The protocol features proven strategies from close reading, reciprocal teaching, along with a dash of fluency. Culturally Responsive Classroom Management (CRCM) is an approach to running classrooms with all children, [not simply for racial/ethnic minority children] in a culturally responsive way. Misreading behaviors or communication patterns of culturally and linguistically diverse students can lead teachers to see them as having a disability, or lacking self-control. CRCM is a way of thinking, a pedagogical approach that guides the classroom management decisions that teachers make. 
