MEDICAL CODING CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

ICD-10-CM Part One: Focus on Diagnosis * September 3, 2014 to November 10, 2014 Every Monday & Wednesday | 5 to 9pm Queensbury Campus

This is part one of a two-part series. The United States Department of Health and Human Services has mandated the replacement of the ICD-9-CM code sets that are used in hospitals and clinics today. ICD-10-CM will bring the United States into line with the rest of the world for health statistics reporting. ICD-10 is radically different from ICD-9 and all current ICD-9 code users will need to learn ICD-10. This course will teach coders and people who want to become coders to use ICD-10-CM. This course will follow chapters in the ICD-10-CM Codebook. Course price includes \$400 fee.

ICD-10-CM Part Two * November 12, 2014 to December 17, 2014 Every Monday & Wednesday | 5 to 9pm No Class Nov. 26 Queensbury Campus

Part II builds on the principles learned in Part I. Coders and students wanting to become coders need to be knowledgeable in the principles of PCS coding for hospital inpatient settings, CPT-4 coding for procedural coding in both inpatient and outpatient and finally, HCPCS coding. Certified Coders seeking ICD-10 certification will need to take only the diagnosis portion while students seeking certification will need to take the full certification exam requiring knowledge of all aspects of coding. Course price includes \$300 fee.

We'll also cover cell anatomy and physiology because all life processes are ultimately carried out at the cellular level. BUSINESS & CAREER TRAINING

HUMAN ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY II

Online course at your own pace: for the ICD-10 prerequisite

In this course, we'll cover some more advanced topics that we didn't have time for in Human Anatomy and Physiology I. We'll start with basic histology—the study of the different tissues in the body. You'll learn about the structure and function of epithelial, connective, nervous, and muscular tissue. You'll come to understand the different sub-types of these tissues, where they're located, and the special jobs they perform.

NEW YORK REAL ESTATE PRE-LICENSING COURSE

This course is approved by the NY State Department of State, Division of Licensing Services, as the 75-hour educational prerequisite to sit for the NY State Real Estate Salesperson's licensing examination. In order to be a licensed NYS Real Estate Salesperson, you must be at least 18 years of age; have no prior felony convictions; successfully complete a NYS approved, 75hour Real Estate Salesperson course; pass the NYS Salesperson Licensing Exam; obtain sponsorship by a NYS Licensed Broker, and pay a licensing fee of \$50 for two years.

SMALL BUSINESS NETWORK SECURITY 101

October 6, 2014 to October 24, 2014

Technology has changed the way we live, work, and communicate. We've become connected globally, giving us access to people, places, and business opportunities that never existed in our off-line realm. As small businesses, we've opened ourselves up to the security risks of the open Internet. More breaches are started by targeting an individual within a business, not an enterprise. HUMAN RESOURCE CERTIFICATION **COURSE FOR HR PRACTITIONERS**

September 24, 2014 to December 10, 2014 Every Wednesday | 6 to 9:15pm

One additional class Monday, Dec. 8 & No class Nov. 26 Queensbury Campus

Offered in partnership with The College of Saint Rose and utilizing the Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) Learning System this course will provide Human Resource (HR) practitioners with the body of knowledge to prepare for the December/January test window for Professional in Human Resources (PHR) and Senior Professional in Human Resources (SPHR) certification exams. Certified professionals can experience advanced career growth and improved marketability.

SPHR test eligibility includes: four years of demonstrated professional HR experience with a Master's degree or higher or five years of demonstrated professional HR experience with a bachelor's degree or seven years of demonstrated professional HR experience with less than a Bachelor's degree. This Instructor-led course by a SHRM-affiliated instructor will provide comprehensive preparation using the learning system.

This intensive 12-week program encompasses the functional areas of HR management, including:

BASIC OPERATIONS FOR WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS

Successful completion of a training course is required as part of the qualification process to take the New York State certification examinations. EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT) ORIGINAL & RECERTIFICATION COURSE

August 26, 2014 to January 15, 2015 Tuesdays and Thursdays | 6:30 to 9:30pm & one Saturday a month | 8am to 12pm Regional Higher Education Center, Room 143

The EMT course is about fulfilling prescribed requirements by a credentialing agency to practice the art and science of out-of-hospital medicine in conjunction with medical direction. Through the performance of patient assessments and providing basic medical care, the goal is to prevent and reduce mortality and morbidity due to illness and injury in emergency situations for out-of-hospital patients. EMTs possess the knowledge, skills and attitudes consistent with the expectations of the public and the profession. EMTs recognize that they are an essential component of the continuum of care and serve as a link for emergency patients to acquire treatment and transport to definitive hospital care.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to demonstrate competencies in the assessment of patients, handling emergencies using Basic Life Support equipment and techniques, perform CPR, control bleeding, provide non-invasive treatment of shock, stabilize or immobilize injured bones and the spine, manage environmental emergencies and emergency childbirth, and will be qualified to sit for the NYS written examination. EMTs seek to take part in lifelong professional development, peer evaluation and assume an active role in professional and community organizations.

This course will require that students complete field internships as well clinical hospital time. The instructors will assist with coordinating these. Books and additional resources are the responsibility of the student.

COMPUTER TRAINING

TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT

Pre-scheduled open enrollment computer courses are listed in semester catalogs. These offerings tend to be limited because we are finding many people are proficient in their computer knowledge and the broader need, as a community, has decreased.

Schedule-on-demand open enrollment courses are available based on community interest, throughout the year. Once we have received sufficient interest to run a particular course, it will be offered based on the demand.

These courses are typically 4 hours, Monday through Thursday, 6-9pm time frame and cost approximately \$79-\$99 (inclusive of book fees).

ONLINE TRAINING

Online computer instruction is available for those who prefer a flexible learning schedule. We offer a variety of computer instruction courses via: www.ed2go.com/Adirondack.

These courses typically last six weeks and cost approximately \$129.

ONE-ON-ONE TRAINING

Customized one-on-one training is available for those individuals and professionals needing immediate, focused training.

One or two people may be trained; instruction is typically 2-3 hours, at \$100/hour.

SMALL & LARGE GROUP TRAINING

Customized group training is available for employers or agencies seeking staff development. Employers can specify the instruction needed.

Small group training involves three-five staff members; length of instruction is variable, at \$150/hour. Large group training is six staff or more; rates are based on group size and length of instruction. Customized manuals are also available as a training aid.
