

Did you know ... Cary park provides a social environment?

Bark, Wag, Sniff and Socialize? That's right Cary's Dog Park isn't just a place to take your pup to play, it is also an excellent place to meet friends and build relationships. The bond between an owner and their pet can't be denied, but at the dog park another bond is being formed. Dogs get the opportunity to connect with friends and interact with other humans, but the experience goes beyond dogs; it is also place for human interaction. One thing that tends to bond people is when they have similar taste, the fact that people can connect on the grounds of being dog lovers offers a chance for new friendships to be formed. Cary's Dog Park, located at Robert V. Godbold Park, offers the opportunity for people to network and animals to play. Essentially, the people at the park become a second family. Everyone looks out for each other and for all their furry friends. There are also Bark Ranger volunteers, to make sure rules are obeyed, people and dogs are safe, and that the "neighborhood" is looked after. So join the family and let this be your best friend's second home.



Did you know... There are multiple purposes to public art in Cary?



Looking around Cary often gets people thinking, what is with all of the decorations. Often the small town charm associated with Cary comes from the people, the pride in the town and of course all the rich culture, which includes public art. But, don't get caught up in all its beauty, understand the meaning behind the art. Cary's Public art serves many purposes. Some pieces serve as a system to find your way around town, some connect you to the past, some enrich the experience, and some offer safety. Look at how art has now been extended into Cary's transit system, connecting the C-Tran with art. Around the town on 6 of the bus routes, Cary has contracted artist, Susan Harbage Page, to design bus shelter art in order to provide a way to easily recognize each route. These shelters use innovation and creativity as it connects the transit system to Cary's history. Each of the designs are derived from patterns within several historical landmarks: the Page-Walker Hotel, the Evans Home, Nancy Jones Home, and the AM Howard Farm. In addition, each one of these shelters use

solar panels to provide lighting for the security at night. This project will improve public transportation and bring history and art to everyday life. The next time you are driving around town, notice all the art but discover what other purposes that are being served.

Since 1980, the Town of Cary has been building greenways to bring open spaces within easy walking distance to Cary's neighborhoods. Greenways are an environmental, economic and recreational resource for all to enjoy. Currently there are over 50 miles of greenways that link to neighborhoods, parks and schools. The majority of the trails are paved and are generally located in floodplain areas and along wooded stream corridors.

Cary greenways and trails are open from sunrise to sunset. The standard greenway trail is 10-foot-wide asphalt. Keep in mind when trying to locate a greenway trail that parking is not always provided and parking on streets is required to access many trails. Please be considerate of private property nearby when parking. For additional information, see the rules and regulations section. Greenways enhance our lives in many ways by:

- Providing a recreational amenity for walking, jogging, and bicycling in a natural setting remote from traffic;
- Preserving pristine open space to enhance Cary's quality of life;
- Linking our neighborhoods with parks, schools, community centers, and other neighborhoods;
- Helping to control stormwater runoff, curb erosion, and minimize flooding which can damage our property;
- Improving Cary's water quality by buffering streams, filtering pollutants, and recharging our groundwater;
- Adding value to our property by merit of proximity.

The Town of Cary maintains 58 courts at five locations: Annie Jones Park, Dunham Park, Godbold Park, Middle Creek School/Park, and the Cary Tennis Park. Four courts are 36' for the eight and under play format and 54 courts are 78'. In addition, 20 courts have been lined for the ten and under 60' play format.

The Town's main tennis facility is the Cary Tennis Park, which is the state's largest public outdoor tennis facility. The park is a full service facility on approximately 24 acres in western Cary. Amenities include locker rooms with showers, meeting room, snack bar and clubhouse. The park provides a comprehensive array of tennis programs, events and services for beginner through advanced players.

