



The Hazard Communication Standard (HCS) is now aligned with the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals (GHS). This training will provide updated information on the new changes to the Hazard Communication Standard (HCS) and provides a common and coherent approach to classifying chemicals and communicating hazard information on labels and safety data sheets. Employers are required to train employees on the new label elements and SDS format by December 1, 2013, while manufacturers must be compliant in 2015, full compliance with enforcement of the final rule will begin in 2015. The three major areas of change are in hazard classification, labels, and safety data sheets. CEU: .15

■ Home Inspection Pre-Licensing Program

Prepare for the Illinois Home Inspection State Licensing Exam with this state-approved course consisting of classroom, online, and two days of in-field instruction with live home inspections. Topics include the physical components of a home, communication skills, knowledge of professional practices, and insight into what may go wrong as well as the cause and implications of problems that result. Participants will receive clear direction concerning what to look for during an inspection, such as signs of non-performance due to old age, deferred maintenance, weather damage, and poor workmanship. Our instructors are experienced licensed home inspectors and active members of the American Society of Home Inspectors [ASHI]. Upon completion of the approved pre-licensing course, applicants must pass the Home Inspection State Licensing Exam before they are eligible for a license in the State of Illinois. [Cost of exam is NOT included in the course fee.] E-mail access and an internet connection are required for this course.
