Clinical and Field Work

some degree and certificate programs offered by the college require students to obtain clinical or other field experience as part of their course work. Students with criminal convictions or drug use may have difficulty progressing in these programs. Hospitals and facilities may mandate that a criminal background check and/or drug screening check (at the student's expense) be conducted prior to placement in a clinical or field setting. Students not passing these checks may be prohibited from participating in the clinical or field experience thus rendering the student ineligible to satisfactorily meet the course/program requirements.



Nurse Assistant Training for Nursing Homes

The nurse assistant training program is for individuals interested in working in long-term care or a skilled nursing facility.

Our comprehensive training program, which meets requirements of the Missouri Omnibus Nursing Act, can significantly improve the lives of the individuals who complete it by giving them a competitive advantage.

The course exceeds the required 75 hours of classroom instruction and 100 hours of supervised on-the-job training.

Class meets twice a week for 20 sessions; each four hours in length. The 104 hours of on-the-job training are in addition to the scheduled class time. The on-the-job training hours are either an 8 hour day shift or evening shift.

Students must register in person only at the Forest Park campus. Course content includes:

- Training in basic nursing skills
- Fire safety
- Disaster training
- Nursing home resident safety and rights
- Social and psychological problems of nursing home • Special procedures residents
- Elimination
- Food service
- Personal care
- Restorative nursing

- Infection control
- Methods of caring for mentally confused residents such as those with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders

Upon successful completion of the course, the student is eligible to take the state examination. A strict attendance policy is enforced throughout this training. Students must be 18 years of age.

To enroll in this state approved training program; the student must be employable in a skilled nursing facility or intermediate care facility in direct resident care.

Intermediate proficiency in English or higher is recommended.

Prerequisite - Original copy of Family Care Safety Registry worker registration letter from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services required at time of registration. This letter cannot be older than six months when registering for the training. Registration should be obtained online at www.health.mo.gov/safety/fcsr/.

Course Expenses

General expenses include the course fee, textbook, state exam fee and certification fee (both due at the time of examination).

Additional expenses that may be incurred include, but are not limited to the cost of the required criminal background check and drug screening, health examination (required), immunizations (required to be current and documented), PPD (Two Step), Hepatitis B series or signed waiver, a uniform/scrub/shoes for the required on-the-job training, a watch with a second hand, a gait belt and class room supplies including state required education material.

Overall expenses with everything included can cost up to \$1500.00 per student.





Central Sterile Processing Technician

Certification

This training offers the student a direct pathway to success in Central Sterile Processing. Whether starting a career in Central Sterile Processing or already working in the field, this program will help you establish a foundation in:

- Central service workflow and concerns
- Basic job knowledge and skills
- Basic job responsibilities

Topics presented in the program include anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, infection prevention and control, tools for cleaning, safety and decontamination. This program will prepare successful students to take a national certification exam, as well as for entry-level employment as a Central Sterile Processing Technician. A strict attendance policy is enforced throughout this training.

Students must register in person only at the Forest Park campus.

Program Requirements

Tier 1:

- This class is for the individual working in the field of Central Sterile Processing who only needs the online and workshop instruction.
- Hybrid/flip instructor-led training

Tier 2:

- This class is for the individual entering the field of Central Sterile Processing who needs both instruction and externship.
- 400 hours of externship

Prerequisites required at time of registration:

Tier 1

- Student must be at least 18 years of age
- High school diploma or a High School Equivalency Certificate
- Achieves a minimum score of 8.9 on Vocabulary and Comprehension tests and a minimum score of 7.0 Mathematics Concepts and Application on the Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE).

Tier 2

- All of Tier 1 prerequisites
- Family Care Safety Registry-Worker Registration letter. The letter cannot be older than 6 months. You must bring the letter from DHSS not proof of payment. Register online at http://health.mo.gov/safety/fcsr/

Students enrolled in Tier 2 must complete the following requirements:

- Criminal background check and 5-panel drug screen
- Physical exam/immunizations/Two-step PPD/Hepatitis B immunization series or signed waiver
- AHA BLS Healthcare Provider CPR certification

Pharmacy Technician 300 Training Program

Pharmacy Technicians are entry-level personnel who work in many different pharmacy settings within the healthcare industry. They assist the pharmacist to enter patient data and information into the computer system to process prescriptions.

