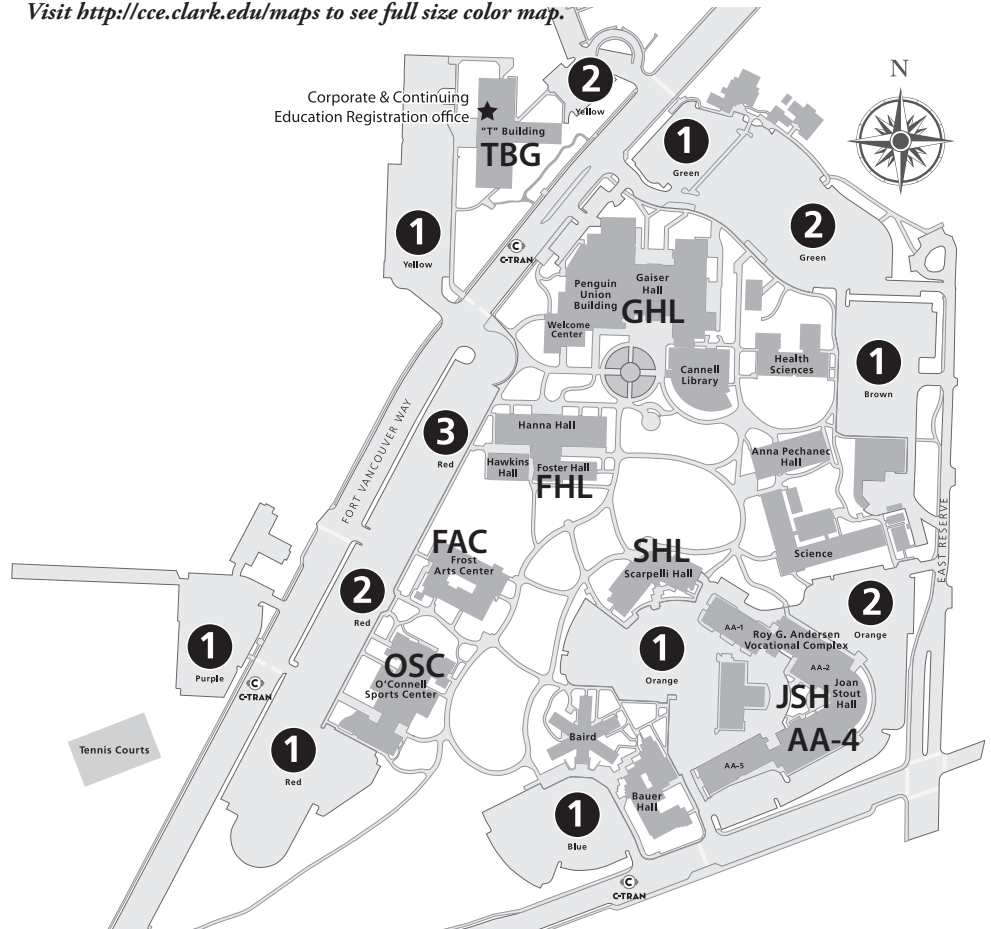



INCLEMENT WEATHER

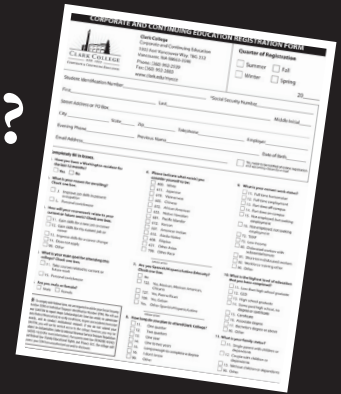
