Monigue Ellis is determined to make her adulthood better than her childhood was. She describes her birth as "not in a hospital bed, but on the floor of my mother's room in Jamaica, West Indies." 

Native ASL speaker learns there are more ways than one to interpret

Perhaps it was because she has overcome Multiple Sclerosis to maintain the full use of her hands. Or maybe it was her eloquent submission essay on teaching her young son how to run in the rain and learning a valuable lesson herself about taking chances. But, in the end, Colleen Montana is grateful for the CUNY/Helena Rubinstein Continuing Education Scholarship for Career Advancement she was awarded, which has allowed her to pursue her studies in LaGuardia's American Sign Language-English Interpretation Program (AEIP).

Colleen, a child of Deaf parents, never wanted to be an ASL interpreter. Though her first language was ASL, as an adult, she steered away from this as a career choice. She eventually enrolled in a community college and was inspired by one of her teachers to become an ASL interpreter. She earned an Associates Degree in ASL-English Interpretation and was then accepted into AEIP. She hopes to complete the program—which will give her a Bachelors Degree in ASL-English Interpretation through a collaboration with Empire State College/SUNY—and go on to receive her National Interpreter Certification, focusing on Broadway and theater interpreting.

It's been a winding road, but despite health issues, a busy schedule-besides being a mom, she is a full-time staff interpreter for a school for the Deaf in Long Island—and the challenges of a rigorous academic program, she has succeeded thus far in achieving her goals. "It's been a humbling experience," says Colleen. "Working with many other proficient signers, I see that there are many ways to do things. It's not just one way or my way. We work together so I see other perspectives."



In their own words ...

Emmanuel Ramos

I was older than the average recruit when I joined the United States Army on December, 21, 1998, and I was very proud. My grandfather served in the military during the Korean War, and I always admired him for his service. He told me stories about Korea, its people, and his travels throughout Asia. Later in life, I developed an interest in history and cultures that I now share with my children. I joined the military for patriotic reasons, the ability to advance my career goals, and to provide my family with added security. I was married with two young children, so I settled for the reserve component of the Army.

While in the military I was trained as a Combat Medic and later a Surgical Technologist. This training has served my family and me well for over 20 years. The Army was a catalyst to my civilian career as a Surgical Technologist and has offered a great deal of moral training that reinforced what I learned as a child.

The United States Army has been a great challenge, and it has also been a great resource.

Frank J. Casillas, III

My ambition was always to join the service, especially after the 9/11 terrorist attacks. So, on October 11, 2007, at the age of 20, I swore in as a United States Army Infantryman, and I shipped out the same day in support of "Operation Iraqi Freedom" with the agenda and motivation to serve the country honorably.

On June 6, 2008, I deployed to Mosul, Iraq as part of a combined multi-national contingent to calm the violence and corruption plaguing the newly-founded Iraqi government. We replaced a battalion of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force in one of the most volatile areas since the invasion in 2003. On September 1, 2009 we redeployed to the US with a wealth of experience and myself, with a Specialist rank and the hardened poise of a combat infantryman.

Three months after my return, I volunteered to go to Afghanistan, which was becoming a dire situation for the troops on ground. I was given Sergeant Stripes, and on April 1, 2011 we deployed to Konduz, Afghanistan. By far, my Afghanistan deployment was the hardest, most demanding time of my life. After this, my mental health was spent, and it took me some time to even realize that I had suffered a mental injury that would ultimately lead to my medical separation from the service. Because of Posttraumatic Stress Disorder, I was to medically retire.

Enlisting in the Army Infantry was the most rewarding and sacrificial experience I've ever had. I've become a proud veteran, after all is said and done, and internally the pride I carry can never be thwarted or taken away from me.

These Veteran Upward Bound (VUB) students have come to LaGuardia to further their education, seek resources and begin a new chapter in their lives.

He has big dreams

Hector Chabla is a 2014-2015 recipient of the prestigious Dream Scholarship, a new multimillion dollar National Scholarship Fund created to help immigrant youth achieve their American Dream through the completion of a college education. He plans to use the scholarship to enroll in

LaGuardia and pursue a career as a music recording technician. "My passion for music was born when I was a child. My grandfather taught me how to play

the drums in my home country, Ecuador," says Hector. "I know a career in the music industry will not be easy, but I'm willing to go through the challenges that will arise in order to achieve my goal."

After all of the experiences that I have been through, I learned that if you don't have a good education or career, you can't find a better job with less risk.

After dropping out of high school to work in construction, Hector was injured on the job when a beam fell on him and broke his foot, lower back, neck and shoulder. Because of the accident and numerous surgeries afterward, it was difficult for him to work and pay tuition, so he enrolled in free High School Equivalency in Spanish classes through LaGuardia's Adult Basic Skills department. After passing the high school equivalency exam in fall 2013, Hector applied to LaGuardia and is currently completing English language classes through the CUNY Language Immersion Program.

Alejandro Jimenez came to the United States from Colombia in September 2013. That November, he began classes in the CUNY Immigrant Education Initiative, launched at LaGuardia's Center for Immigrant Education and Training that fall to provide

free English as a Second Language (ESL) and high school equivalency classes to qualifying immigrant adults. In little over a year after starting ESL classes, Alejandro is on the path to an Associates Degree in Liberal Arts and ultimately a Bachelors Degree in Accounting.

My goal since I started at LaGuardia was to get my associates degree and transfer into a four-year college... I am on my way.

After attending the free ESL classes, Alejandro applied to LaGuardia in the spring 2014 and did so well on the CUNY Assessment Test (CAT) - Writing placement exam that he was able to begin college courses in fall 2014. He is currently in his second semester at the college. "My goal since I started at LaGuardia was to get my associates degree and transfer into a four-year college, such as Baruch. I am on my way," says Alejandro. "I feel the college is interested in helping out students and bringing in resources if they're needed."

Latin American Civilizations

Students will learn to comment critically on Latin American civilization and to make significant comparisons with their own backgrounds and experiences. Prerequisite: Placement Exam.

Contemporary Latin American Fiction in Translation

This course explores the thematic and stylistic variety of contemporary Latin American fiction in English translation. Experimental and fantastic fiction will also be considered. Students will learn about the literary movements that influenced the writers in question. Prerequisite: ENC/ENG101.



Discounts

100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of

50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 20% of class

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash. Allow 2 billing cycles for credit charges to reflect refund on monthly statements. Members of the military needing to withdraw from class at short notice will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
