Choosing an ECFE Class...

Join in the fun! **Farmington ECFE!**

ECFE - A place for families to grow together and learn together.

What ECFE class is best for you?

Choosing an ECFE class to attend with your child is easy. Aside from our Drop In classes and Special Events, all of our affordable ECFE classes meet once a week for 5 to 10 weeks. There are day and evening options for all preschool age groups, and many classes have sibling care for preschool siblings. Our classes fall into four categories: non-separating, gradual separating, separating, and parent online classes. Check out our classes through page 13 to see what classes work for you. Note the category of each class in the description.

To determine class fee, see **Fee Scale** on page 23. Turn to page 4 to see the format of a typical class.



Non-separating classes:

- Parents and children stay together in the classroom for the entire duration of the class.
- Parents remain in the same room with children and interact with them in varied learning and play activities.
- A licensed Parent Educator leads discussion on topics such as child growth and development, transition to parenthood, and how children learn and play.
- Discussion, sharing, and support take place within sight and sound of playing children. Sibling care is available for preschool siblings.

Parenting online classes:

Online classes are offered in 5 to 6 week sessions. An ECFE Parent Educator will guide participants through the book or topic, using online tools for discussion and interaction. The discussion will take place over the course of several days. Access is available any time of day or night to fit your schedule. Registration is required; every person who signs up will be granted access to the website through their email address. CEU's are available with participation.

Gradual separating classes:

- Parents and children follow the same format as listed in separating classes, except that parents start out meeting in the same room with the children and then move to a separate room several weeks into the session.
- Separate meetings begin with only short periods of time away from the children.
- Gradually, the periods are lengthened as children adjust to the separation. Babies under 6 months of age are welcome to come to class with parents. Sibling care is available for preschool siblings.

Sibling care:

Sibling Care (if needed) is available on a Sliding Fee scale for children from birth through Pre K 5's who are not involved in class. Starting at 6 months of age, siblings need to go to sibling care. Newborns and young babies are welcome to come to class with parents.

Separating classes:

- Parents and children interact and explore activities together for about half of class time. This provides an opportunity to share, learn new ideas, games, songs and activities that can be used at home.
- Following interaction time, parents meet in a separate classroom with a licensed Parent Educator for discussion of topics related to child development and parenting. They share ideas, information and experiences with one another, gaining knowledge and encouragement.
- While parents meet with a licensed Parent Educator, children participate in age-appropriate activities with a licensed Early Childhood teacher and teaching assistant. Children are provided experiences which encourage social, emotional, physical and cognitive development. Nervous about the age span in this class? No worries! There are enough staff to assure that all children are safely engaged.

ECFE Classes...

Typical ECFE Class

Has Three Segments and Sibling Care

ECFE provides quality learning opportunities and resources for parents and their preschool children.

Parent-Child Together Time – Time in the children's classroom for parents and children to play and learn together. Most classes will have an entrance and exit period of time, so you and your child will not feel rushed.

Parent Discussion Time – Parents in separation classes will move to another room to discuss parenting topics with other parents and a licensed Parent Educator. The amount of time separated will vary by class.

Child to Child Time – Children will have time to play with peers and enjoy activities prepared by a licensed Early Childhood teacher.

Sibling Care – Childcare is offered to siblings of class participants birth to Pre-kindergarten 5.

- Must be willing to give advice and support to the ECFE, School Readiness, Stepping Stones, and Wee Tigers Staff



Looking for Classes for your Preschooler? – Does the price of preschool seem unreachable? Are you concerned that your child might be behind and not ready for Kindergarten? Call our office to see if your child would qualify for the Time for Kids Early Childhood Program. This program has licensed teachers trained to help your child be prepared for Kindergarten. There are several levels of scholarships to help you provide a preschool experience for your child. Call (651) 460-3205 to see if you qualify.

Daycare Provider Resource Program! – Daycare providers, looking for new ideas? Supplement your daily curriculum with additional projects, stories and group time. Get ideas in providing a well rounded menu of activities to implement daily with your children.

An Early Childhood Educator will come to your site or home to lead a 30 minute long preschool session with your daycare children concentrating on 2-5 year-olds. Each visit you will receive a certificate indicating 1 hour CEU credit. All visits will include a pre-visit phone call and follow up questionnaire. Lesson plans for daycare providers, handouts for parents, material for projects, books and other literacy material, movement and circle time ideas will also be provided. The visit will give you, as a daycare provider, a chance to interact with the children in a whole new way!

