These courses are designed for both medical professionals (Healthcare Provider) and the general public (Heartsaver). Learn how to give emergency assistance to someone whose heart and breathing have stopped.

The entire course can be completed on campus in a classroom setting OR *as a new on-line option* (classroom portion) from the convenience of your own computer. Skills practice and testing would be scheduled with an AHA approved instructor following the successful completion of the on-line portion.



### **Eligibility**

Admission is open to anyone 16 years or older (unless otherwise noted) not enrolled in a full-time secondary program, regardless of educational background. Students in a full-time high school must have the permission of their home district and the Director of Adult and Continuing Education. Approval for admission is determined by the merits of each case. The Medina County Career Center does not accept credit for experiential learning. Full-time programs require a criminal record check. Criminal activity may prohibit admission.

### **Senior Citizens**

Residents who are 55 years of age or older may receive a 10 percent discount on tuition for Career Enhancement classes only. The \$10 early registration discount also applies during the early registration period. **No discount is applied for books or for full-time programs.** 

### **Books**

Books are extra and never included in the tuition fee unless specified. Books may be purchased at time of registration or on the first night of class.

### **Registration & Fees**

Adult and Continuing Education classes are self-supporting with all tuition fees applied to the total operation of the Adult Program. A \$10 non-refundable registration fee has been included in the tuition fee for each class regardless of cost. For those programs requiring a \$50 deposit, a \$50 non-refundable registration fee has been included in the tuition fee. Registration may be done in person, by phone, mail, Internet or fax. ### **Class Cancellations**

### **Refund Policy/Part-time Classes**

- Full refunds will be issued when a class is cancelled by the Adult Education Department or fees may be applied to another class.
