

Yale Cites WCPSS with Distinguished Music Award


The Wake County Public School System and the North Carolina Symphony have made beautiful music together for nearly 40 years. Now, Yale University is taking notice.

A partnership between WCPSS and NCS has received a Yale Distinguished Music Award, and as a result a teacher and Symphony member will participate in the Yale School of Music Symposium on Music in Schools in June.

The award honors the WCPSS/NCS partnership, which has provided educational concerts for more than 15,000 fourth-graders, along with professional development for teachers, since 1976. In recent years, it has added master classes, humanities-themed concerts, discussions among students, teachers and symphony musicians, open rehearsals, and private music study for students of need for grades 6 through 12.

The WCPSS/NCS partnership is looking to further expand and enhance their activities and benefits to students. Martin Middle Magnet School music teacher Anita Hynus will attend the Yale Symposium with an NCS representative to study how that could happen.

Thirty-nine such partnerships from across the country received this award. Participants include the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Cliburn Competition, and the National Symphony Orchestra, with partner school districts.



HOW MUSIC CHANGES LIVES



"I always love the empowerment music provides as music is for everyone. It creates a sense of belonging to a group...and that is powerful."

Music has a powerful influence on our lives. From the patriotism brought on by the playing of "The Star-Spangled Banner" to the emotional ballad playing during your first school dance, music makes an impact. For one of Wake County Public School Systems' music teachers, music is a tool for growth and empowerment.

Matt DiDonna, Band Director at Rolesville Middle School, has taught students the power of music for over ten years. His musical journey began in fourth grade where he was asked to perform with the fifth graders because of his impressive drum roll. His passion for music solidified at 12 years old when his father unveiled an old drum set he used in high school.

"On the day he unveiled them...there was no happier twelve-year-old on the planet," said DiDonna.

Studying at Rowen University under some very influential professors Matt was transformed into an educator. As an educator DiDonna taught over four years as a middle school choral teacher in New Jersey, another four-and-a-half years as an elementary general music teacher in North Carolina, leading to his current position.

"I always love the empowerment music provides as music is for everyone. It creates a sense of belonging to a group... and that is powerful. To give kids that opportunity to be a part of something that powerful is something I don't take lightly," DiDonna shared.

DiDonna encourages parents to involve students in music as it instills practical skills of collaboration, problem-solving, and dedication that have real-world value. He further advises starting the musical training early to make the transition from elementary to middle school band smoother.

Music education can begin as early as fourth grade. Check your assigned school to ensure they have a program or consider enrolling your child in local music lessons.





The registration process for band varies by school. Typically, a student will need to purchase or rent an instrument of choice, but some schools have loaner instruments for students to use. Parents and students are provided with a list of retailers in the area to aid in the process. When choosing an instrument consider weighing the pros and cons of each. Is the instrument portable? What is the difficulty level in playing the instrument? Is it used in multiple musical styles? All good questions to weigh your options.

As your child progresses from elementary to middle and high school band the courses and extracurricular options increase. Students gain confidence in performing to larger groups and venues. They gain a social circle of shared interests and support. They are a part of a community.

At Wake County Public School System, DiDonna is one of the hundreds of band teachers making a difference in our students' lives every day. Consider engaging your child in a school band and watch the positive lifelong effects develop.



SPROUT SCOUTS—LEARNING THE VALUE OF FOOD

Working in conjunction with BackPack Buddies, Bugg Magnet Elementary School's Sprout Scouts aims weekly to fill 50 backpacks with food to help families in need have meals over the weekend.



School-aged children are often unaware of how and where their food is originated. The concept of their daily food coming from somewhere other than the grocery store is foreign to many children. Sprout Scouts is working to change that understanding through a partnership with Bugg Magnet Elementary School, Wake County Public School System, Inter-Faith Food Shuttle, and corporate donors.

Sprout Scouts is a national program focused on giving students hands-on activities related to growing, preparing, and eating healthy foods. Students are assigned group and take-home activities that link Common Core and academic standards. The group activities not only encourage social

interaction among the children but reinforce the importance of community involvement. The take-home activities offer parents the opportunity to engage in meaningful discussions related to food and health.

Schools are encouraged to conduct Sprout Scouts as a club-based activity. Club leaders are asked to follow what they call the four Ps. These include personal relationships, perceptions, participation, and parameters.

'Personal relationships' focuses on encouraging positive relationships among the children. When the children know they are respected and have a sense of comfort with each other they are better able to focus on learning.

'Perceptions' refers to developing positive perceptions of the club through creating a fun, exciting, and organized program. Often children perceive being outdoors as a time for recess. Having organized activities that engage the club members help change that perception.

'Participation' signifies the importance of having the activities being meaningful. Activities or adventures, as they call them, reflect real-world practices. The skills they learn are positive and lifelong.

