Age & Eligibility Participants must be the appropriate age on the first day of class. Adult classes are for participants 16 years or older unless otherwise specified.

Can I withdraw from a class or transfer to another? Participants may request a refund in writing for programs at least one week prior to the class start date. Email your request to prep@d125.org. A \$10 administrative fee is deducted from all refunds. When class size permits, participants may request a transfer from one program to another in writing, at least one week prior to the class start date. Does PREP Prorate or can I make-up classes missed? No, PREP does not prorate for any of its camps, classes or programs. In order to preserve the safety of the participant-to-staff ratio and the quality of the classes, PREP does not provide for or allow make-up classes.


