BLET – Basic Law Enforcement Training

This program gives students essential skills required for entry-level employment as law enforcement officers with state, county, or municipal government, or with private enterprises.

The program utilizes N.C. Criminal Justice Training and Standards Commission mandated topics and methods of instruction. General subjects include, but are not limited to, criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic and alcoholic beverage laws; investigative, patrol, custody, and court procedures; emergency responses; and



ethics and community relations.

Biker 101: Outlaw Motorcycle Gangs

Biker 101: Outlaw Motorcycle Gangs is an eight hour introductory course that includes a history of outlaw motorcycle gangs, a brief overview of the "Big 4" OMG's, gang structure and recruiting, identification and the meaning of patches and tattoos, OMG ideology, history of violence and a breakdown of what OMG's you have in your area and in North Carolina. Training will include how to spot and identify OMG members and associates and what intelligence is critical to gather during traffic stops and other encounters. Discussion will include officer safety issues and you will learn to identify weapons that OMG members may be carrying when encountered by law enforcement.
