LIFE SCIENCE SAMPLER

1PM TO 3PM miSci MUSEUM MIX-UP 🗂

Join us to experience four fun-filled days of hands-on scientific adventures led by the educators at the miSci Museum of Innovation and Science in Schenectady. Each day's activities will focus around a central theme:

ENERGY

Where does energy come from? Explore turbines, solar panels, thermoelectricity, Piezoelectricity and other methods of producing energy from both renewable and non-renewable sources. Explore familiar and emerging ways to generate electricity.

NANO-SCIENCE

The nano world is all around us, but we can't see it with our eyes. Find out just how small nano really is. Through hands-on activities explore the everyday applications of nanotechnology. Students learn just how small nano is and what it takes to work with nano-sized objects.

ENGINEERING

Design and build a shock-absorbing system that will protect two marshmallow "astronauts" when they land. Test, evaluate, and redesign. In addition, students will learn about the Erie Canal and how Pascal's Law was used to design canal lock systems.

CHEMISTRY

ONLINE COURSE AT YOUR OWN PACE FORENSIC SCIENCE: BUGS TO BALLISTICS JANUARY 26 TO MAY 15, 2015

Would you like to learn all about Forensic Science and how crimes are solved? Join Mr. Biss to do just that. You will study everything from forensic entomology to forgery and foot prints and then on to ballistics. This online class will be full of photos, videos and history explaining the past and present of Forensic Science. You will learn in detail about the different forensic techniques and will also have some laboratory experiments you can try at home.

This class will be taught online through the use of Angel, SUNY Adirondack's course management system, as well as through your own Internet research, over six different units to teach you all about forensic science. The first week will start with a section showing you how to use Angel, how to check your messages, respond back to the instructor, and what is expected from you each lesson. Then, we'll get to the good stuff—learning about forensics!

Students have until May 15 to complete it, but must sign up before April 6.

To be successful with this course, students should have basic computer skills and a familiarity with using the Internet. When registering for a course with an online component, you will need to supply your email address and date of birth upon registration. COURSE PAYMENT: Payment is due upon registration, as follows:

BY CHECK: Made payable to SUNY Adirondack. Students may pay in person at the Continuing Education Office, Washington Hall, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8am and 4pm. Students may also mail the payment stub, located at the bottom of the Student Schedule and Bill, w/check to the Office of Continuing Education.

BY CASH OR CREDIT CARD:

Cash payment must be made at the Business Office in Warren Hall, with a copy of the Student Schedule and Bill.

Winter Enrichment courses are taught on SUNY Adirondack's Queensbury campus, 640 Bay Road, Queensbury and at the Wilton Center, 696 Route 9, Wilton. A campus map is included with the course schedule/confirmation.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

A. Students must currently be enrolled in 4th, 5th, 6th grade to be eligible for the program.

B. If you register your child for more than one class, these classes must meet consecutively in time—that is, you may register your child for an 8:15am and then a 10:30am class, but you may NOT register your child for an 8:15am class and then a 1pm class. Children should not be on campus during a time in which they are not registered for a class. For example, if your child's first class is at 10:30am, he or she should NOT be on campus before 10:15am. Please pick children up promptly after their last class of the day.

C. To enroll your child, you MUST submit the following: **(1)** a completed Registration Form; **(2)** a completed Medical Release Form; **(3)** payment of tuition and fees by VISA, MasterCard, Discover, or check (made payable to SUNY Adirondack). If you are registering in person, payments in cash or with a credit card must be made at the Business Office in Warren Hall after registering for courses in Washington Hall.

D. If a class is canceled, students will be notified by telephone. Our refund policy is: 100% course tuition and fees refund prior to 4pm on Friday, February 6. No refunds will be issued after 4pm on Friday, February 6.