This hybrid/flip instructor-led training prepares the student for entry-level employment as a pharmacy technician. Students will learn about the top medications dispensed in the United States and be introduced to the basic concepts of pharmacy calculations for proper medication dispensing. Coursework will be completed online. Students are required to attend scheduled workshops. The externship experience follows the online instruction and workshops.

The pharmacy technician program prepares the successful student for TWO national certification exams, ExCPT and PTCB.

Students must register in person only at the Forest Park campus.

Prerequisites required at time of registration:

- Student must be at least 18 years of age
- High school diploma or a High School Equivalency Certificate
- Achieves a minimum score of 8.9 on both Vocabulary and Comprehension tests and a minimum score of 7.0 Mathematics Concepts and Application on the Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE).
- Family Care Safety Registry-Worker Registration letter. The letter cannot be older than 6 months. You must bring the letter from DHSS not proof of payment. Register online at http://health.mo.gov/safety/fcsr/

Phlebotomy

This noncredit program prepares the student for entry level employment as a phlebotomist. The course provides classroom, lab instruction and clinical experience.

The course provides 48 hours of classroom and lab instruction and 100 hours of clinical experience which is in addition to scheduled class time.

Strict attendance policy enforced throughout this training.

Students must register in person only at the Forest Park campus.

Course content includes:

- Basic anatomy pertinent to blood collection
- Communication skills
- Specimen processing
- Related interdisciplinary tasks
- Lab experience of blood drawing techniques
- Practical experience of blood drawing techniques in the clinical setting.

Upon successful completion of the course, the student is eligible to take the American Society of Clinical Pathology (ASCP) certification examination. Cost of certification is the sole responsibility of the student.

Prerequisites required at time of registration:

- Student must be 18 years of age
- High school diploma or a High School Equivalency Certificate
- Achieves a minimum score of 8.9 on Vocabulary and Comprehension tests and a minimum score of 7.0 on Mathematics Concepts and Application on the Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE).
- Family Care Safety Registry-Worker Registration letter. The letter cannot be older than 6 months. You must bring the letter from DHSS not proof of payment. Register online at http://health.mo.gov/safety/fcsr/

- American Databank criminal background check and 5 panel drug screen

Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE Test)

Phlebotomy, Pharmacy Technician and Central Sterile Processing Technician

- Register for the TABE Test at the Forest Park campus at the Office of Continuing Education, Student Center, 125.
- The test fee is \$11.00. After registering, pay the fee at the Forest Park Cashier's Office.
- The paid receipt from the Cashier is required to take the TABE Test.
- The TABE Test is taken in the Assessment Center G 229. The test may be taken Monday through Thursday, 12 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. and Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. (The college is closed on national holidays and during the week between Christmas and New Year's Day.)
- Please allow a minimum of one hour to take the test.
- Results of the TABE Test **will not be immediately available**. Generally within one week the student will receive a letter regarding their scores.

The student **must** achieve the following minimum scores to register for class:

- 8.9 Vocabulary and Comprehension tests
- 7.0 Mathematics Concepts and Application tests

If the student does not achieve the minimum scores on the TABE Test, they can retake the entire test one more time during the current semester. They must wait one week before retaking the test during which time, it is suggested that they review math skills and/or vocabulary.

The student must register and pay (\$11.00) for the TABE Test Retest (follow registration process described above).

If the student does not achieve the minimum scores on the retest, it is strongly recommended that they take an Adult Basic Education class, or if appropriate, an ELL class before taking the TABE Test the next semester. The student can only take the TABE Test one time with one opportunity to retest per semester.

Family Care Safety Registry-Worker Registration letter cannot be older than 6 months. You must bring the original letter from DHSS not the proof of payment. The student is responsible for the cost.

