

This certification is to ensure that foodservice supervisory personnel have the knowledge of safe techniques for all areas of food service. The exam is nationally recognized by ANSI-CFP and certification is good for three years. A legal picture ID must be presented upon entrance for the exam. Payment is due upon registration, exam scores will be held until all fees have been paid. Tests are available in several languages including: English, Spanish, Korean, Chinese, and must be requested at time of enrollment. You must register at least one week before class. After successful completion of the exam, you will receive a certificate, wallet card, and a window decal from the National Registry of Food Safety Professionals. Notification of test results will also include a review of your performance in each category of the test. A study guide is available and can be picked up after registration is completed at the TCC Conference Center or TCC Metro Campus between 8am and 5pm.