The final word, 'parameters,' reflects the importance of rules and boundaries. Setting clear limits trains club members in recognizing and following rules.

Club activities vary from hands-on to journals to group work to gaming. Each activity has a goal in mind, such as the name game that helps introduce students to their peers. Another activity called 'Garden on a Cracker' has students creating their dream garden using a cracker and spoonfuls of vegetables. These tasks teach them to consider the allocation of space while adding the benefit of eating their creation.

Working in conjunction with BackPack Buddies, Bugg Magnet Elementary School's Sprout Scouts aims weekly to fill 50 backpacks with food to help families in need have meals over the weekend. The end product for the club members is the creation of their very own shared garden and the joy of seeing their vegetables sent to families in need.

Developed by FoodCorps and Life Lab, Sprout Scouts is in partnership with five Wake County schools: Hunter Magnet Elementary, Bugg Magnet Elementary, Fuller Magnet Elementary, Walnut Creek Elementary, and Swift Creek Elementary. 
East Millbrook students: 'Citizens of the world'

Magnet Parent writes a letter to Magnet Schools of America, praising East Millbrook Middle School where her daughter attends.

East Millbrook Magnet Middle School, through its high-level arts programs, inspires passion and creativity in students. It also inspires devotion and enthusiasm from parents.

Mary Miller, the parent of both a current and former East Millbrook student, is just one example. She and her husband explored various magnet options when they moved back to Raleigh from Greenville, S.C. a few years ago.

They were drawn to the global and arts focus of East Millbrook and enrolled their eldest daughter there. The school has exceeded even their highest expectations, Mary Miller says.



Here is a letter she wrote to Magnet Schools of America, praising the school:

The educational and life experiences EMMMS offers, through its embrace of the Creative Arts and IB Middle Years Programme, have been all that my husband and I could wish for our daughters. This school weaves the strands of rigorous academic curriculum in traditional subjects with wideranging arts, languages and a constant awareness of global history and issues. Our children are challenged intellectually, given new paths and opportunities for artistic exploration, and most importantly, they are growing into citizens of the world, already aware of other cultures and their histories.

'Wonderful echoes'

It's not the report cards by which we judge this school. I see the magnet program effects when my fair, freckled 13-year-old Paris is happy and thinks no one is watching, so she performs the routine she learned two years ago in her African Dance class, or when 11-year-old Cornelia marches around the kitchen island proudly playing the new notes she learned on her Euphonium. (That's her below, surrounded by family, teachers and friends.) I see it in the hours Paris devoted to a Steven Biko research project for Social Studies, passionately embroidering the logo of the upraised black power first onto her poster display. I saw it a month ago, when Cornelia looted her brother's Legos to accessorize a Mayan city model and off-handedly explained to Charlie how these ancient people were geniuses in moving water and why that is important. We hear these wonderful echoes of their education daily; yes, even when they bicker in French over which country their respective teams will represent on Model UN.



Dedicated faculty'

But education is more than curriculum, in the same way that a school is so much more than teachers, classrooms and books. EMMMS has about 1,000 students. The ideals of nurturing creative, reflective thinkers who will be ready to function in a global society is hardly limited to the 20 percent of students who attend through the magnet program. The dedicated faculty make sure that EMMMS rolls this way every day, for every student.



'Extraordinary diversity'

In a mid-sized Southern city like Raleigh, the school is a microcosm of extraordinary diversity. Seventy-five percent of the student body would identify as a person of color. A strong ESL program draws students from Mexico, Vietnam, Cambodia, France and several African countries, just to name a few places. Our children have learned how very different all people's lives can be. They see in their friends the treasure and sometimes the terrible inequity that results from being born to a particular place and time. Among many students here, education is valued over material goods. Could there be a more invaluable lesson? I don't think so.









Does your schedule depend on knowing when and where your child's school bus will arrive? Wake County Public School Systems' (WCPSS) Transportation Department provides bus rider families with a free bus tracking system called 'Here Comes the Bus'.

'Here Comes the Bus' translates GPS data into an easy to use customizable map that works on a computer, tablet or smartphone. The application allows you to see where the bus is and how close it is to your stop.

Get started with 'Here Comes the Bus' at https:// herecomesthebus.com/getting-started/. You will need the district code and your student's ID number to sign up. The WCPSS school code is 67500. For your smartphone or tablet, download the 'Here Comes the Bus' app from the App Store or Google Play.

When entering your student's last name on the app, spell it as it appears on your Home Base/PowerSchool account. If there is a hyphen in the name, make sure you include it. Only enter the first 18 characters of your student's last name.

Once activated, you can customize or edit features, including how the app will communicate with you and the size of the notification radius.

The 'Here Comes the Bus' app does not track buses providing service between schools, afterschool activities or athletic events




