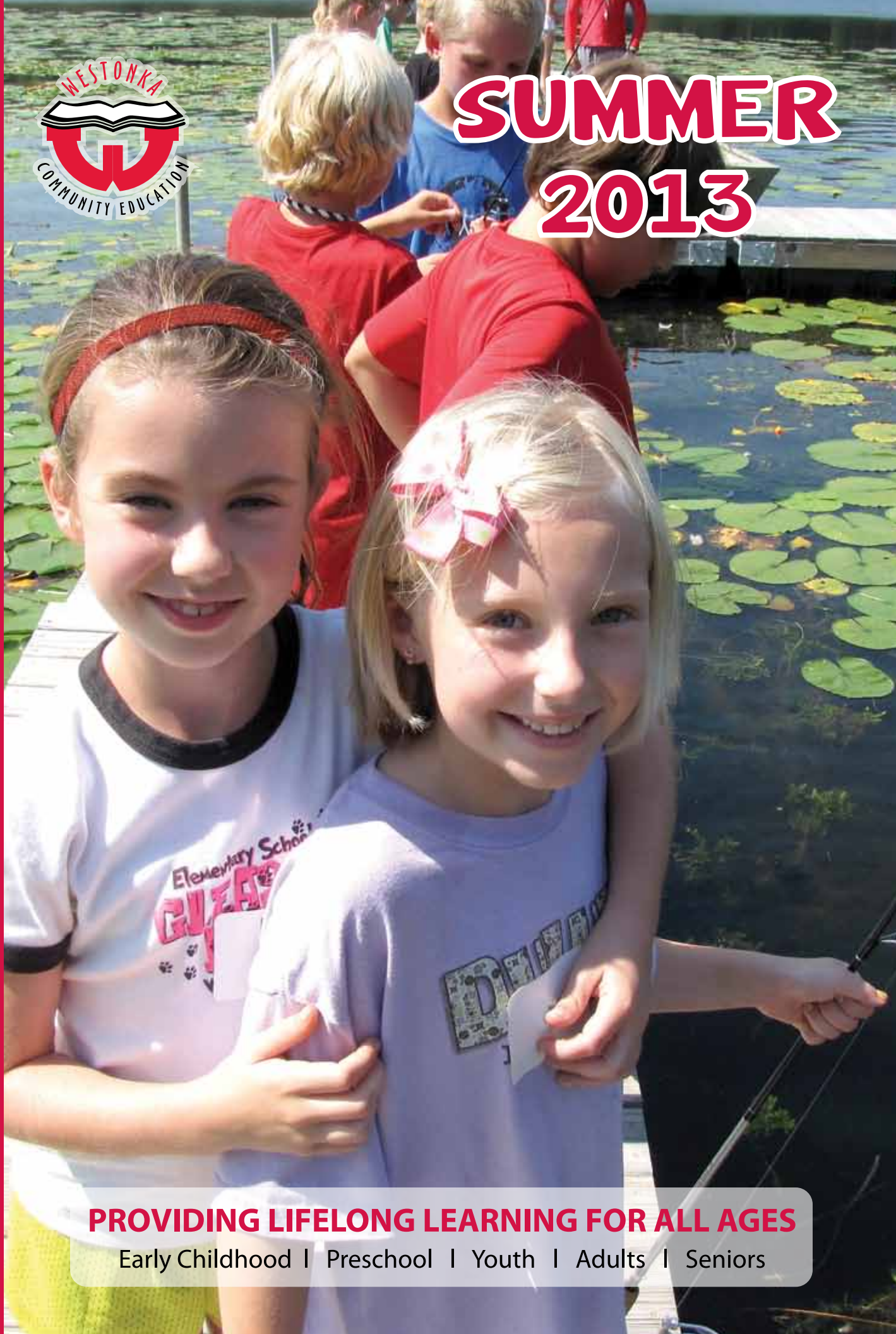

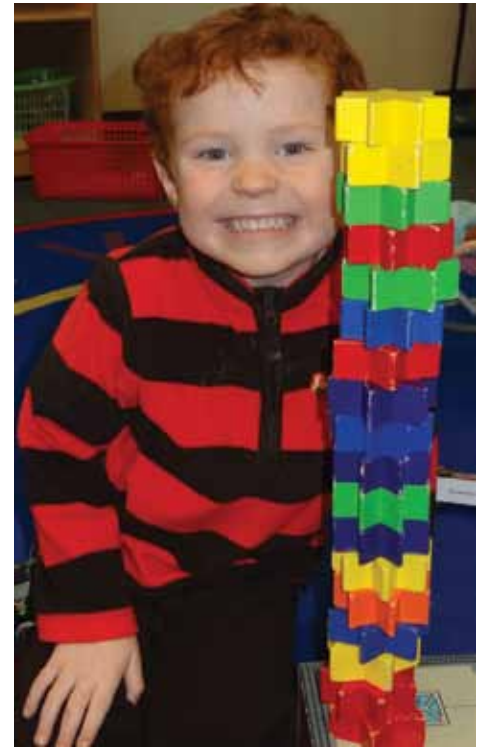

# WESTONKA COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL

## 2013-2014 PRESCHOOL CLASS OFFERINGS - For Children age Three Years to Kindergarten

The Westonka Community Preschool is a school readiness program, emphasizing activities in all areas of growth and learning for children ages three through five years. In preschool, children learn about their world, experience success and gain skills needed for kindergarten and for life. Field trips are scheduled regularly. Introductory Spanish is included in some classes during the school year. The program includes a diverse grouping of children reflective of the community and inclusive with special education.

### **\*Class Ages - Make sure your child enrolls in the appropriate class**

#### **Three & Three/Four year old classes**

**Age three / four by September 1st** - you may enroll in any preschool class at the Early Childhood Education Center.

**Age three between September 1st and October 31st**- You may enroll and begin on the first day of preschool at the Early Childhood Education Center. Plan to enroll for two years at this site. We recommend enrolling in the Teddy Bear room the first year and then the Gingerbread room the following year to progress in age groups.

#### **Four and Four/Five year old classes**

At the Primary School sites- Age four by September 1st and eligible for kindergarten the following year (no exceptions).

#### **Stepping-Up Class - Age four by October 31st.**

A great way to experience the school readiness curriculum and go on to kindergarten (if age 5 by Sept. 1st, 2014), or decide to do another year of preschool after this class at the primary school sites. A good choice for those with a late summer or early fall birthday.



**Toilet Training Skills:** Specific class sections (listed in color) are designed for children not yet toilet trained. All other classes require this skill.

**Parents are Partners:** Many events and volunteer activities are offered to preschool families that strengthen the connection between home and school.

