Notary Public Licensing

Instructor: Thomas Peavyhouse

Notary Class: This course exceeds the State of California qualifications for new applicants and for notaries that are renewing their commissions. Commissioned notaries may take this course six months prior to their commission expiration date. Students who complete the class will receive a State-approved Certificate of Completion required to take the State-proctored notary examination. The State of California will offer a same-day exam. \$45 materials fee payable in class.

Advance registration recommended. Minimum age 18. Late arrivals will not be admitted and no refunds will be given.


* Pasadena City College Campus Parking:



Dropping a Class NOREFUNDS AFTER A CLASS HAS BEGUN.
