





 Pre-Licensing Home Inspection Program-Online [80 hours]

Prepare for the Illinois Home Inspection State Licensing Exam with this state-approved, self paced course. Topics include the physical components of a home, communication skills, knowledge of professional practices, insight into what may go wrong as well as the cause and implications of problems that result.

You will be building a home inspection report as you travel through the program. Each section has a quiz to confirm that you have the knowledge to proceed. These quizzes can be taken from your home. A textbook is required and included in the cost of the class. The final exam is a proctored exam.

This program meets the classroom requirements, but you are still required to complete in-field inspections, at an additional cost, in order to be allowed to sit for the state exam. You can attend a live, one-day field training class at \$200 or you can participate in five one-on-one inspections to receive private coaching. The private coaching fee varies by inspector.

Once you complete all the requirements for this program, you will be allowed to challenge the State of Illinois Home Inspector Exam.

After this, and after you mail in your application and fees, you will be a Licensed Home Inspector in the State of Illinois. Cost of the exam is NOT included. E-mail access and an internet connection are required for this course. Open enrollment, register any time.

Applying fertilizers and crop protection products is a crucial part of the agriculture retail business; and there's much more to it than jumping behind the wheel of an applicator and driving. Safety, regulations, personal networking, technology, machine calibration and maintenance all are parts of the business an Agriculture Operator needs to know. This course will help prepare the student for work in the agriculture industry. It will also go into details that the student will need to know about the job, as well as what a potential employer would want the student to know. Pharmacy Technician

Prerequisite: A high school diploma or GED plus a solid background in math.

This comprehensive 50 hour program will prepare students to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology, the history of pharmacy, the pharmacy practice in multiple environments, pharmacy calculations and measurements, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Through classroom lecture and hands on labs, students will review dosage calculations, drug classifications, the "top 200 drugs", I.V. flow rates, sterile compounding, dose conversions, aseptic technique, the handling of sterile products, total parental nutrition (TPN), dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control and billing and reimbursement. In addition to classroom lecture and labs, this program includes a clinical externship through a local pharmacy. To be eligible for the clinical externship, students must successfully complete the 50 hour program, submit to a thorough background check, drug screening and meet other requirements. Textbooks and materials are included in the course fee. Cost of the PTCB national exam is NOT included in the course fee.

This program is offered in partnership with Condensed Curriculum International, Inc. (CCI). Available to both working adults interested in a new career and current professionals, this short term training program will help you prepare for an entry level job in healthcare. It is recommended that you research the job market before registering for the program.

 Medical Billing and Coding [Online Career Training]

Medical billing and coding is one of the fastest-growing careers in the healthcare industry today! The need for professionals who understand how to code healthcare services and procedures for third-party insurance reimbursement is growing substantially. Physician practices, hospitals, pharmacies, long-term care facilities, chiropractic practices, physical therapy practices and other healthcare providers all depend on medical billing and coding for insurance carrier reimbursement. This billing and coding program delivers the skills students need to solve insurance billing and coding problems. It details proper assignment of codes and the process to file claims for reimbursement. With the transition to ICD-10, effective as of October 1, 2015, this course will also provide training in ICD-10-CM. This course covers the following key areas and topics: An overview of healthcare & insurance industry. The organization and use of the ICD-9-CM, ICD-10-CM, CPT and HCPCS manuals to identify correct codes. Detailed review and practice using the alphabetic index and tabular list of the ICD-9-CM, ICD-10-CM and practice coding examples within the CPT. Basic claims processes for medical insurance and third-party reimbursements. Completing common insurance forms, tracing delinguent claims and appealing denied claims. Textbooks and materials are included in the course fee, national exam fees are not included. Students have six months to complete the program. Course Fee: \$1,799

Trigger Point Therapy: How to locate and deal with these "Nodules"

This short class will be broken down into two sessions. In the classroom session (approximately two hours), students will learn about different types of trigger points (primary, secondary, satellite) as well as classification of trigger points (active and latent). Also discussed will be common characteristics to recognize when a trigger point is not only present, but also involved in the client's discomfort (client's description of pain, reaction when palpated and common referral patterns). Finally, several different trigger point techniques will be explained. The remaining class time (6 hours) will be spent in the lab. Included will be a review of palpation of muscles of the neck, shoulder, and arm that commonly harbor trigger points; use of the various techniques to resolve the trigger points and class will conclude with a 30 minute treatment to show how trigger point therapy can be incorporated into a massage session. *Please bring* your lunch, snacks and a clean set of sheets for the table and dress comfortably. • Food Service Sanitation [8 Hr. Class]

Applied Food Service Sanitation is designed to assist the manager or potential manager applying sanitation principles in the operation of a food service establishment. Students will learn to identify the causes of food-borne illness, identify and apply correct procedures for cleaning and sanitizing, recognize problems and potential solutions associated with facility, equipment and layout. The Illinois code related to food service establishments will be discussed. During the last session students will take the ServSafe Protection Food Manager Certification exam.

This class is required in Illinois for food service manager certification and is approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). Upon successful completion of the exam, students will submit their Food Service Sanitation Manager Certification online application, certificate of class completion and \$35 license fee payable to the IDPH. Food Service Sanitation Manager licenses are valid for five years.