**Licensed teachers & experienced staff:** Teachers and staff love what they do. They offer a safe, nurturing, learning environment that enhances self-esteem and instills a love for lifelong learning.

**2013-2014 Registration:** A \$50 non-refundable fee and registration form will reserve a space for your child. Children must be the correct age for each class section. To register, or for more information, call the Early Childhood Coordinator at 952-491-8044.

#### **Other services:**

When registering for preschool, check the box on the form if you need any of these services and an application form will be mailed to you.

- Financial assistance (limited)
- Extended day childcare (Preschool Adventure Club) is available at all three sites from 6:30 a.m.-6 p.m. during the school year and summer. (See page 6)

Offered during the morning or afternoon hours opposite the child's preschool class, Kinder Ready provides additional practice in school readiness skills and forming social/ emotional bonds with peers. 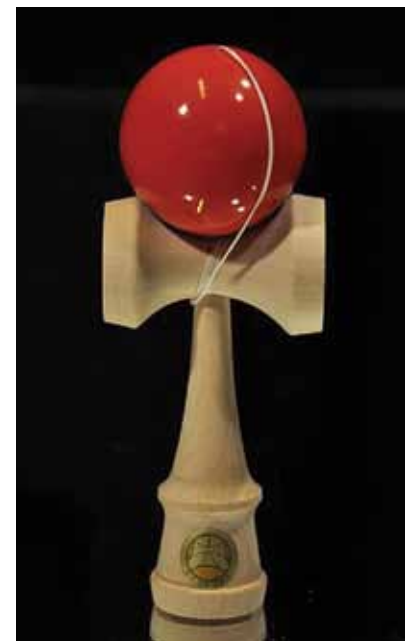

# YOUTH ENRICHMENT

## Drivers Education

After completing this course, students sign up with a commercial driving school and receive a blue card needed before taking the permit test. After passing the permit test, students take six hours of behind-the-wheel instruction at a cost of approximately \$275-\$350 through a commercial driving school. Bring paper and a pencil to class. ### Guidelines:

The purpose of the buddy is to:

- Assist the child with the activity. It may be very hands on (e.g. an art class or a cooking class) or hands off (a sports class where the child can participate but needs extra help when things become too overwhelming).
- Support the student, giving them the assurance that someone is there to help if s/he has a need, so s/he can relax and enjoy the class.
- Get to know the student, have fun together.
- If the student gets overwhelmed or frustrated, help to calm down or take a break to re-group and then get back into the activity.
- Ensure the child's safety (supervise the activity to make sure the child does not leave the premises, be aware of any risks per parent instruction).
- Call the parent/caregiver for early pick-up if things are not working out as planned.

