Real Estate Post-License

Home Inspection Pre-Licensing Program [Online]

Open enrollment, register any time.

Prepare for the Illinois Home Inspection State Licensing Exam with this state-approved course. Once the student completes the online portion of the course (approximately 80 hours) they then schedule the five in-field inspections needed to complete the course. Topics include the physical components of a home, communication skills, knowledge of professional practices and insight into what may go wrong as well as the cause and implications of problems that result. Participants will receive clear direction concerning what to look for during an inspection, such as signs of non-performance due to old age, deferred maintenance, weather damage and poor workmanship. The instructors are experienced licensed home inspectors and active members of the American Society of Home Inspectors [ASHI]. Upon completion of the approved pre-licensing course, applicants must pass the Home Inspection State Licensing Exam before they are eligible for a license in the State of Illinois. Cost of the exam is NOT included in the course fee. Additional fees may apply for the in-field inspections. Email access and an internet connection are required for this course. CPD-4102 ^{\$}450

Real Estate Broker 30 Hour Post-License

This course completes the 30 hours of post-training needed by newly licensed brokers, prior to their first license renewal in Illinois. The Department of Transportation requires training for employees receiving or shipping hazardous materials. This training includes new changes to the 49 CFR hazardous materials table, packaging of materials, shipping papers and other documentation and recognizing potential hazardous conditions when receiving packages. Participants are encouraged to bring a list of products they ship or receive and samples of shipping papers. Do you have the right skills for a high-paying job in the Manufacturing Industry? The time is NOW! Improve your skills and become more competitive in the job market!

The Manufacturing Skill Standards Council (MSSC) developed the Certified Production Technician (CPT) as the industry standard for production workers. CPT is the national certification supported by the National Association of Manufacturers. Sixteen area employers are endorsing this program as a preferred credential for hire.

Medical Billing and Coding

This combined 80 hour billing and coding course offers the skills needed to solve insurance billing problems, how to manually file claims (using the CPT and ICD-10 manual), complete common insurance forms, trace delinguent claims, appeal denied claims and use generic forms to streamline billing procedures. The course covers the following areas: CPT (Introduction, Guidelines, Evaluation and Management), specialty fields (such as surgery, radiology and laboratory), ICD-10 (Introduction and Guidelines) and basic claims processes for medical insurance and third party reimbursements. Students will learn how to find the service and codes using manuals, (CPT, ICD-10 and HCPCS). [Optional Externship Available]

This comprehensive 50 hour program will prepare students to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Food Service Sanitation

Food Service Sanitation [8 Hr. Class]

Applied Food Service Sanitation is designed to assist the manager or potential manager applying sanitation principles in the operation of a food service establishment. Students will learn to identify the causes of food-borne illness, identify and apply correct procedures for cleaning and sanitizing, recognize problems and potential solutions associated with facility, equipment and layout. The Illinois code related to food service establishments will be discussed. During the last session students will take the ServSafe Protection Food Manager Certification exam.

This class is required in Illinois for food service manager certification and is approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). Upon successful completion of the exam, students will submit their Food Service Sanitation Manager Certification Program Request Form and ^{\$}35 fee payable to the IDPH. Food Service Sanitation Manager licenses are valid for five years.

A textbook is required for this class: ServSafe Manager, 6th Edition. The textbook is available at the IVCC Bookstore located at the main campus in Oglesby or can be purchased in advance online at www.ivccbookstore.com. It is recommended that students purchase the book in advance and begin review prior to the start of class due to the fast paced nature of the class.

The well-respected architect, Daniel Burnham, designed this building to reflect all the latest ideas for an office work place. In the early 1900s Frank Lloyd Wright was asked to remodel the main lobby to reflect the new more modern esthetic of the times. It is considered one of the most architecturally significant buildings in downtown Chicago. Lunch is included at Pompei Restaurant in Little Italy, featuring traditional Italian family recipes. This family owned restaurant has been open since 1909 with four generations keeping the Napolitano traditions alive. This afternoon experience a touch of 20th Century splendor. The Putnam Museum and Science Center in Davenport will host The Discovery of King Tut, re-creating one of the greatest archaeological finds of the 20th century. The exhibit features more than 1,000 precisely crafted replicas by Egyptian craftsmen of treasures discovered in Tutankhamun's Egyptian tomb by England's archaeologist Howard Carter in 1922. The exhibit provides a unique experience that explores the legendary tomb and its treasures as they were at the exact moment of their discovery. Tutankhamun became pharaoh at age 8 but died under mysterious circumstances at a young age. His successors erased his name from all monuments, and, forgotten, he lay for almost 3,500 years in the Valley of Kings until British archaeologist Howard Carter discovered his tomb, according to the exhibit. The burial and treasure chambers in the exhibit can't be seen this way anywhere else in the world - not even in Egypt, because Tutankhamun's original tomb has been almost completely emptied. The priceless original treasures are behind glass in the display cabinets of the Egyptian National Museum in Cairo and are not permitted to leave Egypt. Handling Medical Emergencies

What would you do if a member of your family suffered a medical emergency?
