





Participant Information Packet

(for camps that meet 12 hours or more in one week)

A PARTICIPANT INFORMATION PACKET must be submitted for each camper prior to the start date of the camp. Packets may be found at www.townofcary.org by typing "Summer Camp Forms" in the search field. Please make copies as needed for additional children.

If your camper becomes ill or injured during camp, the parent/ guardian or emergency contact person(s) noted in the PARTICIPANT INFORMATION and EMERGENCY CONTACT sections will be notified. You should make necessary arrangements to have your child picked up.

Please note any medical concerns in the PARTICIPANT INFORMATION – MEDICAL INFORMATION portion of the packet. Please fill out Section 3 of this page if medication needs to be administered during camp hours (including medication for asthma). This section must be completed in its entirety and signed by parent/guardian before any medication will be dispensed. Medication will be secured in a locked box at all times. Camp counselors will carry medication to dispense as appropriate while on field trips.

Waiver Policy

A waiver, signed by the parent or guardian, must be on file for each class before the first day of participation. A copy of the waiver is available at any Town of Cary PRCR staffed facility and at townofcary.org. Campers without signed waivers will not be allowed in camp.

Dress Code

Campers should dress accordingly for the activities scheduled. It is recommended that they wear shorts, a light weight shirt or top, and some type of athletic shoe or sneaker in order to participate in recreational or athletic activities each day. For programs at the Cary Art Center, it is recommended to send campers in old clothing. Certain camps may have additional clothing requirements.

Sandals, flip-flops, rubber "crocs"-style shoes, and other open toed shoes are not recommended as acceptable attire for active recreation activities.

If the camper is not properly attired, the parent/guardian will be notified to bring appropriate clothing or will be required to pick up the camper.

Behavior Management

Camp Staff create a fun and safe environment for participants in the program. Praise and positive reinforcement are used as effective methods of behavior management.

Camper behavior that does not respond to these methods or is destructive to others or property will be dealt with in a professional, positive, and timely manner to correct the behavior. The following procedures will be followed for behavior management. All Incident Reports will be discussed privately with parents and a copy of each report will be kept on file in the camp office.

- In the event that a camper's behavior is a repeated behavior and cannot be corrected by the Camp Staff with a verbal warning or other form of behavior modification, a first Incident Report will be written to document and correct behavior. A copy of the report will be given to the parent the same day.
- 2. A second Incident Report will be written if the behavior is repeated or new behavior problems occur by the same camper. This report will follow the same process as the first, but a one or two-day suspension could accompany this report. A copy of the report will be given to the parent the same day.
- **3.** A third Incident Report will be completed using the same process as the first two. The full-time staff and camp director will write this report. The full-time staff of the camp will give this report to the parent. Incident reports will be discussed privately with parent by a camp director or supervisor. Dismissal from program can occur at this time.
- * Immediate dismissal from the program can occur at any time given severe circumstances. Refunds for missed days due to a discipline dismissal may not be granted.

Sunscreen and Insect Repellent

For camps with outdoor activities, it is recommended to apply sunscreen and/or bug spray to your camper prior to arriving to camp each day. You may send sunscreen/bug spray with your camper; however they must be able to apply themselves under adult supervision. Spray or mist type sunscreen and/or insect repellent are recommended. Sunscreen/bug spray must be labeled with camper's name. Campers may not share these items with other campers.

Field Trips (for applicable camps)

Cary Parks, Recreation, & Cultural Resources will transport campers offsite in vehicles provided by or contracted by the Town of Cary. If a camper arrives at camp after the scheduled departure for a field trip, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to either:

- Transport the camper to the field trip location and sign-in the participant with a Town of Cary camp staff member at the field trip site, or
- Transport the camper to the camp site once the camp returns from the field trip location and sign-in.

Campers cannot be left at a camp location without camp staff present. Refunds will not be given if a camper misses a field trip. If a parent/ guardian needs to pick up a camper while on a field trip, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to pick up the camper at the field trip site.




Photo Policy

Cary Parks, Recreation & Cultural Resources reserves the right to alter schedules, fees, and instructors as necessary. Classes are subject to cancellation when minimum enrollment has not been reached.

Nonregistered Participants in the Classroom

Because of space limitations and distractions to other participants, we ask that only registered participants remain in a classroom. Parents (in the case of non-parent participation classes) and siblings may wait in approved waiting areas. Exceptions may be made by the facility supervisor in the case of participants with disabilities, who may need additional assistance.

