

Students under the age of 18 must have a parent or guardian accompany them to the class to meet briefly with the instructor; parent signatures are required on some documents. Successful completion allows a student to waive the Secretary of State riding skills test.

Attendance and required equipment for all motorcycle safety courses

If you are tardy, you will not be allowed in class. You must attend all class sessions and pass all written and riding skills tests to successfully complete the class. Students in <u>all</u> classes must wear proper riding attire while on the riding range. This includes: DOT-approved motorcycle helmet, long sleeve jacket or heavy shirt, heavy duty long pants, eye protection-goggles or glasses (required even with a face shield helmet), full fingered gloves, hard sole over-the-ankle boots (high heels or high-top tennis shoes not permitted), and rain and cold weather gear as needed. The instructor has the final decision on the acceptability of student-provided equipment.

There will be NO REFUNDS, TRANSFERS, or DISCOUNTS for these courses.

If the class you want is full, you have three options beyond those normally available:

- Add your name to the waiting list by calling 517.265.1650.
- Come early on the first day of class. If a registered student does not show up, you may be allowed to register on a first-come, first-served basis.
