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ONLINE COURSE INFORMATION^{*}

Online and hybrid classes (face-to-face classes with an online component) offered through the Office of Continuing Education use the Angel course management system.

To be successful with these courses, students should have basic computer skills and a familiarity with using the internet. Some courses require regular logins and others are self-paced. Either type allows students more flexibility to complete the course materials at times and places where it is convenient for them. The course description will indicate which type of online course it is.

When registering for a course with an online component, you will need to supply your email address and date of birth upon registration. These are key to ensuring you receive your login credentials to access your course.

WEB ENHANCED

Hybrid classes (face-to-face classes with an online component) offered through the Office of Continuing Education use the Angel course management system.

FULLY ONLINE

These classes are taught online using the Angel course management system and are either self-paced, offering the student flexibility to move through the course material at their convenience, or instructor-led, with a course schedule and regular instructor feedback. The course description will specify whether a course is self-paced or instructor-led.



The Office of Continuing Education provides a wealth of online workforce development and personal enrichment courses via ed2go.com/Adirondack. Students may take individual courses or enroll in a career training certificate program.

Individual courses are instructor-led with monthly start dates in a convenient six-week format. In an interactive learning environment, students are awarded completion of the course upon earning a passing score.

Non-credit online certificate programs will help you prepare for industry certification, start a new career or develop new skills. These programs allow a student to start any time and generally complete within six months.

With in-depth study, personal instructor assistance and all learning materials provided, students earn a certificate of completion upon earning a passing score.

COMPUTER COURSE INTRO TO GRAPHIC DESIGN WITH PHOTOSHOP

September 12 to December 19

Online course at your own pace 🧀

Photoshop is powerful image-editing software that allows users to use their creativity to alter photos. Learn the fundamentals needed to create high-quality digital images. These skills can be used to scan and clean up old photos and enhance digital photos. This class will introduce new Photoshop users to the program, how it works and what it can do, as well as give students a solid foundation in the theory and terminology of digital design.

The course is composed of PowerPoint presentations, video lectures, key skills handouts, quizzes to test knowledge and discussion boards where questions about Photoshop and design can be addressed and discussed with fellow students and the instructor. Although these are self-paced lessons, the instructor is still available via discussion board and email to answer questions. Photoshop CS4, CS5, CS6 and CC can be used with this course. A free, 30-day trial of Photoshop is available online. **Please read the information about online courses on page 2 before enrolling in this course.**

Work at your own pace — you can register for this class any time during the semester and have until December 19 to complete it.

COMPUTER TRAINING COURSES

The Office of Continuing Education offers computer training for companies and individuals. Courses may be offered in a traditional classroom environment, as one-on-one training, or as group training customized to serve our local businesses.

TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT

Schedule-on-demand courses are available based on community interest, throughout the year. Once we have received sufficient interest to run a particular course, it will be offered based on the demand.



ONE-ON-ONE TRAINING

Customized one-on-one training is available for those individuals and professionals needing immediate, focused training. One or two people may be trained; instruction is typically 2-3 hours, at \$100/hour.

SMALL & LARGE GROUP TRAINING

Customized group training is available for employers or agencies seeking staff development. Employers can specify the instruction needed.

Small group training involves 3-5 staff members; length of instruction is variable, at \$150/hour. Large group training is six staff or more; rates are based on group size and length of instruction. Customized manuals are also available as a training aid.

PYRAMID MODEL TRAINING NEW!

For childcare providers and early childhood educators

The Pyramid Model — also referred to as the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFEL) — is a conceptual framework for evidence-based practices for promoting young children's social and emotional competence and for preventing and addressing challenging behavior. This opportunity for professional development includes extensive resources to help New York's child care programs and providers implement the model.

The infant & toddler modules are designed for supervisors, trainers, teachers, home visitors and caregivers who work with children birth to 3 years of age. The preschool and early childhood modules are appropriate for supervisors, trainers, administrators, teachers and caregivers who work with children from 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 years of age.

NYS OCFS topic areas addressed in these modules include Principles of Childhood Development and Child Care Program Development. NYSED Core Body of Knowledge content addressed includes Child Growth and Development and Environment and Curriculum.

