

Participants will learn the major provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act. New and updated regulations will be discussed. Primary topics include: the inspection and citation process, working and walking surfaces, emergency plans and exit routes, material safety data sheets and labeling, electrical safety, machine guarding and record keeping. This course will focus on requirements for the control of grain dust fires, explosions and other safety hazards related to the grain handling facilities under 29 CFR1910.272. OSHA's 10 Hour General Industry card will be earned upon completion of this class. CEU: 1.0

OSHA defines a powered industrial truck as a "mobile, power propelled truck used to carry, push, lift, stack, or tier material". Manual operated pallet movers, earth moving and agricultural equipment is not covered by this regulation. The Department of Transportation requires training for employees receiving or shipping hazardous materials. Participants are encouraged to bring a list of products they ship or receive and samples of shipping papers. DOT Homeland security training is included in the course. **CEU**: .3

Online Manufacturing & Industrial Career Programs

CPT Fast Track [Certified Production Technician]

- Advance your career and sustain a lifelong, successful career in manufacturing.
- Re-enter the manufacturing workforce and achieve the skills that local employers are seeking.
 - Validate your skills with a nationally recognized credential.

Learn skills for work success! Advanced Manufacturing offers some of the highest paying and most satisfying career opportunities available today. The Manufacturing Skill Standards Council (MSSC) developed the Certified Production Technician (CPT) as the industry standard for production workers. CPT is the national certification supported by the National Association of Manufacturers.

The **Fast Track CPT** course is an accelerated version of the Certified Production Technician Certificate Program. It is recommended primarily for individuals with at least 5 years manufacturing experience or dislocated workers who have limited time available for study. It is also recommended that individuals be at a 9th grade math and 10th grade reading level.

This program is strictly online with an online instructor. Independent study requires a computer with high-speed internet access. There are four modules which are approximately 15-18 hours/module. We recommend that you take the classes in the order they are shown. They consist of:

Manufacturing and Safety

This course provides an introduction to the manufacturing world and provides specific instructions to facilitate safe work practices in industrial environments. Learn about manufacturing specializations such as mechatronics, precision machining and welding. Covers fire safety, pressurized gases, electrical hazards and safe machine usage. Cost includes the one-time registration fee, required by MSSC, and testing fee.

Course Number: CEU-5317-08

Quality and Measurement

This course provides an introduction to controlling and improving quality in a manufacturing setting. Explore ways that manufacturers use data and analysis to improve quality. Cost includes testing fee.

Course Number: CEU-5318-08

Manufacturing Processes

This course introduces the basics of how manufacturing transforms materials into products. Students will learn about the varying types of production and will learn about the materials that are used in production and the types of processes used in manufacturing including machining, casting and assembly. Cost includes testing fee Course Number: CEU-5319-08

Maintenance Awareness

This course provides a basic understanding of tools and equipment used in manufacturing and knowledge of how to improve productivity through predictive and preventive maintenance. Cost includes testing fee.

Course Number: CEU-5320-08

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Students are required to pass a final examination and will earn a certificate of completion after each module. Once all four component examinations are completed, the nationally recognized Certified Production Technician credential is awarded.

It is the student's responsibility to schedule examinations. Call the Assessment Center at least 1 week prior to the desired testing date at 815-224-0542.

Note: Prior manufacturing experience is highly recommended for success with this online program. There are two textbooks required and they apply to all four modules. Both can be purchased at the IVCC Bookstore.

Classes Begin August 18th and are open for enrollment throughout the semester.

This allows you to pick your start date and work at your own pace. Register at any time, up until November 21st!

■ Food Service Sanitation [8 Hr. Course]

Applied Food Service Sanitation is designed to assist the manager or potential manager apply sanitation principles in the operation of a food service establishment. Students will learn to identify the causes of food-borne illness, identify and apply correct procedures for cleaning and sanitizing, recognize problems and potential solutions associated with facility, equipment, and layout. The Illinois code related to food service establishments will be discussed. During the last session students will take the ServSafe Protection Food Manager Certification exam. Class attendance is required at all sessions that your class is scheduled to meet.

This class is required in Illinois for new certification and renewal of license for food service managers and is approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health [IDPH]. Food Service Sanitation Manager licenses are valid for five years.

Oak Park has an important claim to international fame - America's greatest architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, lived and worked here for many of his early formative years in design. Start with a tour of the FLW Home & Studio, the nerve center of a revolution in design of the American house. This complex of buildings was meticulously restored to its appearance in approximately 1910. Frank Lloyd Wright used his first home to experiment with design concepts that contain the seeds of his architectural philosophy. In his adjacent studio, Wright and his associates developed a new American architecture - the Prairie style. A special feature of this tour is a visit to the Studio Balcony, now open to the public for the first time. Next, take a guided walk led by Bill Hinchliff, through the neighborhood adjacent to the home and studio to see a number of Prairie School homes by Wright, as well as the more traditional Victorians that also call this neighborhood "home". After lunch at Café Winberie in downtown Oak Park we will continue our afternoon with a tour of Unity Temple. Declared a National Historic Landmark in 1970, Unity Temple is Frank Lloyd Wright's only surviving public building from his Prairie period. Limited by a modest budget and an urban site, Wright created a bold design and used unconventional materials to produce one of his most significant accomplishments. Continue our afternoon with Bill Hinchliff on an expert led tour of Oak Park. See many other of Wright's designs from foot and also on the motor coach. Please wear comfortable walking shoes.




