# HOOVER STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Hopefully you've noticed things happening along the Hoover Street corridor! With significant challenges in the past, this area became underutilized and mostly abandoned by our residents. In an effort to systematically address these issues, the City embarked on a multi-phased project aimed at correcting these deficiencies. The first phase is focused on creating a quiet walking path for the casual walking resident to enjoy. It also repositioned the bike route from the sidewalk back onto the street. The second phase of the project is focused on further developing a multi-modal area, where pedestrians, cyclists, and runners would be able to use the space effectively and safely.

#### Walking Path: Phase I

The first of these phases, which is currently under construction, is the removal of the old bike and walking trail in order to construct a dedicated "casual" walking path. This is an area intended for pedestrians to stroll and simply enjoy being outdoors. This phase began with the removal of the overgrown oleander trees, as well as the demolition of the existing walking and bike path.

The walking path is 5-feet wide, a foot wider than normal residential sidewalks, and meets all ADA requirements, with much needed lighting.

This phase of the project also relocates the bike path back onto the street. These temporary bike lanes will be Type I facilities, which will be defined by signs along Hoover Street. Landscaping portion will consist of trees, shrubs, decomposed granite areas and rock.

#### Separated Two-Way Bike Lane: Phase II

Phase II of the Hoover Street Improvement Project is focused on creating a two-way cycle track within the existing roadway section. A cycle track is an exclusive bike facility that combines the user experience of a separated path with the on-street infrastructure of a conventional bike lane. The cycle track on Hoover Street would be physically separated from motor traffic and adjacent to the newly constructed walking path.

Cycle tracks offer a higher level of security than bike lanes and create attractive facilities for residents to enjoy. This project will result in a reduction of travel lanes along Hoover Street from four lanes to two lanes; turn pockets at the intersections would remain. The light traffic travel patterns along Hoover Street support this roadway capacity modification.

#### "Experience Hoover" Event

The City applied for and received a grant from Southern California Association of Governments' (SCAG) Active Transportation Safety and Encouragement Campaign. SCAG offered the City an opportunity to host an event that would inspire more people to walk and bike through education, encouragement and "tactical urbanism" exhibitions. On Saturday, May 21, 2016 (Bike Month) from 10am to 2pm, we will transform Hoover Street through the staging of temporary measures that will demonstrate a separated two-way bike lane on Hoover Street. In addition to activities along Hoover Street, there will be giveaways and free interactive activities at Sigler Park.

The demonstration event will focus on the following goals:

- Provide opportunities where residents can experience walking and biking in a safe, low-stress and festive environment.
- Educate participants on the benefits and strategies for incorporating active transportation into daily activities.
- Generate media coverage through social and traditional media outlets to educate the broader community on the benefits of active transportation.


Maybe you've already done all the basics:



#### **Drowning Prevention**

- A. Active Adult Supervision
  - Never leave a child alone in or near the water.

     or other distracting activity.

#### B. Barriers

- Isolate pool/spa from home and play areas.
- Install multiple barriers and maintain regularly.
- Use barriers to protect children from all water sources.

#### C. Classes

- · Learn to swim.
- Learn CPR, first aid, and rescue techniques.
- Make sure anyone responsible for your child is prepared to respond to an emergency.

#### D. Drain Safety

- Teach children to stay away from pool/spa drains.
- Install compliant drain covers and automatic shutoff pump system.
- If entrapment occurs, turn off the pump immediately. Insert fingers or small object between drain and body to break seal.

Each year in the United States, more than 10,000 people suffer eye injuries and burns from fireworks. Most of these incidents are related to the use of illegal fireworks as well as state-approved fireworks.

The following tips can help you be safe this 4th of July:

- Obey local laws.
- Buy only State Fire Marshal-approved (Safe and Sane) fireworks. They must have the State Fire Marshal's seal on them and can only be purchased at licensed fireworks stands.
- Fireworks are not toys and should be handled by adults only.
- Use fireworks outdoors only and light one at a time.
- Never use near dry grass or other flammable materials.
- Use common sense and keep a safe distance.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Never attempt to re-light or "fix" fireworks.
- Parents are liable for any damage or injuries caused by their children using fireworks.

#### Nationwide Firework-Related injury Statistics:

- Children ages 5-9 have the highest injury rate involving fireworks.
- Sparklers are associated with the most injuries involving children under the age of 5.
- Sparklers can reach temperatures of more than 1000 degrees Fahrenheit.

#### What to Do if You Get Burned:

- Cool the burn with water, not ice.
- Seek medical treatment or call 9-1-1.
- Do not apply butter or ointments.

#### Public Fireworks Displays:

- You can enjoy a Fourth of July celebration with friends and family at a professional fireworks show conducted by licensed, trained professionals; a public firework display is the smartest and safest alternative.

#### WESTMINSTER SCHOOL DISTRICT

Westminster School District will offer both Spanish Dual Language Immersion and Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion starting in the 2016-2017 school year. Spanish Dual Language Immersion will be offered for preschool, one class for three year olds and one class for four year olds, and kindergarten (two classes with 24 students in each class). Preschool will be three hours a day, five days a week. Kindergarten is full day, five days a week. Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion is offered in kindergarten and first grade. We are enrolling for two full day kindergarten classes and five spots in first grade. If you would like your child to be a part of the Spanish Dual Language Immersion or Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion program, register soon! This program is open to all preschool, kindergarten, and first grade students in Southern California.

Why choose dual language immersion? Dual language immersion integrates native English speaking and English language learning students in the same classroom and provides academic instruction through two languages, one of which is the primary language of each group (for example Vietnamese and English or Spanish and English). The students, in the Dual Language Immersion program, will be engaged 50% of the day in English and 50% of the day in the target language. The goals and research based benefits of dual language immersion are bilingualism, biliteracy, cultural proficiency, global citizenship, at or above grade level achievement, 21st century skills, increased family involvement and the Westminster School District Pathways to Biliteracy awards attainment in kindergarten, third, fifth, and eighth grades (with the ultimate goal of the students graduating with the California Department of Education formally recognized Seal of Biliteracy on their high school diploma and Seal of Biliteracy Medal).

Enrollment forms will be available each Monday through Thursday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the Westminster School District office at 14121 Cedarwood Avenue in Westminster for dual language immersion kindergarten. 
