LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAM

HCCER offers many options for the American Red Cross Learn To Swim Program. Students are encouraged to move at their own pace in small groups. A description of the skills learned in each American Red Cross Swim Level is provided below. For further information, contact Mary Jo Lewis at 330-673-1214 or by email at mjimplewis@aol.com.

Level 1:

Introduction to Water Skills

Enter and exit water safely; open eyes underwater, pick up submerged object, swim on front and back using arm and leg actions; submerge mouth, nose and eyes; float on front and back; follow basic water safety rules; exhale underwater through mouth and nose; explore arm and hand movements; and use a lifejacket.

Level 2:

Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Enter water by stepping or jumping from the side; open eyes underwater; pick up a submerged object; roll over from front to back, back to front; swim on side; exit water safely using ladder or side; float on front and back; tread water using arm and leg motions; move in the water wearing a life jacket; submerge entire head; perform front and back glide; swim on front and back using combined strokes.

Level 3:

Stroke Development

Jump into deep water from the side; bob with the head fully submerged; perform survival float; butterfly kick and body motion; use check-call-care in an emergency; dive from kneeling or standing position; use rotary breathing in horizontal position; change from horizontal to vertical position on front and back; perform the HELP and huddle positions; submerge and retrieve an object; perform front and back glide; perform front and back crawl; perform a reaching assist.

Level 4:

Stroke Improvement

Shallow dive; open turns on front and back using any stroke; safe diving rules; perform a throwing assist; swim underwater; tread water using sculling arm motions and kick; perform compact jump into water from a height while wearing a life jacket; care for conscious choking victim; perform feet first surface dive; perform the following: front and back crawl, sidestroke swim, breaststroke, butterfly and elementary backstroke.

Level 5:

Stroke Refinement

Tread water with 2 different kicks; learn survival swimming; perform rescue breathing; perform the following: standing dive, pike surface dive, shallow dive, tuck surface dive, butterfly, front flip turn, breaststroke, backstroke flip turn, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, front and back crawl.

Level 6:

Swimming and Skill Proficiency

This course refines the strokes so students swim with ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Level 6 is designed with "menu" options that focus on preparing students to participate in more advanced courses including Water Safety

RED CROSS SAFETY PROGRAMS

Lifeguard Instructor Course

Instructor: Curtis Stokes/American Red Cross Lifeguard Trainer

Experienced lifeguards are often asked to lead in-service practice sessions, supervise other guards and take on more responsibility. American Red Cross Lifeguard instructors are authorized to teach all lifeguarding courses, CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer, Administering Emergency Oxygen, Blood Borne Pathogens Training and Basic Water Rescue. To take this course, you must be 17 years of age, possess a Fundamental of Instructor Training Certificate (FIT) issued within the last year or possess a current national Health and Safety Instructor Authorization Certificate.
