General Information

How much does camp cost?

Camp classes range from \$89 to \$109 per half-day session. Prices for individual topics are listed for each campus class offering. All materials are included. In addition, each child in the program will receive a "Kids on Campus" T-shirt. Please indicate preferred size on the enrollment form.

Is lunch included?

Lunch is not included. Full Day campers must bring their own sack lunch.

• There will be a structured 30-minute lunch break for those attending both sessions from 12 p.m.-12:30 p.m. (between morning and afternoon sessions).

Students will be required to carry their lunches with them throughout the day. Students are encouraged to bring drinks. While there are several vending machines located throughout the campus, the cafeteria will be closed and there might not be time to get drinks.