Parents must complete a brief informational sheet and are encouraged to communicate directly with the volunteer to convey specifics about the student.

Volunteers will be instructed on privacy issues and given a chance to provide feedback on their experience during/after the course.

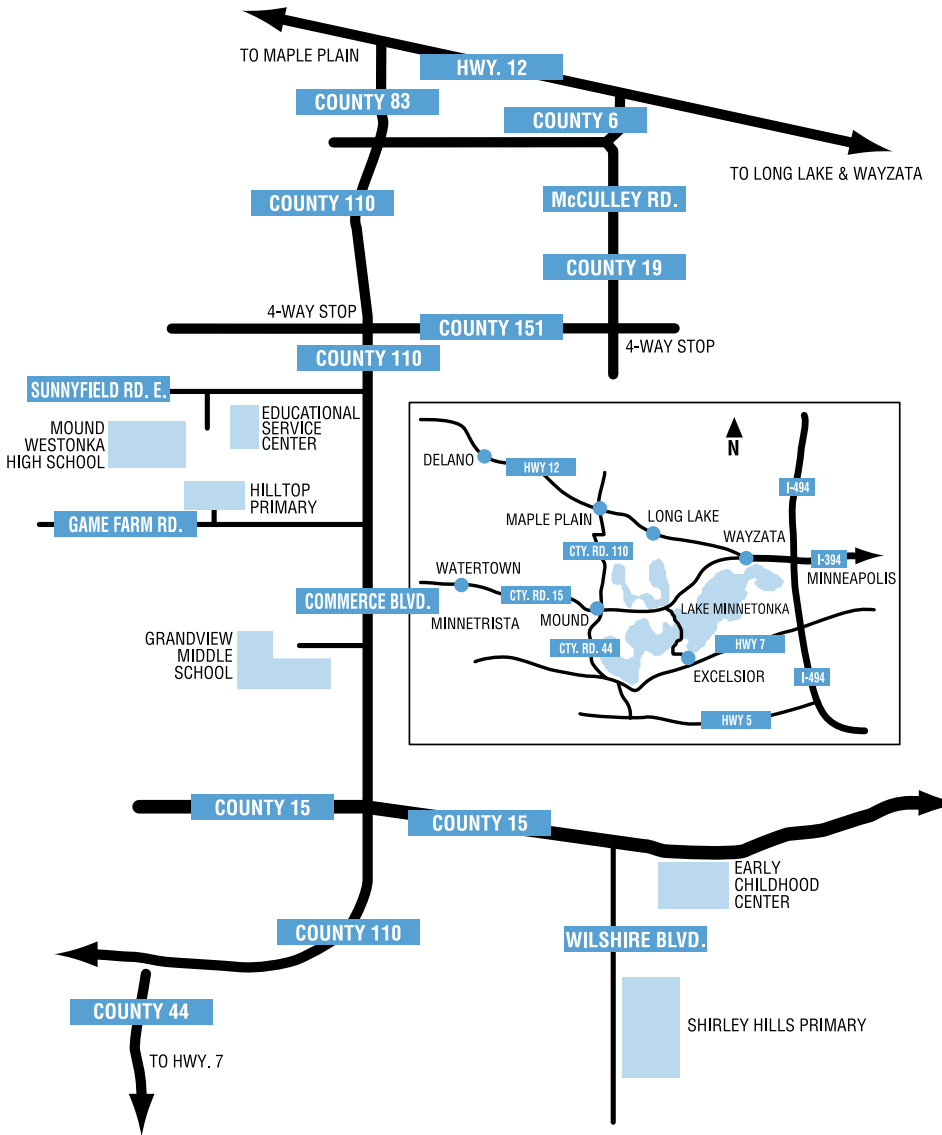

## Facilities Update *Progress Report*

**Summer 2013 Projects** – With bidding for summer 2013 projects expected to be completed by mid-April, recommendations will go to the Westonka School Board for review near the end of April. Following Board approval, various projects will be underway—secure entrance improvements at Hilltop and a boiler room addition at Shirley Hills being among the first. Precautions will be taken to ensure that students and staff are distanced from construction areas while school is in session.

Once the school year ends and additional projects enter the construction phase, moving service personnel will assist in clearing out the interior of Shirley Hills and certain areas of the high school. Areas under construction will be closed to the public; therefore, summer programs and activities will take place at the remaining available district facilities.

Perhaps the most visible project among district improvements will be the high school locker room renovation. Used by both the school and greater community, the locker room design is a result of planning by a group of staff and citizens and is intended to meet the needs of students, staff and community members.