Each module includes three, 3-hour sessions. Participants must attend all three sessions of a module to earn the 9 hours of professional development and to receive a certificate of completion for that module from the NY Master Cadre trainer and New York Works for Children.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION IN THE WORKPLACE NEW!

October 20 to November 3 *Thursday* | 8 to 10:30am

This three-session course will introduce the essential skills used by mediators to bring people in opposition to mutual understanding and resolution. The process of mediation in contrast with other dispute-resolution processes, values and conflict styles will be explored. Participants will gain valuable skill sets that are highly effective in helping people communicate well and work through challenging situations. Skills relating to listening, empathizing, reframing and problem-solving are relevant for anyone wishing to effectively assist others to maintain relationships while working through conflict — both professionally and personally. Participants will walk away with practical skills they can put to immediate use.

Mediation Matters is a Community Dispute Resolution Center providing mediation, training, facilitation, and conflict resolution services serving Warren, Washington, Saratoga, Schenectady, Albany, and Rensselaer Counties, and has been funded in part by the New York State Office of Court Administration since 1981. This multi-faceted organization of professionals is dedicated to encouraging a culture of peace by empowering people to manage and resolve conflict in a constructive way, providing effective skills and processes, and increasing the capability for non-adversarial and self-determined problem solving within the community. **Instructor:** Sarah Rudgers Tysz, Esq., Meditation Matters

What is meditation? Mediation is a voluntary and confidential way to have a conversation about a dispute with a trained and impartial mediator. The mediator helps each party discuss their interests and explore mutually acceptable solutions while individuals make all decisions about the outcome.

BASIC OPERATIONS FOR WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS

September 6 to November 10 *Tuesdays & Thursdays | 6 to 9pm*

Participants in this 20-session course will experience a broad introduction and overview of wastewater treatment operations, excluding activated sludge (a separate course typically offered in the spring). Successful completion of a training course is required as part of the qualification process to take the New York State certification examinations. This is not intended to be an exam review course, and completing it cannot ensure successful completion of the certification exams.

This course's outline will follow the New York State DEC's "Curricula Guide for WWTP Operator Certification Training – Basic Operations Course," and is also approved for credit toward recertification of a wastewater operator license.

SERVSAFE FOOD SAFETY CERTIFICATION WORKSHOP

New York State legislation (SO2328) mandates that all food service establishments which handle, cook, store, serve, deliver, remove and dispose of food are required to have one ServSafe certified individual on staff. This comprehensive workshop is offered to the area's hospitality and food service industries in compliance with this law. Individuals who successfully complete the 10-hour program will earn their ServSafe certification, which is valid for 5 years.

BARTENDING & MIXOLOGY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Interested in starting a career working with animals but don't know where to get started? This course will help you explore the field of animal-related careers through education and internships. The Pet Education Certificate course offers a variety of resources to help begin or advance your career working with animals in areas such as pet-sitting, kennel work, daycare, training, working for a veterinarian and other animal-related fields.

The course content includes: pet health and illness, communication, behavior management, safety, basic hygiene care for pets and even writing a resume and preparing for an interview. Internships offer opportunities for students to network for experience and employment. The instructor will assist you in securing the necessary internships to complete the certificate.

In order to successfully complete this program, students must complete a pet First Aid/CPR class and must complete at least 54 hours of internships at approved animal care facilities within six months of the course completion.

This Spring 2017 semester, learn about the nation of Ecuador, then see it for yourself from the mountains to the Amazon. This multidisciplinary program will cover a broad range of academic subjects including anthropology and archaeology (learning about the indigenous peoples of the Andes and the Amazon), Andean and Amazonian art, biodiversity, political science and economics, various aspects of indigenous industry including textile weaving and leather shops, the exportation and marketing of these products as well as ecotourism and sustainability in the region.

The class will visit indigenous markets and stay in jungle lodges and haciendas. COURSE PAYMENT Payment is due upon registration, as follows:

COURSE DROP/REFUND POLICY
