FORENSIC SCIENCE

Spend 24 fun-filled hours learning all you can about Forensic Science from Mr. Biss. He developed the first Forensic Science class at SUNY Adirondack back in 1987. Some people refer to this class as The Three B's (Bones, Bullets and Blood), but students will see that there is a lot more to it than that! You will:

- Perform many hands-on experiments dealing with evidence collection, blood splatter analysis, skeleton reconstruction and DNA fingerprinting, to name a few.
- Stage a crime scene then document it with sketches, digital cameras and videos. These will help you determine how the tool marks, fingerprints, blood splatter, footprints, DNA and so on are used to figure out what happened and who did it.
- Discuss firearms, bullet holes, arsons, explosions, illegal drugs, counterfeit money, and documents and how they are discovered and analyzed by the modern Forensic Scientist.

THE WONDER OF TESSELLATIONS




