This is the year to see this popular historic reenactment! Let PVCE do the driving. We'll spirit you away to the reenactment site depicting the days of the Indian wars and one of the most infamous battles of that era, the Battle of the Little Big Horn where Custer met his demise. An early departure gets us to Hardin in time to enjoy the many festivities in town: quilt show, model train exhibition, arts and crafts fair, historic book fair, and special museum exhibits. A hearty sack lunch is provided so the group can get out to the site to secure seating for the reenactment. Dinner will be on your own in Billings on our way back home.

Fort Phil Kearny & Fetterman Battlefield

History buffs will enjoy the trip over the Big Horn Mountains to the site of Fort Phil Kearny, one of 3 U.S. Army forts established along the Bozeman Trail in 1866 to protect travelers from Indian attack. The location of the fort was in the middle of Lakota Sioux sacred hunting grounds which fueled war with the tribes led by Chief Red Cloud. Ultimatey Captain Fetterman's entire command of 80 men was wiped out on Dec. 21, 1866, the worst defeat suffered by the U.S. Army before Custer's at the Battle of the Little Big Horn 10 years later. Our tour will be conducted by the retired superintendent of the site and will include a detailed weapon's presentation. After our tours and picnic lunch, there will be free time in Story to browse the shops and galleries. We will also stop on the route home for a quick dinner (on your own). 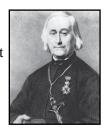
WYOMING HUMANITIES COUNCIL PROGRAM: Brother, Can You Spare a Dime?

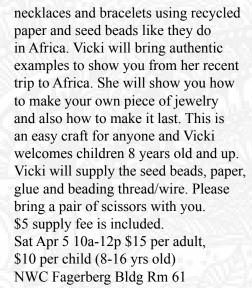

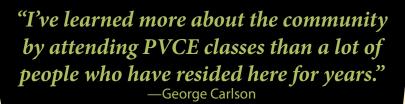
