

Pre-College Programs

LaGuardia's pre-college programs serve community residents in English as a Second Language, literacy, math, high school equivalency and college transition programs. Serving a population often forgotten, LaGuardia has shown extraordinary success in designing effective programs that educate and prepare students for training, employment and college.

- LaGuardia's Pre-College Programs in the Division of Adult and Continuing Education served 11,133 adults and young adults in 2014-15.
- More than 2,000 youth had paid employment through the Summer Youth Employment Program.
- Over 2,500 international students improved their English through the English Language Center.
- Over 200 out-of-school and disconnected youth prepared for employment through job internships.
- 60% of CUNY Language Immersion Program students, who enter the program at the lowest ESL levels, transition into the college after one year.
- 20% of incoming students at LaGuardia (freshmen and transfers) have come through our Adult and Continuing Education Programs.




EMPOWERING IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES THROUGH TARGETED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Center for Immigrant Education and Training (CIET)

- CIET has served over 8,870 adults in English language classes since 2001.
- 4,895 non-native English speaking adults have become more involved in their community as a result of taking ESL/Civics classes.
- 97% of participants in CIET English language classes report gains in follow-up outcomes, such as obtaining or retaining employment and entering post-secondary education and training.
- The NYC Welcome Back Center has provided comprehensive services to help over 900 internationally trained healthcare professionals rebuild their healthcare careers in New York State since 2011.


GETTING BETTER RESULTS FOR ADULTS IN HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) PROGRAMS



Students in the **Bridge Program,** which contextualizes its curriculum around student career and college aspirations, were more than twice as likely to pass the HSE exam and three times as likely to enroll in college than students in traditional HSE programs.

- According to the U.S. Census, getting a high school equivalency credential increases lifetime earnings by \$331,000.
- Getting an Associate Degree increases lifetime earnings by more than \$400,000.
- By getting a HSE diploma and an Associate Degree, adults can double their annual earning potential.

About the TASC

The High School Equivalency (HSE) test for New York State is called the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC), www.tasctest.com.

The TASC includes five sections:



- 1. Language Arts Reading
- 2. Language Arts Writing (includes grammar and essay writing)
- 3. Mathematics (includes sections with and without a calculator)
- 4. Science (calculators are permitted)
- 5. Social Studies
- The TASC takes about 9 hours to complete. It is offered at LaGuardia Community College on Friday evening and all day Saturday.
- The TASC is free for New York State residents and is available in English or Spanish.

How to Apply for the TASC

- New York State website for all information and forms: www.acces.nysed.gov/hse/
- Any New York State resident who is 19 or older and does not have a high school diploma may take the TASC. Seventeen and 18-year-olds must fill out required forms with attachments.
- Print out and complete Attachment A found on the website.
- Attachment A must be submitted to a testing center with a copy of New York State proof of residence.
- Submitting an application does not guarantee a seat. If you would like a response, include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with the application.
- Test locations and dates are posted on the website.
- Testing accommodations are available. Visit http://www.tasctest.com/special-needs-accommodations.html

How to Prepare for the TASC

- LaGuardia Community College offers free Adult Basic Skills and High School Equivalency classes on weekdays, during the day and evening. You can apply for the waiting list at www.hselaguardia.org or call (718) 482-5385.
- Low-cost classes are also available without a waiting list on weekdays, during the day and evening, and on Saturdays. To register see our catalog at http://www.lagcc.cuny.edu/ace/ or call (718) 482-5385.

Information for Re-Testers

- If you fail one or more of the test sections, those sections may be retaken after 60 days. The TASC can be taken up to 3 times within one year.
- · Passing scores from previous GED ® tests will count. Take the TASC only for the sections that you failed.
- Transcripts can be requested from NYSED at www.acces.nysed.gov/hse/

DREAMing about his future

Ivan Aucapina has a plan for his future. Coming back to school after eight years, his main objective was to earn his high school equivalency diploma. After two years of study and preparation at LaGuardia, he passed the high school equivalency exam and is now attending the college as a Fine Arts major. With the Peter Jennings Scholarship Laurel Award* from CUNY and the national DREAM Scholarship** he is on his way to reaching his next goal of owning a construction and home design company.

"I have experience in this field as a construction worker. Now I want to be on the other side, designing and creating the blueprints," says Ivan. His aspirations involve others as well. With ongoing support from his family, and a desire to provide a good example for his nine-year-old son, he explains he will continue to focus on school work and balance his work schedule accordingly.

Achieving my educational goals is really important to me and will impact my life because it would open doors with better opportunities for me and my family...If I can set a path and break the stereotypes about DREAMers and prove that we came to this country looking for better opportunities, better jobs and a better life, it would make a big impact, not just for us but for the society that we live in.

