
CONSERVATION: A CALIFORNIA WAY OF LIFE

The biggest lesson we learned from our recent drought: Conservation needs to be a way of life. Droughts will come more frequently, so Californians should always use water efficiently.

Westminster residents have done phenomenal throughout the drought, saving well over one billion gallons of water. Westminster is committed to responsibly caring for our water sources and we ask all residents to maintain the amazing water saving habits developed throughout the drought.

Looking for new ways to save water? Here's our top three summer conservation tips:

- Set mower blades to 3 inches Leaving longer grass blades helps establish longer grass roots, leading to more resilient, healthy grass. Most lawns require only two days of watering per week.
- Set a timer for your showers And stick to it! Standard shower heads use two gallons per minute. If you're taking a ten minute shower to cool down from a hot day, you're using 600 gallons of water per person per month!
- Use a bucket to collect water-While you wait for your shower to warm up, collect the water and use it for plants. Buckets are an inexpensive tool that repurposes water and save money.

WHEREAS, drowning is the leading cause of death and disability in California for children under five years of age, and in 2016 there were 3 fatal drownings and 26 non-fatal incidents involving children in Orange County; and

WHEREAS, drowning is a major problem for adults ages 35-64, and as a result there were 16 fatal drownings and 12 non-fatal incidents for adults in 2016; and

WHEREAS, fatal and non-fatal drowning is a silent event, occurring in as little as two inches of water, including swimming pools, spas, lakes, the ocean, and any other body of water; and

WHEREAS, the themes of this year's water safety campaign "Always Watch Your Child Around Water" and "Never Swim Alone," in-depth information will be provided by staff on what Orange County residents can do to prevent drowning; and

WHEREAS, the initiatives set forth in the "ABCs of Water Safety" program will increase public awareness regarding proper procedures to prevent this needless tragedy; and

WHEREAS, the Orange County Fire Authority, in collaboration with the Orange County Task Force on Drowning Prevention, will be taking this opportunity to increase public awareness about drowning prevention through a diverse community outreach campaign; and

WHEREAS, OCFA will launch its 24-week water safety campaign in May and continue through October.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, I, Tri Ta, Mayor of the City of Westminster does hereby proclaim its participation in the "Always Watch Your Child Around Water" and "Never Swim Alone" 2017 campaigns that kick-off in May and continue through October by encouraging all families, parents, residents, schools, recreational facilities, businesses, and homeowner associations to become partners in preparedness by increasing their knowledge of proper safety measures in drowning prevention.

Westminster School District offers both Spanish/ English Dual Language Immersion and Vietnamese/ English Dual Language Immersion for the 2017-2018 school year. 
