Bridge to College and Careers Program

Students Earn their High School Equivalency Diploma

Sixty-two graduates of LaGuardia's Bridge to College and Careers Program celebrated the achievement of earning their high school equivalency diploma at a graduation ceremony last spring.

New York City Councilman Daniel Dromm (District 25), Chair for the Committee on Education, gave the keynote address. "Congratulations to the Bridge to College and Careers Class of 2014 graduates!" said Councilman Dromm. "This is a brilliant program that helps students not only to get their GED but also gives them a foundation for college and beyond. The students I met with were highly motivated and were thrilled to have achieved their initial goal of getting a GED. I am proud to have participated in their event."

Of the 62 recent graduates, 10 are enrolled in a degree program at LaGuardia and 18 applied for the Fall 2014 semester; two are participating in a Community Health Worker training program at Make The Road New York; one is in LaGuardia's Green Jobs Training Program; and two have gotten a raise at their job.

Robert Morales

After dropping out of high school in the 11th grade, Robert Morales quickly returned to school a few months later and completed the Bridge to Science program, earning his high school equivalency diploma in the fall of 2012. But because of his financial situation and the fact that he needed to work, he had to take off three semesters before finally enrolling in college. This past spring he finished his first semester as a Commercial

Photography major. With hopes of continuing his education and training at a technical institute once he earns his Associates Degree, Robert is determined. "I'm focusing on my homework as well as class quizzes and essays," he says. "I want to graduate on time with a 3.0-4.0 GPA. I will do it."

"If someone came to me three years ago and predicted that I would be graduating from LaGuardia Community College as an honor student and would be accepted by every four-year college that I applied to, with a scholarship, including New York University, Hofstra, Hunter, and Adelphi, I would have laughed my head off," says Modupe Marks, a 2012 Bridge to Health graduate. "I had just lost my business and was moving from

one dead end job to another. ... I was 41 years old and left school over 20 years before. Finally, I decided there was nothing wrong in trying for the GED."

The Nigerian immigrant, a Psychology major at LaGuardia who also just completed a nursing assistant certificate program, graduated this summer with an AA Degree and plans to transfer to New York University, where she wants to study neuroscience. She has been on the Dean's List every semester, is a member of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society, founded the college's African Roots Society club, works with the LaGuardia and Wagner Archives on the Friends of Koch project that will be featured in The *New York Times*, and works on campus as an office assistant and tutor. She has even re-started her hairdressing and fashion designing business.

"I still have a long way to go with my education and have no plans of stopping any time soon," Marks says. "Now I know that I can do anything that I set my heart on because I had a good foundation through the Bridge Program."

Chimey Palmo came to the U.S. as a refugee from Nepal four years ago. Now a permanent resident, she works full-time as a nanny to support her family back in her home country and attends LaGuardia part-time as an Occupational Therapy Assistant major. Completing the Bridge to Science program and earning her high school equivalency diploma in the spring of 2013, Chimey recently finished her second semester at the college,

using tools and resources from the Bridge Program to help her decide what her career goals were.

"I would never be back to school without the awesome help of the Bridge Program team. The research we did in the course is helping me today with my college classes," says Chimey, adding that she also got assistance from the staff on the admissions and financial aid processes. "I was nervous and confused about going back to school after nine years and in a whole new place far from my family. The program has helped me overcome those fears and made me feel cared for. Starting the Bridge Program was one of the best parts of my life, and I am very happy I am a part of the LaGuardia family."

I kept hearing 'no' because I did not have my high school diploma," says Vinod Dowlani, a native of India. "This was the main reason I restarted my education: to have a better future."

Currently enrolled at LaGuardia as a Business Administration major, the 2013 Bridge to Business graduate, who is working and attending school full time, noted that the writing and math skills he developed in the program have been very useful in his college studies. After earning his Associates Degree, Vinod plans to obtain a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration and hopes to one day run his own company.

Experienced and skilled instructor passes on his knowledge

A computer instructor at LaGuardia since 1996, Mr. Marchione currently teaches Introduction to Computer Technology and the Computer Service Technician Certificate Program, which, he explains, "teaches students the complete workings of a PC as well as the Windows Operating System and other computer/network related topics." In his most recent position as a Network Administrator for the State of New York Mortgage Agency, he was responsible for setting up a computer network and individual workstations for 250 employees. This included establishing file and print servers; implementing security procedures; providing Internet access for the entire agency; and working with mobile devices and the network.

ASL-English Interpretation Program

The American Sign Language (ASL)–English Interpretation Program is a rigorous 2–year academic curriculum that incorporates national interpreter education standards recommended by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education (CCIE). You can earn a BA degree or Professional Certificate in ASL–English Interpretation. This is a highly selective program. Applications are accepted once a year in the spring, before the academic year begins in September.

The Pre–Interpreting Program is for individuals who are preparing to enter the ASL–English Interpretation Program. You must be a serious ASL student who interacts regularly in the Deaf community and has studied ASL for at least 2 years. This mini–program includes: Advanced ASL I, Advanced ASL II, and Sociology of American Deaf Communities.

For the past 20 years, Adjoa Gzifa has been a teacher, youth program director, community activist and international philanthropist. At LaGuardia, she has risen from the role of Adult Basic Education instructor for a program serving inmates at Rikers Island to director of the Summer Youth Employment

Ms. Gzifa was recently honored by the New York State Senate with the Woman of Distinction Award for her work with youth at LaGuardia as well as her service to the New York City community and abroad. Program (SYEP) to, most recently, the Director of the Workforce Education Center, which provides training and education to underserved and disadvantaged adults and youth. In Queens, she served as leader

of Community Board 12 for many years and provides regular hours of community service through various local organizations. Students will explore the themes of dictatorship, struggle with nature, the plight of natives, mestizaje, social and political unrest and alienation through the analysis of representative stories, novellas and novels. Experimental and fantastic fiction will also be considered. Students will learn about the literary movements that influenced the writers in question. Prerequisite: ENC/ENG101.

Latin American Civilizations

Students will learn to comment critically on Latin American civilization and to make significant comparisons with their own backgrounds and experiences. Prerequisite: Placement Exam.

Curriculum, you will develop vocabulary, conversational competence and grammatical knowledge through a total immersion approach that includes classroom conversation, visual language lab activities and online exercises. You will be expected to expand your interaction with the local Deaf community to enhance your linguistic skills and cultural knowledge.

Classes are offered days, evenings and weekends through the Program for Deaf Adults or in conjunction with the Education and Language Acquisition Department. High school or equivalency diploma required. If you have already started your sign language education, you are required to be pre-screened for appropriate level placement. Refund Policy

For courses under \$299

100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to second week of classes

For courses \$299 and above or more than 50 hours of instruction

100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of class hours

50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 20% of class hours

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash. Allow 2 billing cycles for credit charges to reflect refund on monthly statements. Members of the military needing to withdraw from class at short notice will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
