Art Around The World (EA): Take a whirlwind trip around the world, exploring art of various cultures. Memories are created using various art mediums...no luggage needed.

Art On The Orient Express (EA): Travel and explore the artistic cultures of the Far East. Students will create Chinese good luck dragons, Japanese fans, and other exotic projects.

Blast Off (EA): Travel to the far reaches of your imagination as you design and paint your own galaxy, sculpt aliens, and build a flying saucer. To infinity and beyond!

Clay Critters (EA): Create your favorite animals out of clay and construct a habitat to put them in. A "wild adventure" awaits you!

Color My World (EA): Open your "world of color" by experimenting with various paint mediums—mixing colors has never been so much fun! Join in learning various ways to apply paint to create your own original works of art.

Crazy Canines & Feisty Felines (EA): It is true, dogs & cats do get along...at least when you draw, paint, and sculpt them. Join this class for the cat's meow and a woof of a good time.

Fiesta Fun (EA): Experience art found south of the border, as you create wonderful, colorful Mexican art projects using various mediums of art. After this class you will want to hold your own Fiesta-ole!

Fitness and Fun: (R) This course will give students a chance to learn new games and participate in fitness based activities while simultaneously enhancing their knowledge about fitness.

Food Frenzy: (R) Learn to prepare food like a pro! We will cover nutrition, kitchen rules, play games, do fun crafts, and most importantly make food! You will leave this class armed with a cookbook of your own recipes and a belly full of great food!

Knights, Pawns & Paintbrushes (CC): Chess is not just a game! Learn how chess has influenced the art of dozens of cultures while learning how to play the game. In-class activities will feature both art projects and chess games. No chess skills required; all are welcome.

Land of Legos: (R) Come with your imagination and your hands ready to build famous world landmarks! On Friday you will have a chance to show your friends and family your favorite landmark creation!

Mad Science Boot Camp Part 1 (MS):

Discover how to send secret messages to your friends; learn why we move the way we do and how to improve the games we play! Campers experiment with games and activities while learning how physical and chemical sciences affect their movement and technique.

Mad Science Boot Camp Part 2 (MS):

Discover how science will help us protect our planet. Campers will understand the basics of water pollution, acid rain, and the benefits of solar energy. By actively recycling their own garbage, they will make their very own paper to take home and actually use! Campers learn about life cycles, animal habits, and even replicate animal's footprints.

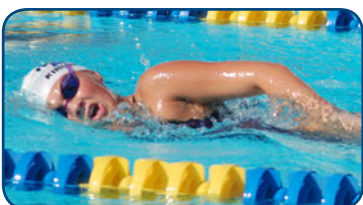

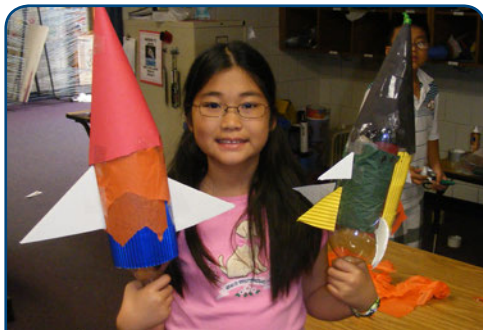

General Information

Public Notice Regarding Special Education

Rockwood School District

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, children who live outside the district but are attending a private school within the district, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, children who are wards of the state, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The Rockwood School District assures that it will provide a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to all eligible children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 under its jurisdiction. Disabilities include autism, deaf/blindness, emotional disorders, hearing impairment and deafness, mental retardation/intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment/blindness and young child with a developmental delay.

The Rockwood School District assures that it will provide information and referral services necessary to assist the State in the implementation of early intervention services for infants and toddlers eligible for the Missouri First Steps program.

The Rockwood School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The Rockwood School District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed at the Department of Differentiated Services, Monday through Friday, 9:00 to 3:00.

