



Forklift Train the Trainer

RCRA/Resource Conservation & Recovery Act

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) sets forth an approach for handling the volumes of waste generated in the United States each year. Based on the authority granted by RCRA Subtitle C, the EPA developed regulations for the cradle-to-grave management of hazardous waste. Persons who produce hazardous waste are called hazardous waste generators and they must receive RCRA training. In compliance with U.S. EPA regulations, this training is for individuals who deal with or manage hazardous waste and should be provided for employees at the start of their job and on an annual basis. Many standards promulgated by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) explicitly require the employer to train employees in the safety and health aspects of their jobs. These requirements reflect OSHA's belief that training is an essential part of every employer's safety and health program for protecting workers from injuries and illnesses. This program will include in-depth training on course mandated and other selected OSHA topics to meet the site specific needs. Participants will receive OSHA's 29 CFR 1910 Regulations manual, sample safety policies, sample procedures and training handouts to be used at their facility. 

Pharmacy Technician w/Clinical Rotation [50 Hours]

Prerequisite: A high school diploma or GED plus a solid background in math. This comprehensive 50 hour program will prepare students to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology, the history of pharmacy, the pharmacy practice in multiple environments, pharmacy calculations and measurements, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Endocrine Pathophysiology It's all about "too much or too little" in the

world of endocrinology. Barb Bancroft returns to discuss the hypothalamus and it's myriad of functions - sleep, sex, temperature regulation, onset of puberty, body rhythms, appetite, satiety, sexual orientation and more. Clinical correlations include drugs and the hypothalamus (aspirin, acetaminophen, antipsychotics, steroids, diet pills, sleeping pills, gonadotropin releasing hormones) as well as disorders of the hypothalamus. The hypothalamic pituitary target organ (thyroid, adrenal gland, gonads) axis will be discussed. Disorders of the thyroid gland, adrenal gland, ovaries and testicles will be discussed using the theme - too much hormone or too little hormone. Drugs to be discussed include the various hormonal therapies for endocrine cancers, the types of glucocorticoids and their potency profile, metformin, levothyroxine, androgen and estrogen replacement therapies. ANSI Food Service Sanitation

Food Service Sanitation [8 Hr. Class]

Applied Food Service Sanitation is designed to assist the manager or potential manager applying sanitation principles in the operation of a food service establishment. Students will learn to identify the causes of food-borne illness, identify and apply correct procedures for cleaning and sanitizing, recognize problems and potential solutions associated with facility, equipment and layout. The Illinois code related to food service establishments will be discussed. Students will take the ServSafe Protection Food Manager Certification exam in class at the end of the course.

This class is required in Illinois for Certified Food Protection Manager Certification (CFPM) and is an ANSI certified course accepted by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). Upon successful completion of the exam with a passing grade, students will attain the ServSafe CFPM. Licenses are valid for five years.

Don't Forget Your Textbooks!

A textbook is required for this class: ServSafe Manager, 7th Edition. The textbook is available at the IVCC Bookstore located at the main campus in Oglesby or can be purchased in advance online at ivccbookstore.com. It is recommended that students purchase the book in advance and begin review prior to class due to the fast paced nature of the class.

Following lunch, we will take a stroll through Milwaukee's Lake Park - designed by famous landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted, where we'll see the North Point Lighthouse and the beautiful Lion Bridges. This afternoon enjoy a guided tour of the Villa Terrace Decorative Art Museum and Italian Renaissance Garden. Overlooking Lake Michigan, Villa Terrace was built by architect David Adler in 1923. The building was originally the residence of Lloyd Smith of the A.O. Smith Corporation and his family. Smith called the house Sopra Mare, which is Italian for "above the sea." Beekeeping & Solar Power

Introduction to Beekeeping

In this class, you will focus on the principles of beekeeping. These principles include the history of beekeeping, honeybee biology, plant and pollinator relationship and essential equipment and requirements. By the end of the course, you will be able to help experienced beekeepers in the management of hives and start beekeeping as a hobby. Starting in 2006 with the media coverage of Colony Collapse Disorder and the rapid decline of honeybees around the world, the number of beginning beekeepers has increased exponentially. There have been reports that the number of backvard beekeepers has increased three-fold since 2008. In response to this interest, the Midwest Master Beekeeper Program (MMBP) was developed. 