Since opening, the Cary Tennis Park has expanded the tennis offerings in the community to include private lessons, group clinics and league play. The Cary Tennis Park is host to several national, regional and state tournaments including the Bullfrog USTA Southern Section Designated, NC Junior Closed State Tournament, Boys and Girls 14 USTA National Zone Team Championships, the Men's and Women's ACC Championships and the Western Wake Charity Event to benefit Hospice hosted with the Western Wake Tennis Association.

Talent ID (age 5-8)

Talent ID is for youth interested in tennis. The program will focus on establishing a strong technical foundation and develop basic agility and movement skills. Program members are expected to compete in Junior Team Tennis and 8 and local tournaments.

Academy I (age 8-10)

Academy I is for the intermediate tennis player interested in participating in tournament play. Stroke development, consistency and basic strategy will be emphasized. Juniors are expected to meet a USTA tournament participation requirement to remain in the program.

Academy Select (age 11-18)

Academy Select is designed for the established tournament junior who has aspirations of playing college tennis. Juniors must have a state and sectional ranking and be working toward a national ranking. Participants are expected to implement advanced strategies in a variety of live ball drills.

Junior Competition (age 11-18)

Junior Competition is structured for the present high school player or those aspiring to make the team. Drills will be structured around playing situations and point development. Stroke mechanics will be stressed along with the improvement of the serve.

High School Team (age 14-18)

High School Team is designed for the high school varsity player who wants to keep his or her game tuned-up for the upcoming season. Juniors are expected to be able to hit with spin and change direction of the ball. The player rarely double faults and is becoming an all-around player. Drills will be designed around execution, and the ability to close out points.







Athletic Field Reservations

While Town of Cary athletic programs have priority for usage, it is possible to reserve athletic fields during times that they are not being used by the Cary Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources Department (CPRCRD). There are three categories of field reservations offered by the CPRCRD which are listed below, along with descriptions of each and the methods of obtaining a reservation. Field reservation inquiries should be directed to the Athletics Division at (919) 469-4062.

Fields are available for reservation from March 1-October 31 at the following times:

- Weekdays 9 a.m.-2 p.m. on days CPRCRD games are scheduled for the evening.
- Weekdays 9 a.m.-10 p.m. on days CPRCRD does not have leagues scheduled for the evening.
- Weekends 9 a.m.-10 p.m. when CPRCRD does not have leagues scheduled.

Fields are closed November-February in order to allow for turf recovery and renovation.

CPRCRD reserves the right to cancel the use of the fields as a result of inclement weather. Cancellations due to weather may be rescheduled by the renter on a case by case basis. Reservation fees are nonrefundable. Bases are not normally provided as a part of field reservation, however throw-down bases can be arranged for at any facility by contacting the Bond Park staff at (919) 469-4100. Athletic field reservation fees are subject to change.

SOFTBALL/BASEBALL COMPLEX RENTALS

The Softball/Baseball Complexes (4 fields each) at Middle Creek Park and Thomas Brooks Park are available for tournaments and event rentals. Hourly rentals are not accepted for these facilities. For more information on the availability and fee structures on renting either of the complexes please contact Thomas Brooks Park at (919) 387-5844.

BASEBALL/SOFTBALL FIELD WITH CONCURRENT PICNIC SHELTER RESERVATION

As a convenience, persons renting Kiwanis, Buehler, or Rotary picnic shelters may also concurrently rent the athletic fields adjacent to each. Persons may rent these fields up to (3) months in advance from April through October. Fields and times are limited to accommodate Town programming. Persons/groups making picnic shelter reservations that do not also reserve the ball field at the same time are not guaranteed that the ball field will be available for reservation at a later date. The fees for renting an athletic field with a picnic shelter are the same as hourly athletic field fees plus the shelter rental fee.

When considering concurrent field and shelter rental, individuals should first call a community center to inquire about availability of a shelter. Then call the Athletics Division at (919) 469-4062 to inquire about availability of the field. Shelter reservations can be made in person or by calling one of the Community Centers (Bond Park Community Center, Herbert C. Young Community Center or Middle Creek Community Center). Field reservation may be made in person or by calling the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Resources administrative office.