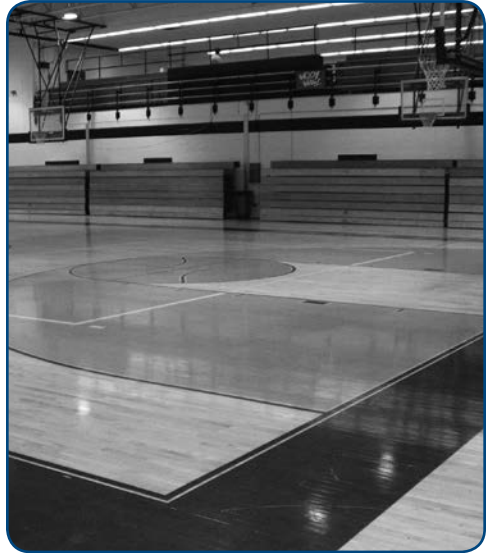


Facility Usage

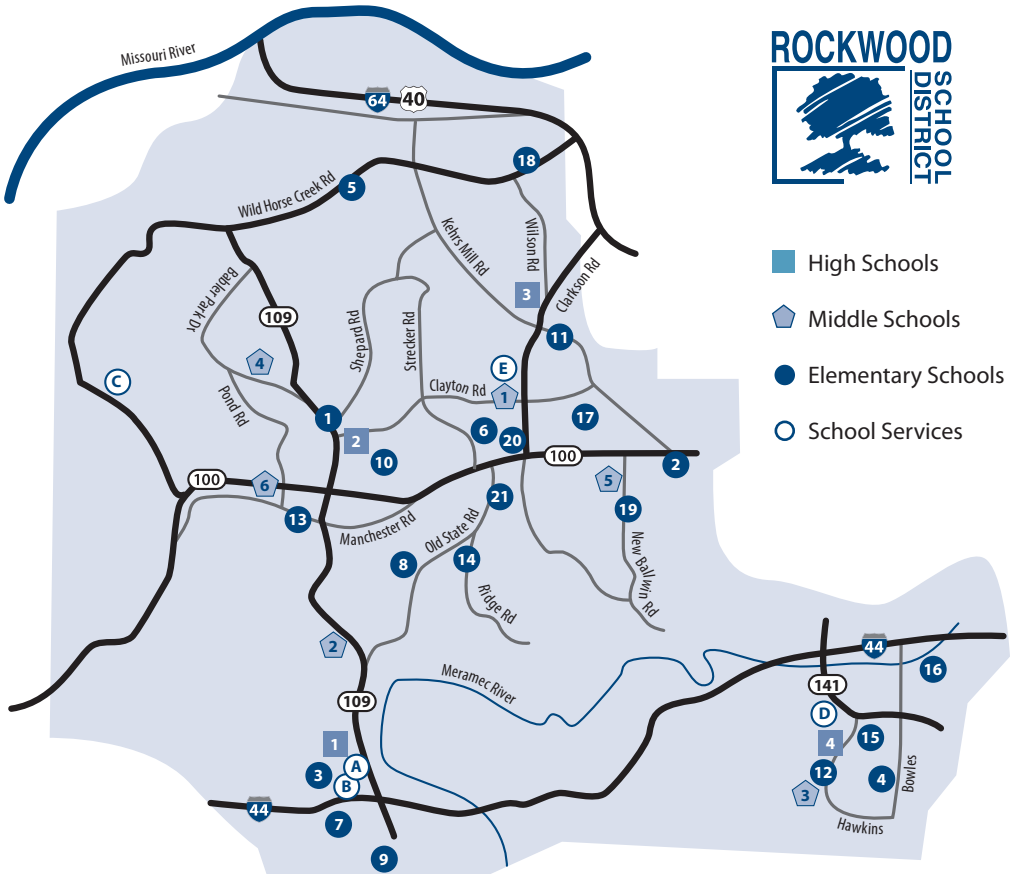

Fees and Cancellation Policy

Most Community Education programs are fee-based programs, as we are self-supporting. Fees will vary per program. Unless otherwise noted, all necessary materials and supplies are included in the registration fee. When possible, online registration is encouraged. If registering by mail, be sure to include all fees with the appropriate registration form. Checks should be made payable to the Rockwood School District.

A charge of \$25 for any returned payment will be assessed. A \$3 processing fee will be charged for all refunds for programs with a registration fee up to \$100. An additional \$3 will be added per each additional \$100 increment of registration fee.

Note: Effective July 1, 2012 the processing fee will change to \$5 for each \$100 increment of registration fee. Adventure Club and Early Childhood may have separate refund policies due to the nature of their work. You must call and cancel at least five business days prior to the start of the class/program to be guaranteed a refund.

Cancellation of classes/programs will be at the discretion of the Rockwood Community Education office.