ADA Accommodations

The Town of Cary makes every reasonable effort to ensure that facilities are accessible to individuals with disabilities. Accommodations can be made for most programs. If you have questions about a facility or need special assistance, please contact us. For your convenience, a FM Assisted Listening System is available for programs sponsored by the Parks, Recreations & Cultural Resources Department. The following payment and refund information pertains only to Summer Day Camp, Teen Adventure Camp, Cary Space Camp, Fencing Camp and Robotics Camp:

Payment Information

Full payment is required at the time of registration when using EZ-REG phone. For EZ-REG Web, mail-in or walk-in registrations, registrants may choose to participate in a payment plan (see below). Walk-in registration is only accepted at Bond Park, Herbert C. Young or Middle Creek Community Centers. Registrations after April 30, 2012 require full payment. For more details on our EZ-Reg Registration methods, please see the Registration section of this brochure.

A \$10 administrative fee will be assessed per session when the session start date is less than two (2) weeks from date of registration.

Payment Plan

A \$25 non-refundable deposit per camper per week will be accepted until April 30, 2012. The balance is due two (2) weeks prior to the start of each registered session. Any balance not paid by due date will result in loss of space and deposit for that session.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

Registration fees are 100% refundable when the Department cancels the activity. Participants wishing to withdraw from Summer Day, Teen Adventure, Cary Space Camp, Fencing Camp or Robotics Camp must provide a written request at least two weeks before the scheduled start of the session. Refunds/credits/gift cards are subject to a minimum of a \$25 administrative fee and prorated refunds/credits per participant per week. With the remaining funds, participants may request a credit to the family's account, valid for one (1) year; a Cary PRCR Gift Card, valid for three (3) years from date of last use; or a refund. Within the two weeks prior to the scheduled start of the session, refund/credits will not be given except for verified medical or hardship cases. Refund for payments made by check cannot be processed for three weeks from the date payment was made.

The following information pertains only to Summer Day and Teen Adventure Camps:

Camp Hours of Operation


Camp hours are Monday-Friday 7:30 a.m.- 6 p.m. Please do not drop off your child prior to the start time of the camp or pick them up after camp has ended for the day. Parents picking up their children after 6 p.m. must come into the camp office to pick up their child and must pay a late pick-up fee per child. Should you need to bring your camper after the normal start time or pick him/her up prior to the normal ending time, please consult the current week's schedule and notify the camp office. The camp will be CLOSED on Wednesday, July 4, 2012.

Staff

All hired personnel are at least 18 years of age. The staff/camper ratio is 1:12 for Summer Day Camp and 1:13 for Teen Adventure Camp. Each staff member is certified in First Aid and CPR and trained in conducting camp programs for youth and teens. Camps may also have Junior Counselor volunteers assisting the staff with various activities. These volunteers are 10th-12th graders and are not included in the ratio count.

Lunch

Campers must bring a bag lunch, two snacks and a drink in a non-glass container each day. Lunches should be in a paper, plastic, or reusable bag with their name clearly labeled on the bag. Coolers will be provided for each group's bag lunches and there is limited space. Do not send bubble/chewing gum or hard candy.



Types of Activities

Campers participate in a wide variety of recreational/educational activities. Activities include arts & crafts, dance, swimming, music, nature, archery, tennis, outdoor adventure, and sports & games. The weekly schedule will provide program specifics and field trips for the week. Weekly camp schedules are available to parents by Friday afternoon before the next session.

Field Trips

Admission prices have been included in your registration fee, however some attractions have concession areas. Campers may bring additional money for concession areas, but each CAMPER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS/HER OWN MONEY. Past field trips destinations have included roller skating, ice skating, miniature golf, swimming, indoor bounce houses, farms, watching a baseball game, the NC Zoo, and Wet-n-Wild Emerald Pointe (Teen Camp only). Some field trips are not offered each session.

Swimming

Summer Day Camp and Teen Adventure Camp will swim once a week at a City of Raleigh operated pool. Your camper will need to bring a swimsuit and towel on the day he/she swims. The weekly schedule will indicate which day your camper will swim.

Transportation

Parents or guardians are responsible for transportation to and from the camps. Summer Day and Teen Adventure Camps will use chartered buses or 15-passenger vans for field trips.

Personal Belongings

Due to the large number of campers, the Town of Cary and staff are not responsible for campers' personal belongings. Campers should not bring personal toys (i.e. handheld video games, trading cards), cell phones or other electronics, jewelry or money (except for concessions). Please put camper's name on all articles of clothing, towels, lunchboxes, etc.
