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



Babysitter's Training (Ages 11-15)

Safe Sitter prepares young adolescents for the responsibilities of nurturing and protecting children. Participants will learn: how, why, and where injuries happen so you can prevent them from happening in the first place, how to get help if you need it, how to keep yourself safe when babysitting, how a child's age affects how to care for them, how to prevent problem behavior, and how to rescue a choking infant or child. The class will include handson manikin practice in rescue skills, small group interactive learning, role-playing, and games. At the end of each section, each participant must pass a written exam proving they understand the key concepts. Students must also demonstrate their skills in care of the choking infant/child and in infant/child CPR. Upon successful completion, students will receive a Safe Sitter certification card. 


