### **Healthcare Career Programs**

#### Pharmacy Technician

#### [Optional Externship Available NEW!]

This comprehensive 50 hour program will prepare students to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology, the history of pharmacy, the pharmacy practice in multiple environments, pharmacy calculations and measurements, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Through classroom lecture and hands on labs, students will review dosage calculations, drug classifications, the "top 200 drugs", I.V. flow rates, sterile compounding, dose conversions, aseptic technique, the handling of sterile products, total parental nutrition (TPN), dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control and billing and reimbursement. In addition to classroom lecture and labs, this program includes an optional clinical externship through a local pharmacy. To be eligible for the clinical externship, students must successfully complete the 50 hour program, submit to a thorough background check, drug screening and meet other requirements.



#### Exploring Careers in Healthcare Information Session

[Pharmacy Technician & Medical Billing and Coding] These programs are offered in partnership with Condensed Curriculum International, Inc. (CCI). Available to both working adults interested in a new career and current professionals, these short term training programs will help you prepare for entry level jobs in healthcare. This free information session will give prospective students information on job outlook, certification requirements and the course content for the Pharmacy Technician and Medical Billing and Coding programs as well as payment plan options. It is recommended that you check out the local job market and attend this session before registering for the programs. #### Medical Billing and Coding

This combined 80 hour billing and coding course offers the skills needed to solve insurance billing problems, how to manually file claims (using the CPT and ICD-9 manual), complete common insurance forms, trace delinguent claims, appeal denied claims and use generic forms to streamline billing procedures. The course covers the following areas: CPT (Introduction, Guidelines, Evaluation and Management), specialty fields (such as surgery, radiology and laboratory), ICD-9 (Introduction and Guidelines) and basic claims processes for medical insurance and third party reimbursements. Students will learn how to find the service and codes using manuals, (CPT, ICD-9 and HCPCS). After obtaining the practical work experience (6 months to 2 years), students who complete this course could be gualified to sit for the American Academy of Professional Coders (AAPC) Certified Professional Coder Exam (CPC or CPC-H Apprentice) American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) Certified Coding Associate (CCA) exam; and/or other National Certification Exams. Textbooks and materials are included. Cost of exams are not included in the course fee. There is no job assistance for this program.

#### Home Inspection Pre-Licensing Program [Online]

#### Open enrollment, register any time.

Prepare for the Illinois Home Inspection State Licensing Exam with this state-approved course. Once the student completes the online portion of the course, approximately 80 hours, they then schedule the five in-field inspections needed to complete the course. Topics include the physical components of a home, communication skills, knowledge of professional practices and insight into what may go wrong; as well as the cause and implications of problems that result. Participants will receive clear direction concerning what to look for during an inspection, such as signs of non-performance due to old age, deferred maintenance, weather damage and poor workmanship. The instructors are experienced licensed home inspectors and active members of the American Society of Home Inspectors [ASHI]. Upon completion of the approved pre-licensing course, applicants must pass the Home Inspection State Licensing Exam before they are eligible for a license in the State of Illinois. Cost of the exam is NOT included in the course fee. Additional fees may apply for the in-field inspections. Email access and an internet connection are required for this course.

ISO 9001:2015 Internal Auditor Training

#### Department of Transportation Hazmat

The Department of Transportation requires training for employees receiving or shipping hazardous materials. This training includes new changes to the 49 CFR hazardous materials table, packaging of materials, shipping papers and other documentation and recognizing potential hazardous conditions when receiving packages. Participants are encouraged to bring a list of products they ship or receive and samples of shipping papers. #### OSHA 30 Hour General Industry

Many standards promulgated by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) explicitly require the employer to train employees in the safety and health aspects of their jobs. Other OSHA standards make it the employer's responsibility to limit certain job assignments to employees who are "certified," "competent," or "qualified" - meaning that they have had special previous training, in or out of the workplace. The term "designated" personnel means selected or assigned by the employer or the employer's representative as being qualified to perform specific duties. These requirements reflect OSHA's belief that training is an essential part of every employer's safety and health program for protecting workers from injuries and illnesses.

This program will include in-depth training on: Introduction to OSHA Working and Walking Surfaces, Exit Routes and Emergency Action Plans Electrical, Lockout/Tagout, Personal Protective Equipment, Material Handling, Hazard Communication, Machine Guarding, Permit Required Confined Space, Powered Industrial Vehicles (forklifts), Fall Protection Recordkeeping and other selected OSHA topics to meet the site specific needs.

Participants will receive OSHA's 29 CFR 1910 Regulations manual, sample safety policies, sample procedures and training handouts to be used at their facility. OSHA's 30 Hour General Industry card will be earned upon completion of this class. Continental breakfast and lunch are included in the course fee. **CEU: 3.0**

### Food Service Sanitation

#### Food Service Sanitation [8 Hr. Class]

Applied Food Service Sanitation is designed to assist the manager or potential manager apply sanitation principles in the operation of a food service establishment. Students will learn to identify the causes of food-borne illness, identify and apply correct procedures for cleaning and sanitizing, recognize problems and potential solutions associated with facility, equipment and layout. The Illinois code related to food service establishments will be discussed. During the last session students will take the ServSafe Protection Food Manager Certification exam.

This class is required in Illinois for food service manager certification and is approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). Upon successful completion of the exam, students will submit their Food Service Sanitation Manager Certification Program Request Form and <sup>s</sup>35 fee payable to the IDPH. Food Service Sanitation Manager licenses are valid for five years.

A textbook is required for this class: ServSafe Manager, 6th Edition. The textbook is available at the IVCC Bookstore located at the main campus in Oglesby or can be purchased in advance online at www.ivccbookstore.com.



Energy Independence Through Wind Power Have you ever wondered if you could save money on electricity by installing a small wind generator at your home? Learn what wind energy is, how it works and what it can do for you.