Fee to register online is \$13 plus a \$1.25 processing fee.

Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen

Phlebotomy, Pharmacy Technician, Nurse Assistant for Nursing Homes and Central Sterile Processing Technician

Students will receive directions to complete the Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen when registering for the training. The student is responsible for these costs.

Physical exam/immunizations/Two-step PPD/Hepatitis B immunization series or signed waiver

Phlebotomy, Pharmacy Technician, Nurse Assistant for Nursing Homes and Central Sterile Processing Technician

The student will be given the physical exam/immunizations form when registering for the training. The student is responsible for the cost.

AHA BLS for Healthcare Provider CPR - Phlebotomy, Pharmacy Technician and Central Sterile Processing Technician

Numerous AHA BLS Healthcare Provider CPR classes are offered through Continuing Education.

The class fee is \$75. The student is responsible for the cost.



Training Center

The American Heart Association Training Center at St. Louis Community College offers both open enrollment classes for individuals and customized training for groups and businesses in Life Saving, CPR, and First Aid.

Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers

This American Heart Association course is designed for the healthcare provider. Each participant must obtain an 84 percent or higher on the written evaluation and demonstrate proficiency in all CPR skills. Skills include adult, child and infant CPR, FBAO management of the conscious victim, adult/infant/child two rescuer CPR, mouth-to-mask ventilation and automatic external defibrillation (AED). Written and practical skills (hands-on manikin simulation) evaluation and testing are required for course completion. Students who enroll at least one week in advance and successfully complete the course will receive BLS completion card at the end of the class. No transfers between sessions or refunds given within five business days of class date. Due to the nature of the course, you must arrive on time. No admittance after stated start time. No refund for lat arrival. This course meets the STLCC nursing department admission requirements. Estimated time: 5 hours

Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers Online

This course is an option for healthcare professionals seeking an alternative to BLS classroom-based training for first-time or renewal certification. Part 1 is a series of online modules covering the required adult, child and infant CPR AED sequences. Part 2 is a hands-on skills session and Part 3 is a hands-on skills test. Parts 2 and 3 must be completed with an authorized American Heart Association Instructor. Upon successful completion participant will receive a BLS for Healthcare Providers course completion card.

Estimated time: Part 1 – Self-paced learning available at OnlineAHA.org Parts 2 & 3 - Varies





Heartsaver CPR AED

This course is designed for anyone with limited or no medical training who needs a course completion card in CPR AED to meet job, regulatory or other requirements. Skills include adult CPR AED (with a mask) and adult choking. Optional modules include: child CPR AED, child choking, infant CPR and infant choking. Modular format creates course flexibility. An optional written test is available for instructors to administer to students whose employers require completion of a written test. Practical skills (hands-on manikin simulation) evaluation and testing are required for course completion. Upon successful completion participant will receive a Heartsaver CPR AED course completion card.

Estimated time: 2-3.5 hours

Heartsaver First Aid

This course is designed for anyone with limited or no medical training who needs a course completion card in First Aid to meet job, regulatory or other requirements. Skills include first aid basics, medical emergencies, injury emergencies, and environmental emergencies. Modular format allows for course flexibility. An optional written test is available for instructors to administer to students whose employers require completion of a written test. Skills practice and testing are required for course completion. Upon successful completion participant will receive a Heartsaver First Aid course completion card. Estimated time: 3 hours

Heartsaver Pediatric First Aid CPR/AED

The Heartsaver Pediatric First Aid CPR AED course teaches lay rescuers to respond to and manage illnesses and injuries in a child or infant in the first few minutes until professional help arrives. It covers the four steps of first aid and first aid skills such as finding the problem, stopping bleeding, bandaging, using an epinephrine pen, as well as child CPR AED, infant CPR and optional modules in adult CPR AED, child mask, infant mask and Asthma Care Training for Child Care Providers. Registration one week prior to course start date is required. No transfers between sessions or refunds given within five business days of class date. Due to the nature of the course, you must arrive on time. No admittance after stated start time. No refund for late arrival. Bring a sack lunch. Child Care Providers MUST NOT Register for this course. Child Care Providers Needing Approved Clock Hours MUST enroll in the Specialized Child Care Provider Course CCPR 711.

