

The Sustainable Living Institute of Maui (SLIM) Community Garden has celebrated its first year serving the community. Supported by Malama Maui Nui, the Department of Water Supply, the Ulupono Initiative and the Makana Family Foundation, the garden has become a living laboratory.

Not only do plot members grow their own food, numerous classes are using the garden as a living laboratory to learn about home gardening, rain gardens, pests and diseases, soil and compost building, as well as for small-scale construction projects.


As CEO and President of this thriving upcountry business, Chang is a role model for the entrepreneur inspired to cultivate sustainability in work, play and life. "I want our business to grow sustainably. I enjoy where I come to work, and I want our employees to enjoy it as well."

Being connected to community is one of Chang's core values. "As we are a small local business, supporting our ohana is really important to us. We collect donations of canned goods in exchange for admission fees, have created a fully endowed scholarship fund with Kamehameha Schools, and practice sustainable agriculture to be sensitive to our environment. This helps to create a complete cycle of resources."

Chang wears a Sustainable Aloha t-shirt that conveys the spirit of the farm. "It was an idea started by my father, Ali'i Chang and his business partner Lani Weigert, to envision who we are and what we do. To me, Sustainable Aloha means being socially conscious, supportive and positive in relation to our community, environment, industry and one's personal life," explained Chang.

"Hawaii is unique as one of the top destinations in the world, and people who are here as residents and visitors bring that growing awareness of sustainability. 




