



SwimAmerica is a state-of-the-art, learn to swim program developed by the American Swim Coaches Association that is goal driven and technique oriented. All instructors are trained and certified by the SwimAmerica site supervisors.

SwimAmerica is taught in ten stations:

Station 1: Bubbles Station 6: Backstroke Station 2: Floats & Glides Station 7: Breaststroke Station 3: Kicking Station 8: Butterfly Station 4: Crawl Stroke Station 9: Lifetime Strokes Station 5: Freestyle Station 10: Individual Medley

SwimAmerica teaches more than just how to swim. Proper techniques are emphasized, with attention given to correct body position, movement of arms and legs, breathing and timing of the strokes. In all stations, the students will focus on safety, fitness, health and fun.

Each new student will be evaluated and placed in the station that best suits their ability. A returning student will be placed in the station they were working on at the end of the last session. The site supervisor will track each student's progress and station placement. Please remember that all students learn at a different rate.

After station ten of the SwimAmerica program, the student will be able to swim 300 yards of freestyle and be proficient in all four Olympic Strokes: butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle. They will also have the skills necessary to join the Rockwood Swim Club, one of the premier USA swim teams in the country.

Registration Policy: There is a high demand for SwimAmerica classes, so early enrollment is encouraged. Classes are filled on a first-come first-served basis. We reserve the right to limit enrollment

Refund Policy: A \$3 processing fee will be charged for all refunds. You must call and cancel at least five business days prior to the start of class to receive a refund. Refunds will be given at the end of the session if a class is cancelled. Cancellation of classes will be at the discretion of the Rockwood Community Education office. There will be no make-ups if you are unable to attend a class.





Fees and Cancellation Policy

Most Community Education programs are fee-based programs, as we are self-supporting. Fees will vary per program. Unless otherwise noted, all necessary materials and supplies are included in the registration fee. When possible, online registration is encouraged. If registering by mail, be sure to include all fees with the appropriate registration form. Checks should be made payable to the Rockwood School District.

A charge of \$25 for any returned payment will be assessed. A \$3 processing fee will be charged for all refunds for programs with a registration fee up to \$100. An additional \$3 will be added per each additional \$100 increment of registration fee. Note: Adventure Club and Early Childhood may have separate refund policies due to the nature of their work. You must call and cancel at least five business days prior to the start of the class/program to be guaranteed a refund.

Cancellation of classes/programs will be at the discretion of the Rockwood Community Education office.

Special Education Services Available in Rockwood

The Rockwood School District and the Special School District of St. Louis county are required to provide a free and appropriate public education to all students with disabilities, including those attending private/parochial schools, beginning on the child's third birthday through age 20, regardless of the child's disability. Disabilities include: learning disabilities, mental retardation, behavior disorders, emotional disturbance, speech disorders (voice, fluency or articulation), language disorders, visual impairments, hearing impairments, physical/other health impairments, multiple disabilities, autism, early childhood special education and traumatic brain injury.

The districts are required to provide parents the right to inspect and review personally identifiable information collected and used or maintained by the districts relating to their children. Parents have the right to request amendment of these records if they feel the information is inaccurate, misleading or violate the privacy of the other rights of their children. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the districts to meet the requirement of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The districts have developed a Local Compliance Plan and assurances for implementation of Special Education. This plan is available for public review during regular school hours on days school is in session at the Office of the Superintendent of Schools. The Local Compliance Plan is a written narrative which describes the district's plans for a compliance with the requirements for identifying and serving all students with disabilities. Included in this plan are the policies and procedures which the district must follow regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information. The plan also describes the assurance that services are provided in compliance with the requirement of 34 CFR 76.301 of the General Education Provision Act.

Rockwood assures that it will provide information and referral services necessary to assist the state in the implementation of early intervention services for infants and toddlers eligible for Missouri's First Steps Program.

The notice can be provided in languages such as Chinese, Spanish, Arabic and Vietnamese or any other language as may be necessary.




Interested in Renting a Rockwood Facility for an Activity or Event?

District Map




