





This course is for the registered dental assistant who is licensed on or after January 1, 2010 who must provide evidence of successful completion of a board approved course in the application of pit and fissure sealants prior to the first expiration of his or her license as a condition of renewal. Dental Assistants with a coronal polish certificate may also enroll in this course. Laboratory instruction is conducted on a typodont with simulated pit and fissure teeth. Participants are required to provide 4 patients with one virgin tooth in each quadrant. Information regarding other equipment and patient requirements will be given to the student prior to the first day of class. Please contact instructor for additional information. Additionally, participants are required to provide two slow speed hand pieces with prophy angle/cup attachments and four patients. All other materials are provided.