^{*}The Peter Jennings Scholarship Laurel Award is given annually to up to 10 students who have earned their high school equivalency certificate from a CUNY adult literacy/high school equivalency program and who plan to continue their education at a CUNY college. Students must be nominated by a teacher or staff member and provide a personal essay describing their journey to college. Winners each receive a \$1,000 scholarship towards their CUNY college education.

^{**}TheDream.US is a new multimillion dollar National Scholarship Fund for DREAMers, created to help immigrant youth who've received Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) achieve their American Dream through the completion of a college education.

Get Your High School

High School Equivalency In English

Prepare to take the new high school equivalency exam (Test Assessing High School Completion or TASC) and start building your future! You will focus on reading, writing and mathematics, and participate in career planning workshops presented by academic counselors. You'll also receive advisement on opportunities in certificate and college credit programs. The course is open to those 19 years of age or older.

To apply, you must attend one of the placement exam dates below.

Placement Exam:

- 35 minute reading exam
- 20 minute math survey

In order to enroll in the high school equivalency course, you must pass all three sections of the placement exam. If you've taken the high school equivalency (formerly G.E.D.) exam before, you may be exempt from placement testing. Bring your scores to the placement exam to find out or call (718) 482–5385 to speak to an advisor.

Payment:

- Course fee can be paid by credit/debit card or money order.
- Placement test fee of \$25 can be paid online at www.laguardia.edu/acereg/ or by money order.

If paying by money order, leave blank until completion of the placement exam process. Books for all high school equivalency and pre-high school equivalency courses and scientific calculator must be purchased separately.

Discounts:

- Public assistance recipients 50% discount (you must show benefit card) 65 years of age and older - 30% discount
- If you have taken the high school equivalency course in the last 6 months and need to retake it 30% discount

Program for Deaf Adults Wins Grant to Establish Alternate High School Diploma Program

LaGuardia's Program for Deaf Adults has been awarded a grant through the CUNY Workforce Development Initiative to establish a pilot program that offers Deaf students an alternate way to earn a high school diploma. Known as the National External Diploma Program (NEDP), participants will create a portfolio of work demonstrating 70 competencies in reading, computation, writing, problem solving and "speaking," as evidenced in real-life simulation tasks, such as developing budgets, writing answers to questions, and making oral presentations. Those whose portfolios are found to be satisfactory will be granted a high school diploma from Long Beach High School in New York.







ASL-English Interpretation Program

The American Sign Language (ASL)–English Interpretation Program is a rigorous 2–year academic curriculum that incorporates national interpreter education standards recommended by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education (CCIE). You can earn a BA degree or Professional Certificate in ASL–English Interpretation. This is a highly selective program. Applications are accepted once a year in the spring, before the academic year begins in September. The Pre–Interpreting Program is for individuals who are preparing to enter the ASL–English Interpretation Program. You must be a serious ASL student who interacts regularly in the Deaf community and has studied ASL for at least 2 years. This mini–program includes Advanced ASL I, Advanced ASL II, and Sociology of American Deaf Communities. For more information visit http://laguardia.edu/aeip/

Advanced American Sign Language II

Advanced ASL II is offered to reinforce your continuing development in becoming a fully fluent ASL user. Activities include hands-on experience in expressing narratives in ASL, and engaging in dialogue with various members within multi cultural Deaf communities. 

Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA)

The Certified Clinical Medical Assistant is an important member of the medical team who assists the physician with procedures such as taking vital signs, preparing patients for medical procedures, and performing phlebotomy (blood drawing) and electrocardiography (EKG).

In order to take the national certification exam for Clinical Medical Assistant, you must successfully pass all five courses in this program. You may take the courses in any order, or you may take them individually.

For those who have evidence of previous training, you may take competency exams for Medical Terminology, EKG Technician or Phlebotomy courses to receive exemption from that part of the CCMA Program. A grade of 80% or greater is required to be exempt, and Phlebotomy also requires a practical skills competency exam in blood drawing. There is a fee of \$99 per competency exam. Evidence of current American Heart Association certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support and First Aid will exempt you from the AHA CPR for Healthcare Providers with First Aid course. PTAC Helps Small HVACR Company Compete with Big Corporations

It's not easy for a minority owned small business to keep up with large corporations, but with the right help it can be done. Double "D" Repairs has become a much more lucrative business over the past four years, thanks to guidance from LaGuardia's Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC).