This program is available to Farmington School District #192 residents and daycare providers.

Things You Should Know...



The Farmington School Board and district leadership spent the past several months reviewing district finances, facilities maintenance needs, community surveys and funding options before unanimously deciding to put two school funding questions on the November 3 ballot:

- **Question 1** is an operating levy increase to lower class sizes and maintain educational programs.
- Question 2 is a bond for school safety and security improvements, deferred maintenance districtwide, and additional Kindergarten classrooms in all elementary schools.

Question 1: Operating Levy Increase

Approval of Question 1 would provide an additional \$433 per pupil to:

- Lower class sizes
- Maintain educational programs
- Maximize state aid, thus lessening the burden on local property taxes

If Voters Do Not Approve Q1:

The board has determined that the district will no longer be able to fund elementary band or Kindergarten aides and it will be necessary to increase the average class sizes in grades 1-12 by eliminating teachers and academic programs.

Question 2: Building Bonds

Approval of Question 2 would provide \$45,320,000 in bond funds to:

- Improve safety and security systems at all schools
- Address deferred maintenance needs districtwide, including repairs to roofs, heating/cooling systems, outdoor facilities, and parking lots
- Add Kindergarten classrooms at all elementary schools

If Voters Do Not Approve Q2:

The board has determined that the district will need to take money from the operating fund to complete the necessary projects, addressing health and safety concerns first. This will result in increasing class sizes by eliminating teachers and programs, and not adding any Kindergarten classrooms.

Wee Tigers

Ages 3-5 years

Discovering the Fun in Learning

Half day, Part week, September through May

The Wee Tigers Program offers each child a positive learning environment, and prepares the child for Kindergarten entrance. Play-based learning centers for math, science, dramatic play, music, and creative art provide opportunities to balance and stimulate both shared and independent learning experiences. This full day option is open 6 am – 6 pm. Children enrolled in Stepping Stones have the option to attend Wee Tigers one, two, three, four or five days per week (depending on the child's age) or Stepping Stones only.

Time for Kids grants children and their parents two opportunities for learning. Time for Kids offers a two- day a week "children only" Early Childhood class. The children will participate in age appropriate preschool activities. Time for Kids is a collaboration with the Early Childhood Special Education progam. These classes give typically developing children an opportunity to learn to play with their peers who have special needs. Family Events are scheduled several times throughout the school year. These events offer a time for parents and children to play together and a session for parents to get valuable information about their child. Parents are encouraged to attend all of the Family Events for each session. The Family Events are included in the class fees.

Screening

Calling all 3 Year Olds! It's time for Screening!

Early Childhood Screening

Children eligible for kindergarten in 2016, 2017 and 2018 will be screened during the 2015-2016 school year.

Early Childhood Screening is a simple and careful check of the health and development of your child, provided at no cost to parents. Your child must be between the ages of 3 to 5 years to be screened.

Screening at this early age will confirm that a child is progressing normally or will pick up hidden delays that would benefit from early intervention. Screenings are held monthly during the school year.

Who Needs to be Screened?

All children living in District 192 who are 3, 4, or 5 years of age and not currently enrolled in kindergarten need to participate in the free screening program before entering kindergarten. Age three is the recommended age for screening.

Children who attend Head Start or Early Childhood Special Education programs may not have to participate in Early Childhood Screening. Please check with your child's teacher.

When should my child be screened?

Childhood Screening should be done sometime between your child's 3rd and 4th birthday.

Where can I find the forms?

You may print the screening forms by going to the Early Childhood Screening website www.farmingtonScreening.com



Is the program required?

Screening is not an IQ test or a kindergarten entrance test, although it is required by state law for children to participate, before starting kindergarten in a public school. (Children are not permitted to enter public school without having Early Childhood Screening and up-to-date immunizations.)

If you are planning to send your child to private or home school the screening is not required by law. However we still encourage you to participate.

What should I expect at Screening?

The parent attends the entire screening process with their child along with a team of specialists.

A review of your child's height, weight, vision, and hearing will be conducted. Then your child will have a developmental progress review.

The parent/s will then participate in a family factors and immunization interview to review the screening process and talk about any questions or concerns.

Early Childhood Screening includes:

- Immunization records
- Hearing and vision
- Speech and developmental screening
- Height and weight
- Summary interview with parents


