Whether you are upholstering a small or full-sized piece of furniture, the techniques are the same. Learn these techniques on a miniature, wood-frame Victorian style chaise lounge. Your Materials Fee includes the wooden frame, foam, use of proper tools, and a video to use at home. All you need to bring is 1.5 yards of medium weight upholstery fabric. No experience necessary.

Make a boxed cushion by learning how to measure space for any cushion size, lay out fabric for cutting with minimal waste, and sew a boxed cushion with welt and zipper. Bring 1.5 yards of light to medium weight upholstery fabric and a sewing machine with a zipper foot or welt foot, and thread. Velvet and fabrics with nap aren't recommended. Instructor will supply zipper, zipper slide, welt cord, yardsticks, scissors, chalk, seam rippers, and pin cushion with pins for use in class. Prerequisites: Previous sewing experience and knowledge of your sewing machine is necessary.

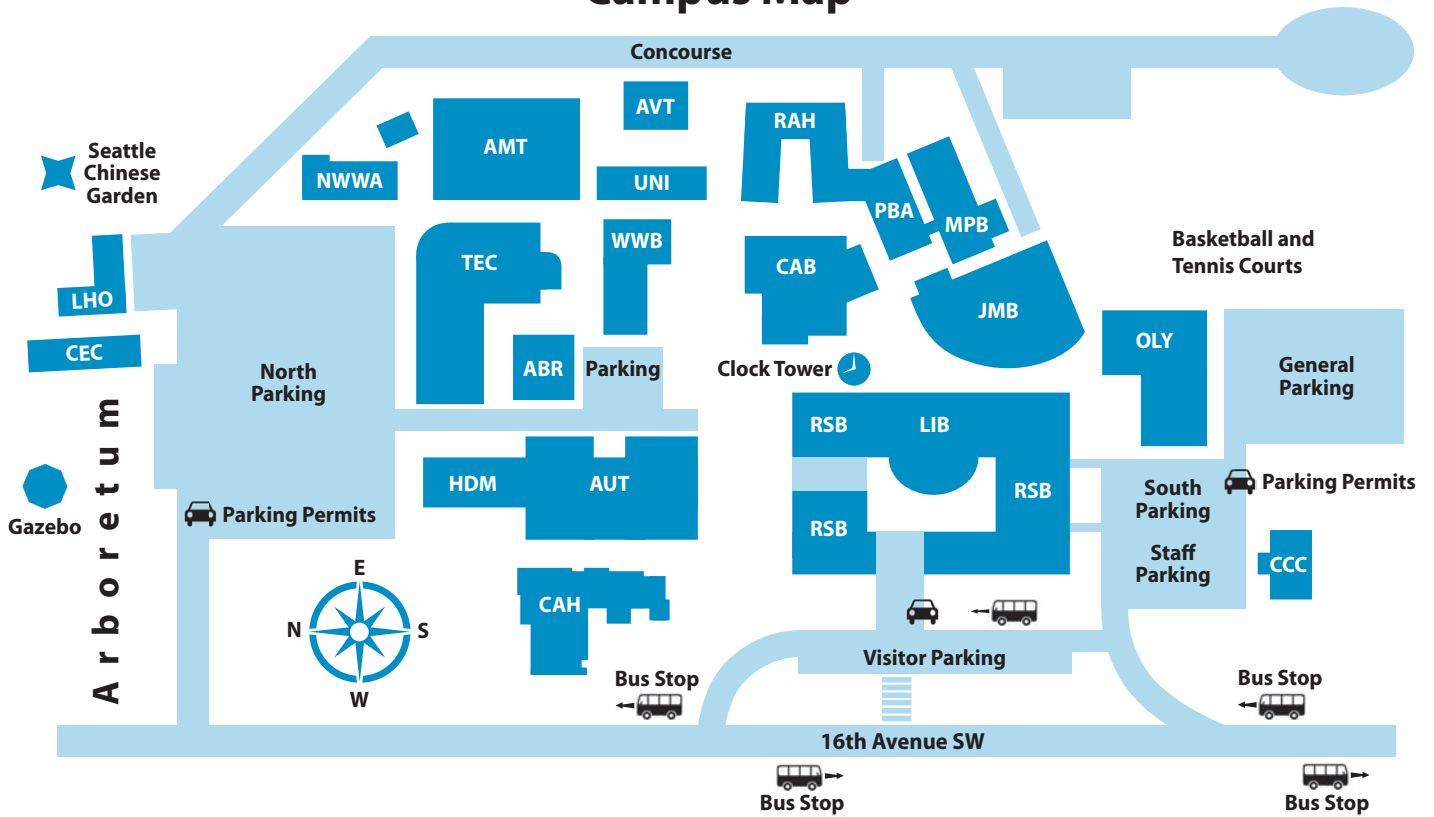

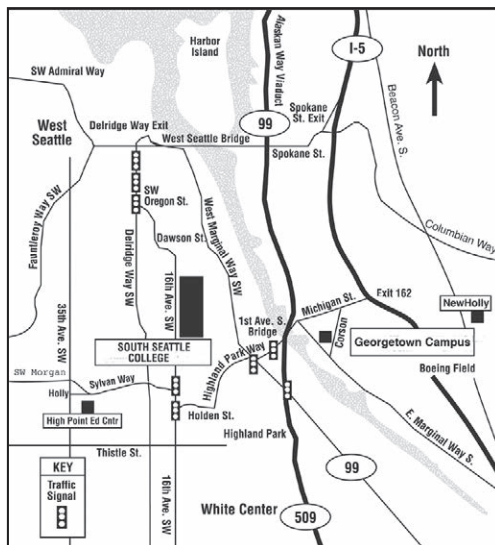
Finding Your Way Around!