Eddy Charles, owner of Double "D" Repairs, an HVACR and mechanical insulation company in Queens, learned about PTAC attending outreach programs for small businesses. Becoming a client in 2011, PTAC staff helped Mr. Charles acquire the New York State Minority Business Enterprise Certification (MBE), streamlining the entire application process. It has also assisted with his re-certification application, and Mr. Charles is now on track to locate even more procurement opportunities.

Because of the capacity building that PTAC has provided, including exposure to agencies such as Metro-North and the MTA, Double "D" Repairs has bid on opportunities for over \$400,000.

PTAC Helps Security Company Obtain Major Government Contracts

ISS Action, a woman-owned small business led by Pamela Newman, is a security services firm that employs 200 women and men and is licensed and bonded in eight states. Ms. Newman established the company in 1999 and operated the small business at John F. Kennedy Airport, providing security services to different airlines.

After 9/11, however, the business of airport security changed dramatically, and ISS Action began to pursue additional avenues, understanding that business diversification would be critical to survival. ISS Action's journey into government contracting began in 2005, and by 2006 the company was awarded five

New York State contracts.

Eventually, ISS Action began to research Federal government contracting and reached out to LaGuardia's Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) in 2009 to learn more about opportunities available. After much active participation on Ms. Newman's part, and guidance from PTAC, in 2010 the company was awarded a large security contract for the NYC

With help from PTAC, ISS Action has been awarded, including option years, \$41 million in government contracts since 2009.

Department of Transportation's Brooklyn Bridge Rehabilitation from construction company Skanska. And in 2011, ISS Action was honored with the US Department of Transportation Small Business Utilization Safety Award for its security services on the Brooklyn Bridge project.

ISS Action, a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise, was able to achieve Federal 8 (a) status, which helps small, disadvantaged businesses compete in the marketplace, and in December 2011 was awarded the Security and Protective Contract for a NASA location in Mississippi. In November 2013, the company was awarded the prestigious United States Merchant Marine Academy Federal contract for armed guards. And in August 2015, the company was awarded by the Port Authority of New York & New Jersey the armed PATH Train contract, which utilizes ISS Action armed guards in both New York and New Jersey.

SBTRC Helps Concrete Cutting Company Secure Major Bridge Contract through Bonding Education Program

Bernadette Hogan has a vision for her company, JP Hogan Coring and Sawing, and that is to be the #1 concrete cutting company in New York. So, after picking up the pieces of the business that her father founded decades ago and that Hurricane Sandy nearly destroyed in 2012, Ms. Hogan set out to gain a share of the concrete cutting market in the New York, New Jersey and Connecticut tri-state area.

"We'd never been asked for bonding, but the subject came up over and over again at workshops and events we'd go to," recalls Ms. Hogan, referring to bonding capacity that is often required of contractors on public projects in order to ensure that the projects get completed by the contractor. In today's construction environment, a contractor's ability to obtain a surety bond has a significant effect on that contractor's ability to acquire work.

In October 2014, Ms. Hogan was referred to the Small Business Transportation Resource Center (SBTRC) at LaGuardia Community College and enrolled her company in SBTRC's Bonding Education Program (BEP).

The BEP is a partnership between the US Department of Transportation, Surety and Fidelity Association of America (SFAA) and LaGuardia to bring contractor development education to firms seeking bonding capacity to better their chances of participating

in federally funded transportation projects. The 9-week program was hosted by SBTRC and the joint venture of Skanska Kiewit Ecco (SKE) for the Kosciuszko Bridge Replacement Project. Contractors in the program were prepared to qualify for bonding in order to participate in this project.

By the end of the BEP in December 2014, JP Hogan, a NY Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), was approved for bonding capacity up to \$1 million.

JP Hogan understood that in order to grow and move up in the industry, it would need to adjust the way it operated the business. The BEP, with

workshops led by LaGuardia staff and industry experts in accounting, legal, estimating and project management, among other topics, accelerated the company's decision to align with construction professionals while holding on to a team of loyal workers that had so carefully been put together over the course of two decades.

"We listened to the experts, examined what we had and what we needed to improve on," said Kathleen Makowski, VP for Administration and Finance at JP Hogan. "The day after the workshops, we would measure our strengths and weaknesses and organize the knowledge we had acquired to make our case for bonding capacity presentable and strong."

The effort paid off. By the end of the BEP in December 2014, JP Hogan, a NY Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), was approved for bonding capacity up to \$1 million. The company's portfolio includes some of the region's mega infrastructure projects: the New NY Bridge Project, Kosciuszko Bridge Replacement Project, Brooklyn Battery Tunnel and the Second Avenue Subway projects, among many others.



100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of class hours

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash.
