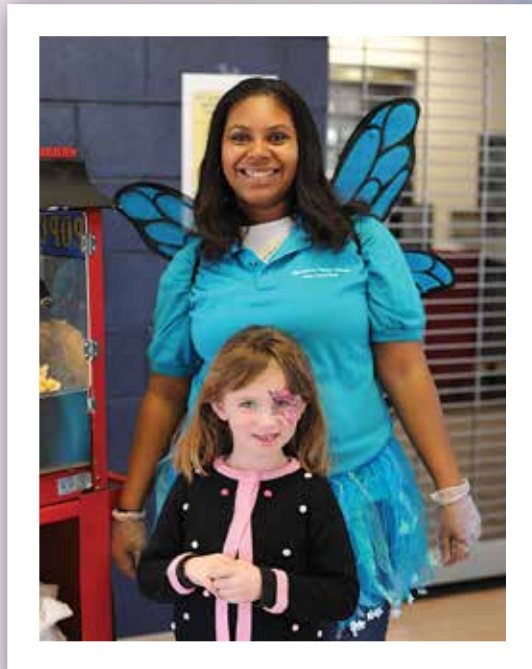

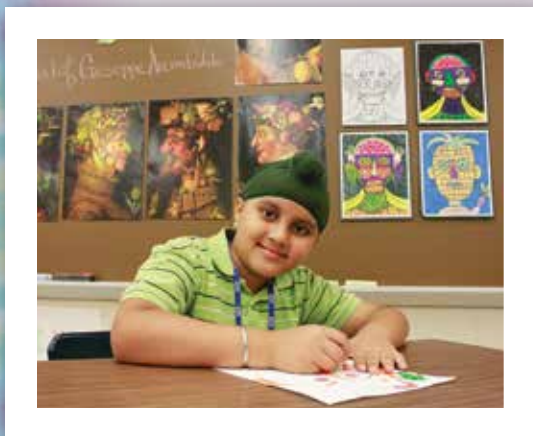

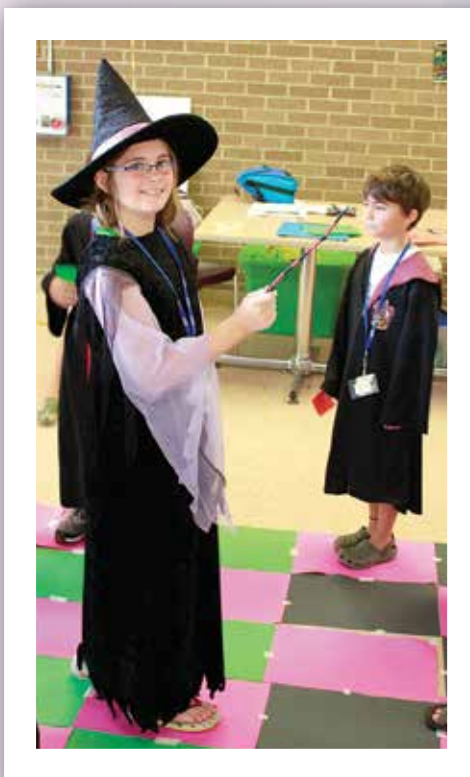
## Clay Creations — Open Studio

## One-Week Camps:

### Junior Vet Camp

Campers will learn all about how to care for animals, administer first aid and recognize when an animal might need a vet. Campers will meet real veterinarians and animal handlers who will show them what to look for in a routine check-up, how to take a pet's temperature and how to administer prescribed medication. Campers will learn suture techniques, conduct simulated lab tests used to diagnose diseases and make pet treats.

## Sign In & Sign Out

Each camper must have an authorization to pick-up and drop-off form on file. All parents, guardians or authorized persons must present a photo ID at the time of pick-up. No child(ren) will be released without proper identification being presented by an adult. Sign-in/Sign-out is mandatory each day. Any child who is not signed in by a parent/guardian will forfeit participating in that day's activities. No child will be released without a signature.

## Camp Sessions
