WE NEED YOUR HELP!

You've done it once before and we're asking you to do it again: make conservation a way of life! The truth is: the drought isn't over in Southern California, so we need to resume our water saving habits.

Here's our Top 5 Water Saving Habits for Summertime:

- 1. Water at the right times: Watering during the middle of the day is a waste; the water evaporates and plants don't get the necessary moisture. Make sure to water before 9:00 AM and after 5:00 PM.
- 2. Use a moisture meter: Moisture meters take the guess work out of watering. Insert a moisture meter in the soil and only water when the moisture meter registers dry. Call the Water Division at 714-548-3687 or visit your local home improvement store to get a moisture meter.
- 3. Remove turf or install drip irrigation: Orange County is still offering rebates for residents. Visit <u>www.ocwatersmart.com</u> for sprinkler, irrigation controller, and turf removal rebates.
- 4. Add mulch to your soil: Applying a 2-inch layer of mulch slows water evaporation, as well as suppressing weeds in planting beds.
- 5. Raise mower blades to leave grass a little longer: Longer grass promotes deeper root growth, resulting in a more drought-resistant lawn, reduced evaporation, and fewer weeds.

ReadyOC.org provides you with step-by-step advice on how to prepare for disasters. And, it provides you with real-time information on current county emergencies and how best to respond and recover during these situations. Everyone should have an emergency preparedness kit with water, food, prescribed medicine, comfortable shoes, and other essential items that can sustain them for at least 72 hours up to two weeks.

Are You Ready?

All of us in Orange County know how quickly disaster can strike, and how fast "too late" can be. Yet more than 7 out of 10 of us have not made any emergency preparations. From flooding and wildfires to landslides and earthquakes, our county continuously faces emergency situations. We know the next emergency is coming. We just don't know when or what kind. What about you? Are you ready?

Let ReadyOC Help You

If a disaster occurs in your community, government and disaster relief organizations will try to help you. But all of us need to be ready as well. ReadyOC is an online-based emergency preparedness campaign that can help. Through ReadyOC.org, you have access to the tools and resources you need to better prepare for emergency situations. www.readyoc.org

AlertOC Emergency Notification System

AlertOC is a mass notification system used by the County of Orange and the City of Westminster to issue government related messages to residents and businesses. The system has the capacity to send thousands of messages, in various languages, within minutes via phone, e-mail and text. Only authorized officials are allowed access to the system. Log on to www.AlertOC.com, select choice of language, and register today.





Authorized officials record a voice, e-mail or text message that is then delivered quickly to individuals in the notification system. The primary use of the system will be to disseminate messages pertaining to the health, safety or welfare of a community that is being affected by a perceived, emerging, or imminent emergency event.

AlertOC contains residential and commercial landline phone numbers for most of Orange County's geographic population. In accordance with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), landline numbers are acquired from AT&T and Verizon's 911 telephone database. It is important and recommended that community members provide additional phone numbers, e-mail addresses and a text number by registering through the AlertOC web portal. Each address location can have up to three phone numbers, two e-mail addresses and one text number.

Residents who have registered their cell phone numbers in the AlertOC system will receive messages on their cell phone. Since there are many instances when the public may not be at home to receive an emergency message phone call, public safety officials recommend that all residents with a cell phone add their number to the AlertOC database. A WORD.... FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

We have discovered that to have a successful and effective code enforcement program, Code Enforcement Officers must be innovative and flexible in identifying viable solutions for community concerns. One such method is sharing common concerns to eliminate violations and create neighborhoods where residents may live peacefully and safely in a quality environment.

The following are some "hot topic" issues identified by the Code Enforcement Division:

• UNPERMITTED GARAGE SALES: garage sales are limited to three per year per residence, and may not exceed three consecutive days. A Garage Sale Permit must be obtained prior to each sale. Garage Sale Permits are \$10 and may be obtained at City Hall.

Since the activity of posting garage sale signs on public property, utility poles and light poles is prohibited, one suggestion is to advertise your sale in a local newspaper. This way you can still reach the community while remaining in compliance with City codes.

• TRASH BINS IN PUBLIC VIEW: current codes require that trash containers be stored to minimize visibility from the street on days other than scheduled pick up days. Trash containers stored at the curb or in front yards areas are prohibited, and create a negative appearance in our neighborhoods.

If your trash containers are stored so that they are visible from the street, in order to avoid fines, please make arrangements to store them accordingly until your scheduled pick up day.

- DISCARDED ITEMS: Did you know that dumping or storage of discarded items such as equipment, household appliances, discarded furniture, and other items in any yard area is prohibited? Such activity is detrimental to the appearance of neighboring properties and largely the community. To avoid fines, if you have a large item you would like to have picked up one option is to contact Midway City Sanitary District at (714) 893-3553 to schedule removal.
- BROWN AND/OR BARE LAWNS: In July 2015 California was under a state of emergency based on drought conditions. As part of this state of emergency residential lawns were allowed to become brown. That state of emergency was rescinded in early 2017. Properties containing brown and distressed lawns are now enforceable. To avoid fines and penalties, please ensure your lawn areas are properly maintained with lush lawns which are free of weeds and bare dirt areas.

CERT (Community Emergency Response

Team) is a group of responsible, trained individuals that form a skilled group of

Disaster Service Workers. The CERT Program can be used just for your family or in neighborhoods, businesses, and schools. The CERT members realize that in the event of a major disaster they will have to rely on



themselves and their neighbors to handle emergencies until professional help arrives.

The 24 hour CERT course covers topics such as Introduction to Disaster Preparedness, First Aid, Light Search and Rescue, Fire Suppression, and Disaster Psychology. Classes are held in the Spring and the Fall.

WEST COUNTY CERT is comprised of those who live and/or work in Buena Park, Cypress, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, and Westminster plus their attached communities.

Every year thousands of burns and eye injuries are caused by fireworks. Following these simple safety tips can help you enjoy fireworks safely.

Recommended Safety Tips:

- Obey local laws. Safe and Sane fireworks are only legal in the cities of Anaheim, Buena Park, Costa Mesa, Fullerton, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, Santa Ana, Stanton, Villa Park, and Westminster.
- Buy only Safe and Sane fireworks that are State Fire Marshalapproved.
- Light fireworks outdoors in a clear area and at a safe distance away from people, homes, vehicles, or flammable materials.
- Light one firework at a time and never relight a dud.
- Have a bucket of water and a hose nearby. Soak fireworks before throwing them in the trash can.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.

Fireworks and Child Safety:

- Fireworks should only be handled by adults.
- Sparklers can exceed temperatures up to 1,200° Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to melt gold.
- Never let children pick up pieces of fireworks after a show. Some may still be active.
- Parents are liable for any damage or injuries caused by their children using fireworks.

In Case of an Accident:

- Call 911 and run cool water over any burn.
- In case of an eye injury, do not rub, touch, or rinse the eye. This can cause more damage.

City-Sponsored Fourth of July Events:

- A city sponsored fireworks display is a great alternative to lighting your own fireworks.
