IRS, and you must either pass the three–part IRS Special Enrollment Examination (SEE) as well as a background check, or have experience as an IRS employee. Once you become an Enrolled Agent, you have unlimited practice rights and are unrestricted in which taxpayers you can represent, what types of tax matters you can handle, and which IRS offices you can represent clients.

This program prepares you for the 3–part IRS SEE, which includes 1) Individuals, 2) Corporations and Partnerships, and 3) Representation, Practice and Procedures. You will also review exam questions and test–taking strategies. ND

IRS Enrolled Agent, Part 3: Representation, Practice and Procedures

You will focus on representation before the IRS; income tax preparers and penalties; representation; collection procedures; examination of returns; and the appeals process. Prerequisite: Successful completion of IRS Enrolled Agent, Part 2: Corporations and Partnerships.

Healthcare - Clinical

LaGuardia offers an array of opportunities for those seeking a career in healthcare. Become an EMT, Paramedic, Spanish/English Healthcare Interpreter, Certified Clinical Medical Assistant, Pharmacy Technician or Dietary Manager. Find out about these courses and more. ND

Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA)

The CCMA is an important member of the medical team who assists the physician with procedures such as taking vital signs, preparing patients for medical procedures, and performing phlebotomy (blood drawing) and electrocardiography (EKG). In order to take the national certification exam for Clinical Medical Assistant, you must successfully pass all five courses in this program. You may take the courses in any order, or you may take them individually.

For those who have evidence of previous training, you may take competency exams for Medical Terminology, EKG Technician or Phlebotomy courses to receive exemption from that part of the CCMA Program. A grade of 80% or greater is required to be exempt, and Phlebotomy also requires a practical skills competency exam in blood drawing. There is a fee of \$99 per competency exam. Evidence of current American Heart Association certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support and First Aid will exempt you from the AHA CPR for Healthcare Providers with First Aid course. Phlebotomy

Become a certified phlebotomist. Learn about the anatomy and physiology of the venous system as well as phlebotomy practices. Develop your skills in a variety of blood collection techniques while employing universal precautions: vacuum collection, dermal punctures, and using syringes and butterfly needles. A minimum of 35 live blood draws are required during the practical skills labs. Successful completion of this course allows you to take the national phlebotomy technician certification exam.

ASL-English Interpretation Program

The American Sign Language (ASL)–English Interpretation Program is a rigorous 2–year academic curriculum that incorporates national interpreter education standards recommended by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education (CCIE). You can earn a BA degree or Professional Certificate in ASL–English Interpretation. This is a highly selective program. Applications are accepted once a year in the spring, before the academic year begins in September. The Pre–Interpreting Program is for individuals who are preparing to enter the ASL–English Interpretation Program. You must be a serious ASL student who interacts regularly in the Deaf community and has studied ASL for at least 2 years. Maurice Fulton

Basic Skills student earns high school equivalency diploma and begins college in less than a year!

Maurice Fulton had been out of school for ten years when he came to LaGuardia's Adult Basic Skills program in January 2015 with the goal of earning his high school equivalency diploma. Starting in the lowest level basic skills class, Maurice did so well that he was able to skip the next level, and within three months he was taking the high school equivalency preparation course, the highest level in the Adult Basic Skills program. Another three months, and Maurice qualified to take the high school

equivalency test. He passed on the first try and had his high school equivalency diploma in hand by June 2015. He wasted no time in enrolling in credit classes at LaGuardia for the Fall 2015 semester.

"I knew that I couldn't become successful if I kept practicing the same bad habits," says Maurice of staying up late to watch TV or play video games. "With time and hard work, I got used to it."

Having finished his first college semester with a 3.15 GPA, the Media Technology major continues to work hard in his studies and also gives back to the program that helped put him on the right path.

"Maurice has been kind enough to speak at our semester program orientations. He shares his goals and advice on how students can achieve what he has achieved in such a short time," says Angelo Ditta, Maurice's high school equivalency preparation course instructor, who recommended him this year for CUNY's Peter Jennings Scholarship Laurel Award.* Maurice won the scholarship award and will use the \$1,000 towards his college education.

With plans to become a graphic designer and possibly start his own company, Maurice is thankful for the support he has received at LaGuardia. "I'm so glad I decided to go back to school and feel even more blessed to have great teachers who really care about my education," he says.

*The Peter Jennings Scholarship Laurel Award is given annually to up to 10 students who have earned their high school equivalency certificate from a CUNY adult literacy/high school equivalency program and who plan to continue their education at a CUNY college. Students must be nominated by a teacher or staff member and provide a personal essay describing their journey to college. Winners each receive a \$1,000 scholarship towards their CUNY college education.



ASL-English Interpretation Program

The American Sign Language (ASL)-English Interpretation Program is a rigorous 2-year academic curriculum that incorporates national interpreter education standards recommended by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education (CCIE). You can earn a BA degree or Professional Certificate in ASL-English Interpretation. This is a highly selective program. Applications are accepted once a year in the spring, before the academic year begins in September. The Pre-Interpreting Program is for individuals who are preparing to enter the ASL-English Interpretation Program. You must be a serious ASL student who interacts regularly in the Deaf community and has studied ASL for at least 2 years. Advanced American Sign Language I

In Advanced ASL, you will dig deep into the realm of ASL. Advanced ASL is an intensive hands-on course that will foster your development in ASL skills. You will use the multimedia lab to reinforce your process of expressing ASL in various registers, such as narration, formal presentation and casual conversation. The course also covers basic ASL linguistics, cultural rules, and the Deaf community and its history.

Introduction to the Field of Interpreting

Tomina Schwenke is an accomplished woman. She is a licensed psychologist; nationally certified American Sign Language (ASL)-English interpreter; adjunct assistant professor at Emory School of Medicine in Atlanta; certified forensic evaluator for the State of Georgia; in private practice at Peachtree Psychological Associates in Atlanta; and has published and presented nationally on various mental health topics. She has also won awards for her research and service in the areas of psychiatry and deafness. 



100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of class hours

50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 20% of class

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash. Allow 2 billing cycles for credit charges to reflect refund on monthly statements. Members of the military needing to withdraw from class at short notice will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
