

- Knowledge of the interpersonal, team and intercultural skills needed to effectively work with patients and support them in making changes necessary for improved health
- Tools for working with clinicians, social workers, insurers and key hospital staff, including communication and documentation skills
- Knowledge of community resources, health and behavioral health services and how to successfully navigate systems
- Understanding of the importance of patient-driven care and how to involve, educate and inform families, caregivers and the medical team to effectively coordinate better health outcomes for the patients