Estimated time: 7 hours



Heartsaver First Aid CPR AED

Heartsaver First Aid CPR/AED is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical service (EMS) arrives. It is designed to meet OSHA requirements. Students learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies. This course also teaches adult CPR and AED use. Written and practical skills (hands-on-manikin simulation) evaluation and testing are required for course completion. Upon successful completion, each participant will receive a course completion card. Registration one week prior to course start date is recommended. Due to the nature of the course, you must arrive on time. No refund for late arrival. Estimated time: 7 hours

Family & Friends CPR

This course is designed for anyone who wants to learn CPR in an instructor-led or facilitated group environment and does not need a course completion card for a job or other requirement.

Workplace CPR Training

Students Rights and Responsibilities

Postponement/Cancellation Due to Inclement Weather

Occasionally, continuing education classes are cancelled due to inclement weather. Cancellations will be broadcast on KMOX-AM (1120) and on KMOV-TV, KSDK-TV and KTVI/Fox 2. In addition, all location closings will be posted on the college website, stlcc. edu. When St. Louis Community College cancels classes, off-campus classes are also cancelled. In addition, when a particular host school district or institution closes, the continuing education classes at that location will not meet.

Refund of Fees

Since continuing education (non-credit) classes are self-supporting, the decision to run a class is based on the number of people enrolled. The college reserves the right to cancel if sufficient enrollment is not achieved. Registrants will be notified by phone, mail or email if a class is cancelled. Full refunds will be issued for classes cancelled by the college.

If you drop a class, you will receive a 100 percent refund for most classes if the class is dropped one business day before the first meeting. A 50 percent refund will be given for most classes dropped between one business day before the first class meeting and prior to the second meeting of the class. See the course schedule for classes (such as daytrips) that require notice beyond one business day for cancellation and eligibility for a refund.

Requests of withdrawals should be submitted in writing to the Continuing Education office. Calculation of refunds will be based on the date the written request is received by the office. If you have a situation that warrants an override of the above policy, an explanation of the circumstances should be made in writing to the Continuing Education office. Refunds should be received within 30 days.

Fee Reduction for Older Adults

Older adults (those 60 years and older) may enroll in most courses for a reduced fee. NOTE: Those wishing to take advantage of this fee reduction must do so at the time of registration. Class costs vary, so prior to registering, please contact the Continuing Education office or see the online class schedule for the total cost of the senior reduced rate.

Senior Citizen Scholarship

Missouri residents who are at least sixty-five years of age will be awarded a scholarship to be exempt from maintenance fees to enroll in courses on a space available basis. There will be a non-refundable registration fee of \$5 per course to a maximum of \$25 per semester. Student is responsible for other fees, such as materials, supplies and books. At the earliest, students may enroll in the class two days prior to the first class date. Students may not receive a refund for a paid course in order to enroll for a scholarship space in that same course. PLEASE CALL THE CONTINUING EDUCATION OFFICE TO GET SPECIFICS REGARDING THE SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP. The senior scholarship discount does not apply to online classes.

Safety and Program Guidelines for Youth Classes

All children under the age of 16 who are enrolled in programs through the St. Louis Community College Office of Continuing Education must be accompanied and signed-in by a responsible party at the beginning of each program session. In addition, a responsible party must also meet the participant at the end of the session and sign them out. Appropriate behavior is expected. Students may be disenrolled for misbehavior.

Students are not permitted to bring children to class, nor should children be left unattended in the halls, offices, library or common areas. The college reserves the right to protect the safety and welfare of unattended children. If students leave children unattended, the college will institute disciplinary action.

Textbooks

Textbooks can be purchased at the campus bookstores.

Library and Computer Lab Privileges

If you are registered in continuing education courses, you may enjoy library and computer lab privileges by showing your student ID. To obtain a student ID take your paid fee receipt to the Campus Life office and the personnel there will provide you with an ID.
