ASL-English Interpretation Program

The American Sign Language (ASL)-English Interpretation Program is a rigorous 2-year academic curriculum that incorporates national interpreter education standards recommended by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education (CCIE). A small sign leads to a big career change

A mundane event while in college sparked Philip Wilson's interest in American Sign Language (ASL). Little did he know that years later, it would become his career and passion.

Sitting in a crowded cafeteria, Philip watched two young women signing to each other. "All at once, the TVs lost power and there was a dead silence, but the two women just

kept signing. They were oblivious to the hearing people's situation. And I thought, 'That's beautiful,' " he explains. Though he became very interested in ASL at that point, it wouldn't be until eight years later that he took his first ASL class. After becoming fluent, on the recommendation of friends in the Deaf community and his own whim, he applied to LaGuardia's ASL-English Interpretation Program (AEIP) and was accepted. Continuing in his job as an events manager, he became more and more attracted to the idea of interpreting as a career. "Every class increased the thrill of active interpreting," says Philip.

Often I can tell LaGuardia interpreters when I meet them. There's a certain niche they fit into, as they seem to know the importance of prioritizing their connections to the Deaf community that gave them the language in the first place. I feel privileged to be a graduate of the program and among that few.

Having graduated from the program in June 2011, Philip is now an educational interpreter in a program for Deaf students in a Bronx public high school. He credits the education and training he received in AEIP with giving him the building blocks he needed to pass the written portion of the national certification exam, obtain his current position and have confidence interpreting in various settings. "It's a great program," he asserts.

Interpreting Lab

Students will be required to attend the Language/Interpreting lab a minimum of 12.5 hours per trimester. Classroom instructors will work with the Lab Instructor on topics and presentations that will enhance students' language fluency and allow them to practice interpretation in a guided and structured milieu. Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA)

The Certified Clinical Medical Assistant is an important member of the medical team who assists the physician with procedures such as taking vital signs, preparing patients for medical procedures, and performing phlebotomy (blood drawing) and electrocardiography (EKG).

In order to take the national certification exam for Clinical Medical Assistant, you must successfully pass all five courses in this program. You may take the courses in any order, or you may take them individually.

For those who have evidence of previous training, you may take competency exams for Medical Terminology, EKG Technician or Phlebotomy courses to receive exemption from that part of the CCMA Program. A grade of 80% or greater is required to be exempt, and Phlebotomy also requires a practical skills competency exam in blood drawing. There is a fee of \$99 per competency exam. The High School Equivalency (HSE) test for New York State is called the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC), www.tasctest.com.

• The TASC includes five sections:



- 1. Language Arts Reading
- 2. Language Arts Writing (includes grammar and essay writing)
- 3. Mathematics (includes sections with and without a calculator)
 - 4. Science (calculators are permitted)
 - 5. Social Studies
- The TASC takes about 9 hours to complete. It is offered at LaGuardia Community College on Friday evening and all day Saturday.
- The TASC is free for New York State residents and is available in English or Spanish.

How to Apply for the TASC

- Any New York State resident who is 19 or older and does not have a high school diploma may take the TASC. Seventeen and 18-year-olds must fill out required forms with attachments.

- Submitting an application does not guarantee a seat. If you would like a response, include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with the application.
- Test locations and dates are posted on the website.

YAIP helps launch student's success

When teenager Rachel Chambers left her native Jamaica to join her mother in New York in the fall of 2013, she didn't know that LaGuardia would become such a big part of her life. At the time, Rachel's mom was a student at LaGuardia and wanted to engage her daughter in a positive way. On the recommendation of a friend who worked at the college, Rachel's mother referred her to LaGuardia's Young Adult Internship Program (YAIP), a 14-week internship program for New York City young adults (16-24) not working and not in school, and she was selected for the program.

As part of YAIP, Rachel interned at the Queens District Attorney's Office (QDA) and received many accolades from her supervisors. Encouraged, she applied and was accepted at LaGuardia as a Liberal Arts major, focusing on Humanities and Social Sciences. With the help of the YAIP staff, Rachel was connected to many resources at the college and was able to defer working during her first year so she could focus fully on school.

During her studies, Rachel has maintained a GPA above 3.9 and has made the Dean's List every semes-

ter. She's been involved in the college community, joining Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Honor Society, the President's Advisory Council and Alpha Sigma Pi Leadership Society. She has sought to make a difference in her life and in the lives of others, helping as a Student Advisor and volunteering at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York. Most recently, Rachel was selected to be a poster student for President Obama's Heads Up America campaign, a movement to provide tuition-free community college education, and has been featured in the public service announcements and poster ads.

In fall 2015, Rachel was nominated and accepted into the prestigious Kaplan Leadership Scholars Program, which helps minority community college students transfer to universities with a full scholarship. She is set to graduate this spring-at the age of 18!with an associate degree and will have her choice of numerous outstanding four-year colleges to attend.

Kimberly Lucas is the Academic Advisor and Coordinator of Accommodation Services for Deaf and Hard of Hearing (D/HH) students at LaGuardia. Being deaf herself, she believes strongly in providing the same opportunities for success to all students. "Growing up there was (and still is) a lack of diverse Deaf professionals who were able to guide a person like me in pursuing higher education," says Ms. Lucas. "I am sensitive to students' needs and want to support the individual student's goals. I also have a passion for increasing the number of D/HH people of various marginalized identities entering higher education."

As a graduate student at New York University, Ms. Lucas worked in LaGuardia's Program for Deaf Adults (PDA) as a Counselor Intern. Once she earned her MA Degree in Deafness Rehabilitation Counseling, she applied for a Counselor position and has spent the past 25 years helping D/HH students excel in college while advancing her own career. She is actively involved in Deaf education research and is a member of the National Association of the Deaf as well as board member of the National Black Deaf Advocates (NBDA), for which she served as Vice President/Chairman of the Board and President for the New York City chapter. She has garnered the Humanitarian Award from NBDA and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Action Network for her service and work in the Deaf community. Ms. Lucas was also the first Miss Black Deaf New York City as well as Miss Black Deaf America 1984, and she was the first (and only) African-American Miss Deaf New York State in 1985.

How to Get Here

Refund Policy

For courses under \$299

100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to second week of classes

For courses \$299 and above or more than 50 hours of instruction

100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of class hours

50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 20% of class hours

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash. Allow 2 billing cycles for credit charges to reflect refund on monthly statements. Members of the military needing to withdraw from class at short notice will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
