Athletic camps are sponsored by the Office of Community and Professional Education in partnership with the college's Athletic Department.

The 2017 Summer Athletic Camps will provide an opportunity for boys and girls to acquire knowledge, develop interest, learn techniques and improve skills in a variety of sports.

All camps are under the direction of a head coach with a sufficient number of assistant coaches to provide low coach-to-camper ratios. Campers will be divided into groups according to age and ability.

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Campers must be dropped off and picked up at the McDonough Sports Complex lobby. Children should not be dropped off prior to posted start times. There will not be supervision available until that time.

Camps will end promptly at the designated time. Coaches will be available for 15 minutes after their individual campends. Children must be picked up by that time, unless enrolled in extended care, and parents must come inside to sign out their child. All campers must provide their own transportation.

LUNCH (Full-day campers only)
Campers are expected to bring their own lunch. Limited snacks and beverages will be available for purchase at HVCC.
Refrigeration is not available. All campers should bring a labeled water bottle daily.

INSURANCE

Every camper is covered by an excess accident insurance plan. It provides excess medical and accidental death protection during camp participation and also while traveling to and from Hudson Valley Community College.

EXTENDED HOURS FOR ATHLETIC CAMP PROGRAMS

HALF-DAY CAMPS

(Except golf, due to off-site meetings) Morning extended care is available from 8 - 9 a.m. for an additional charge of \$10/week. There is no afternoon extended care for half-day camps unless your child is registered in an afternoon Summer Academy program.

If you need a full-day program for your child, please check our Summer Academy offerings beginning on page 10.



Students who sign up for a morning Athletic Camp and afternoon Summer Academy class must pay the \$10 fee for supervised lunch (lunch is NOT provided). Camp staff will transport children to the Viking Child Care Building (DCC) for lunch and the afternoon program.

FULL-DAY CAMPS

Morning extended care is available from 8 - 9 a.m. for an additional charge of \$10/week. Afternoon extended care is available from 3 - 4 p.m. for an additional charge of \$10/week. Extended care will be held in the McDonough Field House.

Bethlehem Middle School is located at 332 Kenwood Avenue in Delmar.

The Technology Enrichment Program gives students a chance to discover their interests and talents through hands-on, activity-packed learning sessions. Students will be given the opportunity to explore several dynamic areas.

The program will meet Monday through Friday for one week. Campers will have a half-hour for lunch and are expected to bring their own lunch and beverage. This program is comprised of four modules.

Module 1 - 3D Printing and Coding!

Module 2 - A Crash Course

Module 3 - Fisher Technics Design

Module 4 - Tinkering with TOYS

3D PRINTING AND CODING!

Invent your own creation, or innovate an existing one! You will be challenged to create a new product to solve a need you will identify. Your design will come to life using computer software and 3D printing. Students will be introduced to core computer science and programming concepts using popular characters like Angry Birds, Plants vs. Zombies and Flappy Bird. Using Code.org "Hour of Code," you will be learning how to create mazes, make drawings, algorithms and functions. *Tim Connelly, Instructor*



What is a CRASH course? This one is all about collisions! What happens when two objects come together? Sometimes they bounce and sometimes they break. Students will explore collisions that occur in many different settings. They will investigate collisions in sports such as baseball, curling, pool and bowling. Students will practice reducing the impact of collisions like baseball players catching a ball with "soft hands," and apply that to a "safe" collision with a water balloon or raw egg. Predictions will be made about a collision between two students in Sumo suits. Another activity will involve designing a helmet to protect a pasta "brain." And we will learn even more about collisions by investigating the role of crash dummies in safety tests. Bring your best thinking and engineering skills to this hands-on CRASH course in collisions.

FISHER TECHNICS DESIGN CHALLENGE

Students will design, build and program Fisher Technics robot assemblies to perform fun and creative tasks. We will develop automated models for hitting ping pong balls, climbing obstacles and more. The camp will focus on elements of design, and test participants' problem solving skills in redesigning their robots until they accomplish their goal. Several fun and challenging engineering and design activities will occur throughout the week.

HOVER CRAFT CHALLENGE

Physics comes alive as the Hover-Craft levitates on a cushion of air and races across the floor. Powered by two propellers, the Hover-Craft will need to be built for distance and speed. Can you build a craft that can go the distance? Top scores are based on distance and time combined.

NASA SPACESUIT CHALLENGE

It takes a lot to survive in space and it all starts with the equipment on your back, literally! You will work in teams to design and build a pressure suit that must protect the astronaut (marshmallow) from a vacuum situation. It must completely surround the astronaut to provide the necessary protection to the human body so that they may survive under the vacuum of space!

POINT A TO POINT B, THEN BACK AGAIN

Pneumatics, hydraulics and eggs, what do they all have in common? This challenge! First, we will build our knowledge with an introduction to using pneumatic and hydraulic cylinders in robotic systems. Then you get to exercise your creativity, as you design your own remotely-controlled robotic arm to safely transport an egg from one place to another, and return it to its original location, all in the quickest time possible. *Gregory Garrison, Instructor*

SCHOONER OR LATER

It's summertime; let's have some fun in the water! With limited sail size and the same wind source as your opponents, you must design the most efficient hull to drive your boat to victory. We will discuss and explore various designs. Then, the fun part: using easy-working foam, you will design and problem-solve through various hull designs of your own, concluding with an exciting race where you get to see your results on our test track.




